in the law, and that each item of income from every source must be considered, unless specifically exempted. Another thing to remember is that the personal exemption allowed taxpayers by law has no relation whatever to the requirement to file return. This exemption is not to be considered until a person has figured out his net income and determined whether it was sufficient to require him to file a return. Then, if a return must be filed, he should read carefully the instractions for claiming exemption, and complete his return.

If in doubt on any point as to income or deductions, a person may secure free advice and aid from the nearest Internal Revenue office Many banks and trust companies are also furnishing similar service during banking hours.

Heavy Penalties in Law.

For failing to make a return on time the penalty is a fine of not more than \$1,000 and an addition of 25 per cent to the tax, if any. For making a false or fraudulent return the penalty is a fine of not more than \$10,000 or imprisonment not exceeding one year, or both; and, in addition, 50 per cent of the tax. There are other penalties for failing to pay tax when due and for understatement of the tax through negligence

Many Sources of 'ncome. Aside from what one may earn by his services, there are many other sources of income. If he sold any

property during 1919 he must figure out the gain realized. If he rented buildings, land, apartments or rooms such rents must be considered taxaable, and he may claim deductions for necessary expenses incidental to rents.

Bank interest is a common source of income and is taxable whether withdrawn or not. Any amount of interest credited to a depositor is income to the depositor.

Interest on mortgages and notes is taxable; also bond interest received from corporations.

A taxpayer who cashed his insurance during 1919 must report as income any excess received over the total of premiums paid. Members of partnerships or personal

service corporations or beneficiaries of an estate or trust must report their shares of income distributable to them whether or not actually withdrawn. Dividends of domestic corporations must be reported. Miny other forms f income are taxable, unless specific ally exempted.



Miss Aguinaldo is intensely patriotic. She does not conceal her resentment when she hears or reads of a misrepresentation of the Filipinos. "It is unfortunate," she once exclaimed in a voice full of sadness, "that my country and my people are hardly known, much less understood, by the people of Am-

Politics is tabooed in any conversation with this Filipino maid. She evades the topic by replying that she is too young to express opinions on things political. "All I can say," she declares, "is that I share with my father in the desire for independence for my native land. There is no question about our being able to govern ourselves."

Filipinos declare Miss Aguinaldo has a "genuine Fillpina temperament"that is, she does not believe in the occidental custom of "dates" between young men and women. She does not see anything wrong in it, she says, but it is such a violent departure from the custom in the Philippines that she cannot adopt it.

"You might laugh at me," she said, "but I cannot go out with one single escort unchaperoned. I simply can't. I will go back to my country with the soul of a Filipina.'

A newspaper in one of the large American cities that Miss Aguinaldo visit ed expressed the opinion that she would no doubt be greatly impressed by the sight of street cars and some of the fine residences she would see, but the truth is the young lady was raised in Manila, where she has seen an upto-date street car system all her life,



The management plans the erection of ten of these cotages during the next few years.

Planning to Take Care of More Children.

During the next five years the apacity of the Home will probably e doubled

The cottages which are soon to be erected, will enable the Home to ake care of an increasing number. The new policy of the Home will also favor the admittance of more half-orphaned chi'dren who have lost but one parent, but who, in the majority of cases, are in as desperate need of the Home as are the orphans.

A Eig Business Enterprise.

The cost of providing the living and educational expenses of a large family of 600 is enormous. These hildren have to have shoes and stockings and clothes the same as other children. The increased cost of living has run the daily expense of the Home up to the figure of about \$500 per day. Eighty to ninety percent of these expenses are cared for by free will offerings of the people of its own bounds. The Home has its own farm; a fine dairy, stocked with good milch cows; a power plant for heating and lighting; a laundry, a bakery; and a grammar school. to the amount of \$175,000.

Daily Life of Children.

A child's life at this Home is regular, and so arranged as to give it practical experience, combinin the elements of play, work and edu cation. In the morning the chil-dren go to school. In the afternoon hey can be found out on the ex ansive grounds playing and frol king-harpy like other children






