## RECEIVED SAD MESSAGE.

Tom F. Green of Bailey Ranch neighborhood received a telegram Saturday stating that his brother Will, died that morning at a Kerrville Sanitarium.

Will Green will be remembered by many here as he spent about a year in our midst, he was 28 years old and died from injuries received in January from his horse falling on him.

He had served 11 months over sea during the late war, was a devout christian man for the past 10 years, and was the first of 8 children to pass to the home beyond, leaving his aged father and mother, four sisters and 3 brothers to mourn his departure. His remains were taken to his home at Harper for burial.

Mr. Green went to see his sick brother about two weeks ago and has the sympathy of the entire neighborhood.

## \$5 PER MONTH FEEDS ORPHAN

### Cleveland H. Dodge Shows What Near East Relief Can Do in Efficient Purchasing.

Buying in wholesale lots and under the most favorable market conditions, Near East Relief of 1 Madison avenue, New York city, with representatives in every state of the Union, has been able to baffle the high cost of living so far as relief supplies for the suffering millions of the Near East are concerned.

Cleveland H. Dodge, treasurer, in a statement shows that the committee is able to provide food for the suffering people of the Near East at prices much lower than the average charge here.

A donation of \$5.00 month will provide food for one orphan, \$10 per month provides not only food, but also clothes and shelter for one orphan, and for \$15 per month attendance at school is assured to each orphan in addition to food, clothing and shelter.

In the appeal for funds to save the starving remnants of the Armenians and other western Asia peoples, Near East Relief is inviting the American public to "adopt" an orphan at the rates given here. Over 250,000 homeless children are in need of help in the Near East. Women's organizations, lodges, churches and social clubs are responding to the appeal by adopting quotas of orphans for support over a definite period.

## NO WORK FOR GRAND JURY.

When District Court convened Monday the grand jury was impaneled, but finding nothing to do adjourned Monday afternoon.

On the south line of Schleicher County in the Eldorado Independent School District, land is assessed at two dollars per acre. Just across the line in the Sonora school district, the same quality of land is assessed at seven dollars per acre for school purposes. Is the education of Schleicher county children less important than the education of Sutton county children?

You have heard several times recently that the school board was planning to double assess the district, when in fact they are planning for only half valuation. If the property of the district is assessed at half value there will be ample found for the school. Some of the property is already assessed at half value, if so the board of equalization will probably not disturb you, if you have property at two fifth of its value it must necessarily be raised to a point of equalization and about half value instead of being double assessed you will only be half assessed.

## NOTICE OF BOND LECTION

Notice is hereby given that an election will be held at the Bearce building in the town of Eldorado, Texas, within the Eldorado Independent School District, on the 10th day of April, 1920, to determine whether the bonds of said district shall be issued to the amount of thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000.00) payable serially as follows, to wit: seven hundred fifty dollars on the 10th day of April, 1921, and seven hundred fifty dollars on the 10th day of April, each and every year thereafter to and including the year 1960, and bearing interest at the rate of five per cent per annum payable annually for the purpose of constructing and equipping a public free school building of brick and tile material, purchasing a site therefor, within said district, and for the purpose of constructing permanent repairs to the present brick and stone public free school building of said district, and whether there shall be annually levied, assessed and collected on all the taxable property in said district, for the current year and annually thereafter while said bonds, or any of them, are outstanding, a tax sufficient to pay the current interest on said bonds and provide a sinking fund sufficient to pay the principal at maturity.

L. M. Hoover has been appointed manager of said election, which shall be held as nearly as may be possible in conformity with the general election laws of the State.

No person shall vote at said election unless he be a qualified voter under the Constitution and laws of this State, and a taxpayer in the said "Eldorado" Independent School District.

Those in favor of the issuance of the bonds and the levying of the tax shall write or print on their ballots, "For the bonds and the tax"; and those against the issuance of the bonds and the levying of the tax shall write or print on their ballots, "Against the bonds and the tax".

Said election was ordered by the board of trustees of said Eldorado Independent School District, by order passed on the 6th day of March, 1920, and this notice is issued pursuant to said order.

We became a trustee in 1910, and have seen the school swing to and fro, since that date, but reluctantly say the school has made very much progress the past three years and the graduates last year are monuments to that effect, and we believe the 1920 class will be even more efficient.

The crowded condition in the various departments demand more room, the teachers are drawing less salary here than any county near by and demand and are entitled to an increase in salary. We believe that most any reasonable person you might elect would stand by the present plans of the board, for when the responsibility rest upon them to finance the school or let it retard, that person will see a new vision it will be his voice that will advance or retard the education of the boys and girls who might seek an education at the school here.

So in casting a vote Saturday don't think that the new board you might elect will be able to run the school without taxes and teachers, they will be confronted with the same knotty problems that the present board are, and that is the High Cost of Everything.

There will probably be more than four names on the ticket but only four to be elected.

Remember that we will thank you most heartily to mark our name out when you vote Saturday.

