AUSTIN-According to an analysis issued by the Comptroller of Public Accounts last week, a decline in oil prices could have a devschool districts.
Schleicher County ISD is facing a decline of $\$ 344,517.00$, according to Comptroller Carole Keeton Rylander's preliminary calculations.
"While some consumers may welcome lower prices at the gas pumps," Rylander said, "the trickle down effect on some local property values could have a serious financial impact for some Texas school districts."
Locally, school officials are satisfied that Rylander's numbers are within reason.

## Courtship model in place of dating isn't appropriate for all teens

QUESTION: My oldest son
is approaching the age where is approaching the age where
we had previously agreed to allow him to date. The more I think about it, though, the more the whole idea concerns me. It seems that even in the best of dating situations, the negatives exceed the positives. I can't help but feel that I'm setting my son up for failure. Several of my friends have adopted the concept of "courtship" rather than dating. Could you please explain this idea to me, and suggest which of the two arrangements you favor?
DR. DOBSON: Simply put, he "courtship" concept is a reaction to the dating model, which is thought by many to be unhealthy. Dating couples go through a series of short-term and often unsatisfying relationships over a period of five or 10 years or longer. As such, they are being taught to flit from one relationship to another like a honeybee buzzing from flower to flower. Why would they not be inclined later to bail out on a marriage partner when bored or frustrated? Dating also encourages sexual familiarity and experimentation. It isn' difficult to understand why an increasing number of parents feel this traditional model undermines commitment, exclusivity and permanence in marriage.
The courtship model, by con-
trast, seeks to postpone emotional trast, seeks to postpone emotional and physical entanglements until they occur with the probable hussupportive in helping to choose that special individual for a serious courtship when the time is ight. Until then, relationships be-
rolled settings. Physical intimacy for the sake of titillation and ex perimentation is considered to be most inappropriate. It is the ultimate in "saving oneself" for the ime will be spent.
Many parents, and undoubtedly he majority of teen-agers, would consider the courtship model to be extreme and terribly restrictive. it.
