GOOD HOGS FOR WEST TEXAS.

The Fort Worth Stock Yards Co. have agreed to buy and ship good well bred sows to West Texas and sell them at cost. These sows will be good type of good breeding but not registered. They will be sold in the Ft. Worth yards and immunized from hog cholera, and shipped in car lots.

The San Angelo B. C. D. has made arrangements to handle several cars of hogs. The first car will be Durocs. These sows will be bred and will range in weight from 160 to 180 pounds and will cost about \$35 each. Here is a good chance for farmers who want good sows to get them cheap. If you want any of these sows make arrangements with your bank to pay for them and send it to him.

If you do not want Durocs we can probably get a car of other breeds later.

I will gladly give anyone interested in this movement any information they may desire. I have seen and talked to Mr. Freeman the representative of the Stock Yards and can get up a car for Schleicher County.

If you want any of these hogs you should act at once as orders are coming in fast and car will likely be filled in a few days.

Mr. Hargrave says the Telephone Companies will not charge for the service of scattering the news.

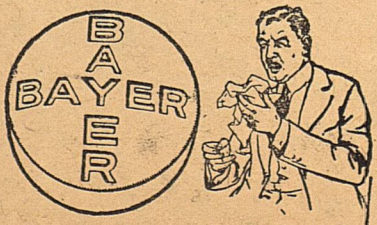

GERMANY UNDONE BY OWN WEAPON

Had Sold to America Secret of Making Explosive From Air.

BIG NITRATE PLANT RESULTS.

Built in Eight Months It Convinces Kaiser of His Defeat.

One of the most romantic passages in the secret history of the World War is the story of how the Ordnance Department of the United States Army made it possible for America, until then utterly lacking in ammunition and in facilities for making it, to manufacture unlimited quantities of powerful explosives out of air and rock. It was largely the knowledge of this fact that forced Germany to surrender when she did.

The secret was secured from Germany herself. It was an open business transaction between business men, whereby we apparently acquired nothing more military than a process for making a high grade fertilizer known as cyanamid.

Frank Sherman Washburn, head of the group of business men who bought this process, conceived the germ of the idea in the early nineties while in South America as consulting engineer in connection with the production and shipping of Chilean nitrate of soda. Nitrogen compounds are an essential part of all commercial fertilizers. The only available natural nitrate deposits in large quantities are in Chile. This supply was diminishing. Germany, which had been taking about one-third of the Chilean nitrates, was already experimenting with processes for their artificial production. In 1907 Mr. Washburn secured in Germany the American rights of the cyanamid process which had been invented in that country.

Turning Air Into a Weapon.

By this process air, which is a mixture of about four-fifths nitrogen gas and one-fifth oxygen, is placed in containers and subjected to pressure and cold until it turns to a liquid. Then the nitrogen is distilled in much the same manner as alcohol is separated from water. But before this nitrogen can be used as a fertilizer it must be combined with a chemical combination of lime and carbon known as calcium carbide, produced by burning ordinary limestone in big rotary kilns and combining it in the electric furnace with carbon supplied in the form of ordinary coke.

Cyanamid thus produced contains the elements of ammonium nitrate, one of the most powerful of modern explosives. By one process ammonia is extracted from the cyanamid. By another process nitric acid is extracted from another batch of this same cyanamid. Then the ammonia and nitric acid are combined and there you have ammonium nitrate ready for packing into shells with TNT.

There are three kinds of explosives used for bursting shells in modern warfare—TNT, picric acid and ammonium nitrate. The United States was equally deficient in raw materials and plants for manufacturing all three of these explosives. Under the best of conditions the cost of either TNT or nitric acid is about two and one-half the cost of ammonium nitrate. But the United States was wholly dependent upon Chilean nitrate of soda as a raw material for ammonium nitrate, with the exception of a small production of nitrogen from the coking of coal. The Chilean supply was 4,500 miles away from New York City by way of the Panama Canal, and the route by way of the Straits of Magellan is nearly twice as long.

A Record Building Operation.

Shortly after the war began in Europe the German government entered into the fixation of air nitrogen for military explosives on a vast scale. It was not, however, until the fall of 1917 that the United States government took it up.

The Ordnance Department asked Mr. Washburn's company to organize a subsidiary corporation, known as the Air Nitrates Corporation, with Mr. Washburn as president, to act as agent of the government for the construction and operation of the air nitrates plant at Muscle Shoals, Alabama. This corporation provided the designs, erected the equipment in the chemical plants and supervised all the other work. It also operated the camp, the town and the plant. Other work is subtle to several of the best known organizations in the United States. Westinghouse Church Kerr Company built the plant buildings, the camp, the permanent city and utilities. The J. G. White Engineering Corporation designed and built the nitrate acid plant. The M. W. Kellogg Company furnished the piping and built the chimneys. On February 16, 1918, ground was broken, and eight months and eight days later the \$80,000,000 Muscle Shoals plant began producing ammonium nitrate. In that brief pe-

riod 23,000 men had completed the plant and around it, where not a house stood before, had arisen a city of 23,000 inhabitants.

This plant when in full operation was ready to provide 13 per cent of all explosives to be used by all the allies on all the allied fronts during the expected spring drive of 1919.

ALLENBY STOPS CRAFT OF TURK

Persecution of Armenians and Confiscation of Property Prevented by English Officer.

The most arbitrary city boss in the world, it seems safe to say, as well as the most unscrupulous politician of modern times, has turned up in Aintab, Armenia, to judge from an official report recently made by Major Stephen Trowbridge, under Gen. Edmund H. H. Allenby's orders.

