



#### ELECTRICAL ORDINANCE


An Ordinance creating the office of Electrical Inspector; defining the qualifications, duties and powers of such office; establishing rules and regulations governing the installation, operation and maintenance of electric wiring and apparatus, requiring electricians engaged in the business of installing electric wiring and appartus to be licensed, furnish surety bond and pay license, permit and inspection fees; repeating conflicting provisions of all other ordinances; providing a penalty, not to exceed \$100, for violating any of the provisions of this ordinance.

#### PLUMBING ORDINANCE ·

An Ordinance governing the use of and manner of making connection to the Sanitary Sewer and Water Systems of the City of Eldorado, Texas; governing the installation of plumbing; requiring all plumbing work to be done by licensed plumbers; creating the office of Plumbing Inspector; providing for permit and inspection fees; providing that any person, firm or corporation who shall omit or refuse to comply with, or who violates any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum not more than \$100 for each offense, and each day such violation shall exist shall constitute a separate offense; and repealing all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance.

Adopted May 13th and to take effect July 1st. Complete provisions of the above Ordinances may be obtained at the City Office.


