### Recipe of the Week

**Ham Stuffed Onions**  
4 large sweet onions  
2 tablespoons ham drippings  
1/3 cup celery, diced  
1 tablespoon parsley, minced  
1 cup cooked ham, ground  
Salt and pepper  
Vegetable stock (onion)

Peel onions and remove tops. Simmer in salted water until almost tender; drain. Remove the centers without disturbing outer layers. Chop centers.

Melt 2 tablespoons drippings in skillet; add the minced onion, celery, and parsley. Cook a few minutes, add bread crumbs, ground ham, salt, pepper. Moisten with vegetable stock—water in which onions cooked—mix well. Fill onion shells.

Bake in covered pan in a moderate oven (350 degrees) for 30 minutes. Remove the cover the last few minutes of baking so the onions will brown. Serves 4.

### College Graduates Sought By Marines

T-Sgt. Wesley Ward of the local Marine recruiting station at San Angelo announced today that male college graduates and seniors will have an opportunity to earn commissions in the Marine Corps this summer.

By June 1 the expanding Marine Corps will enroll a total of 1,000 officer candidates, according to Sgt. Ward. Candidates begin their training July 14 at the Marine Corps Schools, Quantico, Virginia.

Married or single college graduates between 20 and 27 years old are eligible for the program. Seniors who will graduate at the end of the current semester also are eligible, but must apply before the June 1 deadline.

Married men will receive family allotments as soon as their candidate training begins.

Candidates successfully completing the 10-week training course will be commissioned second lieutenants in the Marine Corps Reserve. Following this they will receive five additional months of specialized officers' training, also at the Quantico base which is located 35 miles south of Washington, D. C.

Ward said that the necessary application forms are available at the recruiting station. He stated that it would be advisable for the prospective candidates to apply as soon as possible.

It was also announced that members of organized or volunteer Marine Corps reserve units may apply if they meet the requirements.
