#### CHRISTOVAL LAYS CORNER STONE McCartney, Hughes and Smith Makes Talks.

The stone was a beautiful one made of grey marble with plain white lettering, and weighed 800 pounds, it had the names of the Architects, Contractors and the Trustees of the School.

The building is built of beautiful white stone to a height of four feet in front and then brick-veneered the rest of the way, the back of the building is all stone, rural work. 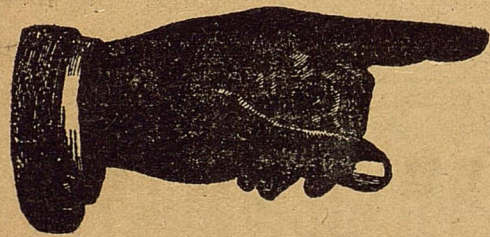

Regular term of Commissioners' Court met Monday and Tuesday Nov. 8th and 9th 1909.

The quarterly report of Wright & Foley, Butchers was approved. The reports of all county officers were approved.

The court ordered that Judge Whitten buy a plow for Dr. Patton or pay for repairs on one.

They ordered that J. T. Jones review out a road from end of the now established Eldorado and Ft. McKavett road at the Bevans and Russell west fence, thence to Hurrican Bluff to intersect the now traveled Eldorado and Ft. McKavett road on North Valley.

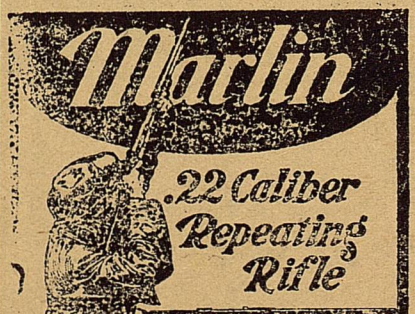