## LOSES FINE PIG.



## FILIPINAS GET BALLOT BEFORE AMER. SISTERS

Senora de Veyra Describes  
Status of Women in the  
Philippines.

The Filipino woman is destined to be in the world's spotlight more than ever before as a result of the news just received by cable from Manila to the effect that the Philippine senate has passed the equal suffrage bill giving women full political rights with men. This would indicate that the Filipina may beat her American sisters to the ballot box.

The Filipina has many admirers who predict she will make good if she gets the vote, just as she has made good in the very important role she has occupied in the family and business life of the Philippines ever since the introduction of Christianity in the islands three centuries ago.

"America's advent in the Philippines discovered a wonderfully interesting, responsive little being, the Filipino woman," writes one American concerning

the Filipina. "Mothering the only Christian people in the far east, she holds a place of authority, love and respect in family and social life that is not accorded to women in countries neighboring the islands, or in India, China or Japan."

A Filipina who is doing an important work for her people in the United States is Mrs. Jaime C. de Veyra, wife of the resident commissioner from the Philippines. Not only has she frequently addressed in Washington as to conditions in the new Philippines, but she has visited various cities, speaking before women's clubs. The senora wears, in giving her talks, one of the beautiful gowns of her home land, a delicate pineapple fabric, hand-woven and hand-embroidered, shaped like a gauzy-winged butterfly.

"In many ways the path of the women of the Philippines is easy," says Senora de Veyra. "Laws made by her have combined the best of American and Spanish precedents, and she has come into her own with far less struggle than either her American or her Spanish sisters. Married women may hold property in severalty. They are guardians of their own children. These are vested rights and cannot be taken away from her."

"Professional opportunities are as good for women as for men in the land from which I come. The Filipina is by custom the dictator in the home. She is usually the keeper of the family treasure. Practically all of the small shops in Manila are conducted by women. Women are already members of the Philippine Bar Association—a thing still impossible in Great Britain. They are also successful as physicians."

Life is really a fifty-fifty proposition for women in the Philippines, according to the senora, who has taken such

a prominent part in women's work there that she has sometimes been referred to as "the little mother of them all." She was the assistant matron of the Normal Hall Dormitory for Girls when she married. She speaks English fluently and puts her little talks "over" with real tact. She has four children. An evidence of her enterprising was her action last year in mastering shorthand so she might be "useful to her husband at home in the evenings in case he wishes to dictate a few letters or a speech."

## 120,000 STAND IN BREAD LINE

More Than 1,000,000 Face  
Death Is Message Brought by  
Miss Dakesian.

Imagine a bread line of 120,000 famished people waiting for twenty-four hours a day for the dole of food that is the sole barrier between them and death from starvation. That is the situation in Alexandropol, a city in Russian Armenia, according to Miss Hermine Dakesian, a pretty Armenian girl, one of the survivors of four years

of the horrors of Turkish massacres and deportations. Saved by an American woman, she has come to this country and entered Oberlin College.

With her came fourteen other Armenian girls in charge of Miss Adelaide S. Dwight, a Near East Relief worker, who has been instrumental in helping to save hundreds of thousands of their people from death by starvation. Miss Dwight, who is not given to exaggeration and has seen conditions at first hand, says more than a million people are facing death by starvation in Armenia and will perish unless America aids.

Herself an eyewitness to the slaughter of hundreds of helpless women and children by the Turks and a victim of the deportations, Miss Dakesian, an unusually pretty girl, says there is untold suffering in Armenia and Syria. She praises the efforts of the Near East Relief, formerly the American Committee for Armenian and Syrian Relief, to save as many of these people as possible. At Erivan, the capital of the Armenian republic, one hot meal is given out daily, and by this relief alone the city's death rate has been cut from a thousand daily to an average of twenty. At Alexandropol, where the refugees from Turkish Armenia were driven by thousands, the situation is appalling, Miss Dakesian says. It is to avert these wholesale deaths that Near East Relief is making a nation-wide appeal for funds.

**INCOME TAX RETURNS DUE**

Business Men, Farmers and Wage Workers Must File Schedules of Income for 1919.

MARCH 15 LAST FILING DATE.

Net Incomes of \$1,000 or Over, if Single; or \$2,000 or Over if Married, Must Be Reported.

The Income Tax imposed by Act of Congress on earnings of the year 1919 is now being collected.

Returns under oath must be made on or before March 15 by every citizen and resident who had a net income for 1919 amounting to:

\$1,000 or over, if single; or if married and living apart from wife (or husband); or if widowed or divorced.

\$2,000 or over, if married and living with wife (or husband).

The status of the person on the last day of the year fixes the status for the year with respect to the above requirements.

Under any of these circumstances a return must be made, even though no tax is due.

Husband and wife must consider the income of both, plus that of dependent minor children, in meeting this requirement; and, if sufficient to require a return, all items must be shown in a joint return or in separate returns of husband and wife.

A single person with minor dependents must include the income of such dependents.

A minor who has a net income of \$1,000 or more is not considered a dependent, and must file a separate return.

