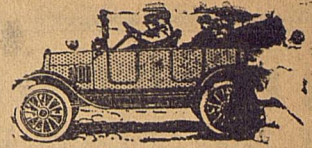

**AUBREY WILLIAMS IS WOUNDED IN MEXICO.**

Aubrey Williams, formerly of El Dorado, but now of San Angelo, was wounded in the hand, and his companion, Hilton Nason, was killed, last Wednesday Dec. 13, while they on the Mexican side of the Rio Grande, the boys had crossed the river to hunt deer, according to Williams statement, after crossing the river they met a Mexican River Guard who asked for a passport they told him they had none and he wrote one on a post card and road away, after hunting some three and a half hours and finding nothing, they returned to the river to recross, but were halted by three armed Mexicans, and passports demanded, while Williams was trying to get the post card given him, he recognized one of the men as one they had previously met, the Mexicans then opened fire, killing Nason and shooting Williams in the hand and the Mexican River Guard was killed, Williams gun being empty, he ran down the river and crossed back to this side under fire.

The body of Nason was recovered after an inquest was held on the Mexican side by Mexican officials, the body reached San Angelo Saturday night.

After Williams reached his camp he was brought to Marthan where he reported the incident, and was given treatment he came on to San Angelo later and reported in detail to the San Angelo Standard.

**TARIFF CLUB ORGANIZED.**

For the purpose of co-operating with the Southern Tariff Association and other local tariff clubs through the South in repelling any effort to lower the tariff schedules in wool, Mohair, Cattle, Sheep and other farm and ranch products the Schleicher County Tariff Club was organized in El Dorado Wednesday morning. Judge J. A. Whitten was elected chairman and J. B. Christian, vice-chairman, of the club. The following directors were elected.

McDonald, Jess Koy, Tom Henderson, W. H. McClatchey, W. P. Evans, H. W. Chriseman, Sam E. Jones, T. K. Jones, C. H. Hensel, T. P. Robinson, Geo. E. Baugh, A. P. Bailey, J. N. Davis, O. K. Enochs, Farnk Spencer, Henry Mund and John H. Jones.

Vance Muse organization director, of the Southern Tariff Association, organized the local Club. Judge Whitten then issued the following appeal to the ranchmen of Schleicher County.

"In sponsoring the emergency tariff law which saved this section of our county from bankruptcy and by waging a insistent and effective fight before congress for protective tariff schedules in the permanent tariff bill for the products of our farms and ranches, especially wool, mohair, sheep and cattle, the Southern Tariff Association has rendered an invaluable service.

While the Tariff has been enacted into law, Congress has given the President of the United States the power to decrease or increase existing schedules 50 per cent. At the present time our wool schedules are under fire and strong pressure is being brought to bear to reduce the rate. The soap trust has asked for a 50 per cent reduction in the schedules on cotton seed and other vegetables oils and there is no telling when other of our products will be attacked.

"We must organize through the Southern Tariff Association in order to hold what we have already won and to resist any program of downward revision. "Schleicher County has been asked to raise \$200 for this worthy cause and Mr. Christian and myself have subscribed and raised about one half of this amount and want you to drop by the bank and leave your check to help out in this word."

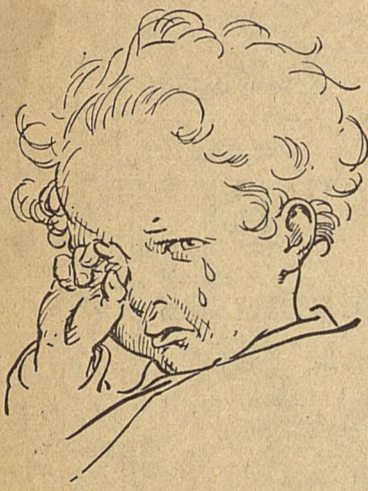