He is a Turk named Besim Bey. Until the Near East Relief agents stopped him, he practiced upon the terrified Armenians such forms of super-graft as might well make every other corrupt politician in the world green with envy, and such cruelties as make all other heartless rulers, from Nero down, seem sweet and gentle characters. His office was that of Municipal Chief Accountant of Aintab; but, as all dishonest office-holders know, it isn't the job that matters, but the sugar-plums that go with it. Besim Bey plucked sugar-plums with both hands, night and day.

General MacAndrew ordered the arrest and removal of the six worst Turks in the ring that ruled the city, and Besim Bey qualified, as usual, for first place.

**WORLD'S BIGGEST
NITRATE PLANT**

Mammoth Explosives Factory
in Alabama Built in
Eight Months.

ALL SPEED RECORDS BROKEN

Could Supply 13 Per Cent of
Allies' Needs Had War
Continued.

Lifting the ban of war secrecy has
just now brought to light for the first
time one of the most stupendous feats
of construction in history—the plan-
ning and building in less than one year
of the largest ammonium nitrate plant
in the world and of a city around it
for the housing of its 25,000 workmen
and their families. At the same time
is revealed one of the chief reasons
why Germany suddenly surrendered a
year ago. The German high command
knew that the United States was
ready at Muscle Shoals, Alabama, to
manufacture 13 per cent of all the
high explosives needed by all the Al-
lied armies on all fronts in the expect-
ed drive of the following spring.

The first person on construction
work reached Muscle Shoals on No-
vember 23, 1917. On February 16,
1918, ground was first broken for a
permanent plant building. On Octo-
ber 23, 1918, eight months and eight
days later, the manufacturing plant
had begun the production of ammo-
nium nitrate.

When America entered the world
war in April, 1917, she had no means
of producing the enormous quantities
of high explosives necessary to pro-
vide the huge army she planned to
raise. The very fact that our indus-
tries were already worked to capacity
providing ammunition to the allies
seemed to make further production for
our own use impossible.

Fertilizer Process Turned to War Use.

At this juncture the Ordnance De-
partment turned to cyanamid, a com-
mercial fertilizer, which had for some
years been produced successfully at
Niagara Falls, by a process the Ameri-

can rights or which were obtained in
1907 from Germany by Frank Sher-
man Washburn, head of the American
Cyanamid Company.

By this process cyanamid was pro-
duced by extracting nitrogen from the
air and combining it with calcium ob-
tained from limestone rock and carbon
from coke. By putting cyanamid
through three more processes both am-
monia and nitric acid can be extracted
from it and combined into the explo-
sive, ammonium nitrate. Mr. Wash-
burn was invited to present plans and
estimates for the construction in the
shortest possible time of an ammonium
nitrate plant at Muscle Shoals, Ala-
bama, and a contract between his com-
pany and the United States was enter-
ed into under date of November 13,
1917.

To have general supervision of plan-
ning and carrying out the work an or-
ganization known as the Air Nitrates
Corporation was formed, to act as
agent of the Ordnance Department.
This corporation provided the general
designs, supervised all the work and
operated the camp, the town and the
plant. It also installed all equipment
in the chemical plant. The various
other sections of the work were sub-
let to organizations that were special-
ists in the directions in which they
were asked to help.

New City Built From the Ground.

It was necessary to build a new
town to house the laborers. For this
job Westinghouse Church Kerr Com-
pany was called in as contractor. This
company also built the buildings of the
chemical plant. Within four months
12,000 workmen had been assembled
and a city capable of accommodating
25,000 inhabitants had been completed,
with lodging, restaurants, stores, of-
fices, police headquarters, schools, fire
departments, hospitals, motion picture
theaters, electric light and sewerage
systems.

The construction of the plant proper
was begun on February 16, 1918. Just
eight months and eight days later the
big plant began a steady output of am-
monium nitrate. The plant contains
113 permanent buildings, with a roof
area of over 20 acres.

To provide the electric current it
was necessary to build a steam power
electric plant, for it would have taken
three years or more to complete the
dam and hydro-electric station now un-
der way. This plant, built by the J. G.
White Corporation, is one of the large-
est steam plants for developing elec-
trical energy in the world.

The output of the plant is 300 tons of
ammonium nitrate a day, and this can
be produced at Muscle Shoals at a cost
less than one-half the standard fixed
price paid by the Government for am-
monium nitrate produced by other
methods and one-fourth to one-fifth the
cost of other high explosives of equal
strength. Compare with the older
process of making ammonium nitrate,
the savings made by this plant would
have paid the \$60,000,000 cost of the
entire plant in about one and one-half
years of operation.

As a military weapon it is one of the
wisest and most economical expendi-
tures that the Ordnance Department
has undertaken. As an agent in stop-
ping the war and as a future protec-
tion to the country its value is incal-
culable.

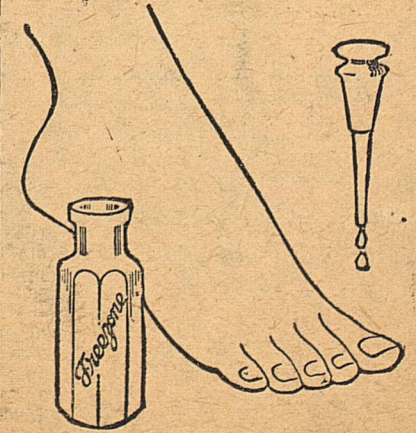