Personal returns should be made on Form 1040A, unless the net income exceeded \$5,000, in which case Form 1040 should be used.

Residents of Texas should file their returns with, and make payments of Income Tax to, Alexander S. Walker, Collector of Internal Revenue, Austin, Tex.

**How to Figure Income.**

The best way to find out whether one must file a return is to get a Form 1040A and follow the instructions printed on it. That form will serve as a reminder of every item of income, and if a return is due it tells how to prepare and file it.

If in doubt on any point as to income or deductions, a person may secure free advice and aid from the nearest Internal Revenue office.

Guesswork, estimates and other hit-or-miss methods are barred when a person is making out his Income Tax return. Accuracy and completeness must be insisted upon. The return is a sworn statement. As such it must be thorough and accurate.

Salaries and wage earners must ascertain the actual compensation received. Overtime, bonuses, shares in the profits of a business, value of quarters and board furnished by the employer and other items which are compensations for services must be included.

It must be borne in mind that compensation may be paid in other forms than in cash. A bonus paid in Liberty Bonds is taxable at the market value of the bonds. A note received in payment for services is taxable income at its face value, and the interest upon it is also taxable.

**Other Returns Due.**

Every partnership doing business in the United States must file a return on Form 1065; and every personal service corporation must file a similar return.

Corporations must file annual returns on Form 1120.

Trustees, executors, administrators and others acting in a fiduciary capacity are required to file returns. In some cases, Form 1041 is used; in others, Form 1040; and still others, returns on both forms are required.

Information returns, on Forms 1099 and 1098, must be filed by every organization, firm or person who paid, during 1919, an amount of \$1,000 in salary, wages, interest, rent, or other fixed or determinable income to another person, partnership, personal service corporation or fiduciary. These information returns should be forwarded directly to the Commissioner of Internal Revenue (sorting division), Washington, D. C.

**INCOME TAX IN NUTSHELL**

WHO—Single persons who had net income of \$1,000 or more for the year 1919.

WHEN—March 15, 1920, is final date for filing returns and making first payments.

WHERE—Collector of Internal Revenue for District in which the person resides.

HOW—Full directions on Form 1040A and Form 1040; also the law and regulations.

WHAT—Four per cent normal tax on taxable income up to \$4,000 in excess of exemption. Eight per cent normal tax on balance of taxable income. Sur-tax, from one per cent to sixty-five per cent on net incomes over \$5,000.

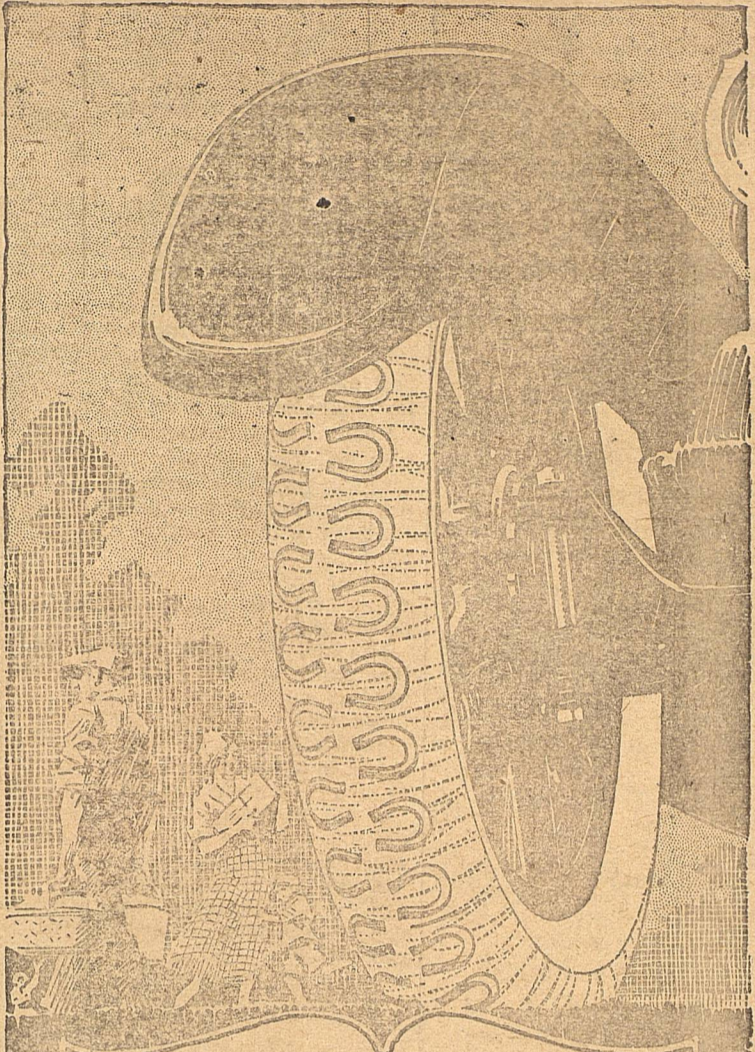
