## Hospital Directors Enter

 Upon Their New DutiesThe first meeting of the seven
newly appointed hospital directors was held in the county judge's office Thursday night.

Present beside the new directors was Don McCormick, chairman of the hospital steering committee, who gave a report of the work done by the original committee which brought the hospital to a vote and approval by the voters of the county. McCormick presented several recommendations for consideration of the new official board.

Present also was E. C. Peters, president of the Chamber of Commerce, who last August initiated the Hospital District idea, and who at that early date had contacted a Pasadena doctor and interested him in Eldorado.

After these men had given their reports and recommendations, the seven directors went into executive session and elected one of their number as president and another as secretary.

Carroll Ratliff, Eldorado merchant,
was elected as president. Ronnie Mittel, manager of the local ASCS office, was elected as secretary.

Board voted to hold two regular meeting each month and set the first and third Mondays for this purpose. Meeting place for the time being will be in the Commissioners Court room at the court house. The next meeting will be Monday, June 5th at 8:00 p. m.

As the new board gets off the ground they find themselves without a "cryin' dime" for expenses until the hospital bonds have been approved and sold. Arrangements are being made for office supplies, stationery and postage as considerable correspondence is facing the board for the next few months.

Citizens who voted overwhelmingly for the hospital are cautioned to be patient as many weeks of legal work will be necessary before the board is even ready to advertise for contractors' bids. It was revealed that the new board has already been in contact with the Pasadena doctor.
