SCHOOL BOARD PROCEEDINGS.

The School Board at their regular meeting Saturday transacted the following business.

An election was ordered for April 10, to see whether or not \$30,000 in bonds will be issued for the purpose of erecting an additional building for the school, the notice for said election appears elsewhere in this issue.

They also appointed F. M. Bradley as Tax Assessor and Collector for the District, he also was appointed census enumerator.

Judge W. B. Silliman, J. T. Burlerson and D. C. Hill were appointed as a board of equalization for the school district, they to meet the first Monday in May, or as soon thereafter as possible to go over the assessments for the district.

Trustee election was ordered for April 3, C. I. Dabney, P. H. McCormick and G. A. Neill were appointed to hold election.

NOTICE OF BOND ELECTION.

Notice is hereby given that an election will be held at the Pearce building in the town of Eldorado, Texas, within the Eldorado Independent School District, on the 10th day of April, 1920, to determine whether the bonds of said district shall be issued to the amount of thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000.00) payable serially as follows, to-wit: seven hundred fifty dollars on the 10th day of April, 1921, and seven hundred fifty dollars on the 10th day of April, each and every year thereafter to and including the year 1960, and bearing interest at the rate of 1.5 per cent per annum payable annually for the purpose of constructing and equipping a public free school building of brick and tile material, purchasing a site therefor, within said district, and for the purpose of constructing permanent repairs to the present brick and stone public free school building of said district, and whether there shall be annually levied, assessed and collected on all the taxable property in said district, for the current year and annually thereafter while said bonds, or any of them, are outstanding, a tax sufficient to pay the current interest on said bonds and provide a sinking fund sufficient to pay the principal at maturity.

L. M. Hoover has been appointed manager of said election, which shall be held as nearly as may be possible in conformity with the general election laws of the State. No person shall vote at said election unless he be a qualified voter under the Constitution and laws of this State, and a taxpayer in the said Eldorado Independent School District.

Those in favor of the issuance of the bonds and the levying of the tax shall write or print on their ballots, "For the bonds and the tax"; and those against the issuance of the bonds and the levying of the tax shall write or print on their ballots, "Against the bonds and the tax".

Said election was ordered by the board of trustees of said Eldorado Independent School District, by order passed on the 6th day of March, 1920, and this notice is issued pursuant to said order.

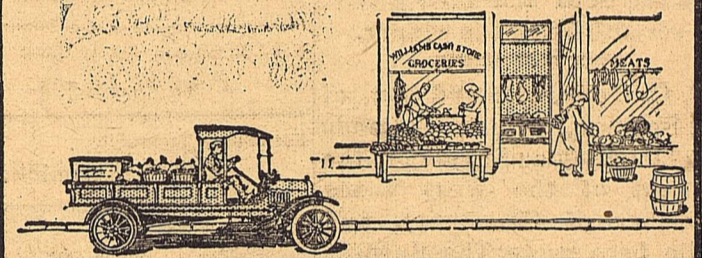




