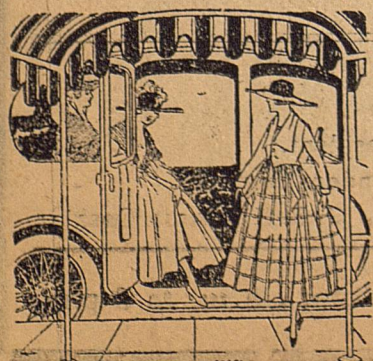

**WHAT WILL COTTON SELL**

FOR THIS FALL

Eldorado, Texas. June 14, 1920. Editor of The Success:

I am repeatedly being asked what in my opinion the cotton crop of this year should sell for if you will kindly give space for it, I will give the condition of crop, and some other facts having influence on the price of cotton, which I believe will be of interest to a number of your readers.

Cotton condition for period ending May 25, 1920, for the United States, was 62.3, same date last year was 75.6, same date ten years average was 82.3. Texas for period ending May 25, 1920 60 per cent, same date last year 76, same date ten years average 80 per cent. This report shows cotton to be very poor, however some improvement is to be expected this month, all previous records for May 25 to June 25 showing improvement except 1919 which was 75.6 for May and 70 for June.

Reports are that Boll Weevil are beginning to work in infested sections, their damage will probably be very serious owing to the lateness and weak condition of the crop, labor is very scarce and high in all sections, this will be reflected in poor cultivation, reduced yield, and large abandonment.

Prospects are for labor shortage in the fall picking season which will further reduce total out-turn. The pink boll worm is causing much anxiety, however, this should not be expected to reduce to a very great extent this year's cotton supply as this pest as yet is confined to small areas. The carry over for this year will be small and of low grade. This fact with the present restricted spinners future contract, will probably further hamper movement of low grades, especially if we have another low grade year. I expect to see low grade cotton sell for less than cost of production this fall, however, the good grades should be in splendid demand. Europe is fast getting back to prewar consumption.

France should have at least 86 per cent of her prewar spindles in operation by October. While Belgium is reported to have now 90 per cent in operation and is expected to have full capacity before Jan. 1, 1920. Financial troubles however, will keep these countries from being in the market as might be expected.

The action of our Federal Reserve Bank in calling loans to try to lower the high cost of living, has had a backward effect on the cotton market and will probably continue to do so, it is however, gratifying to note that southern spots has maintained a price of better than 40 cents middling, in the face of a very bad market condition for some time past, however, there is a great difference between middling price and what the farmer usually gets for much of his cotton crop and I'm advising farmers to do all they can to improve the grade of their cotton this year, in this way only can they get any profit out of their cotton. It is too early to predict what the crop will be, or what it will sell for, but I think it safe to say that this crop will be a short one, and for below the needs of the world.

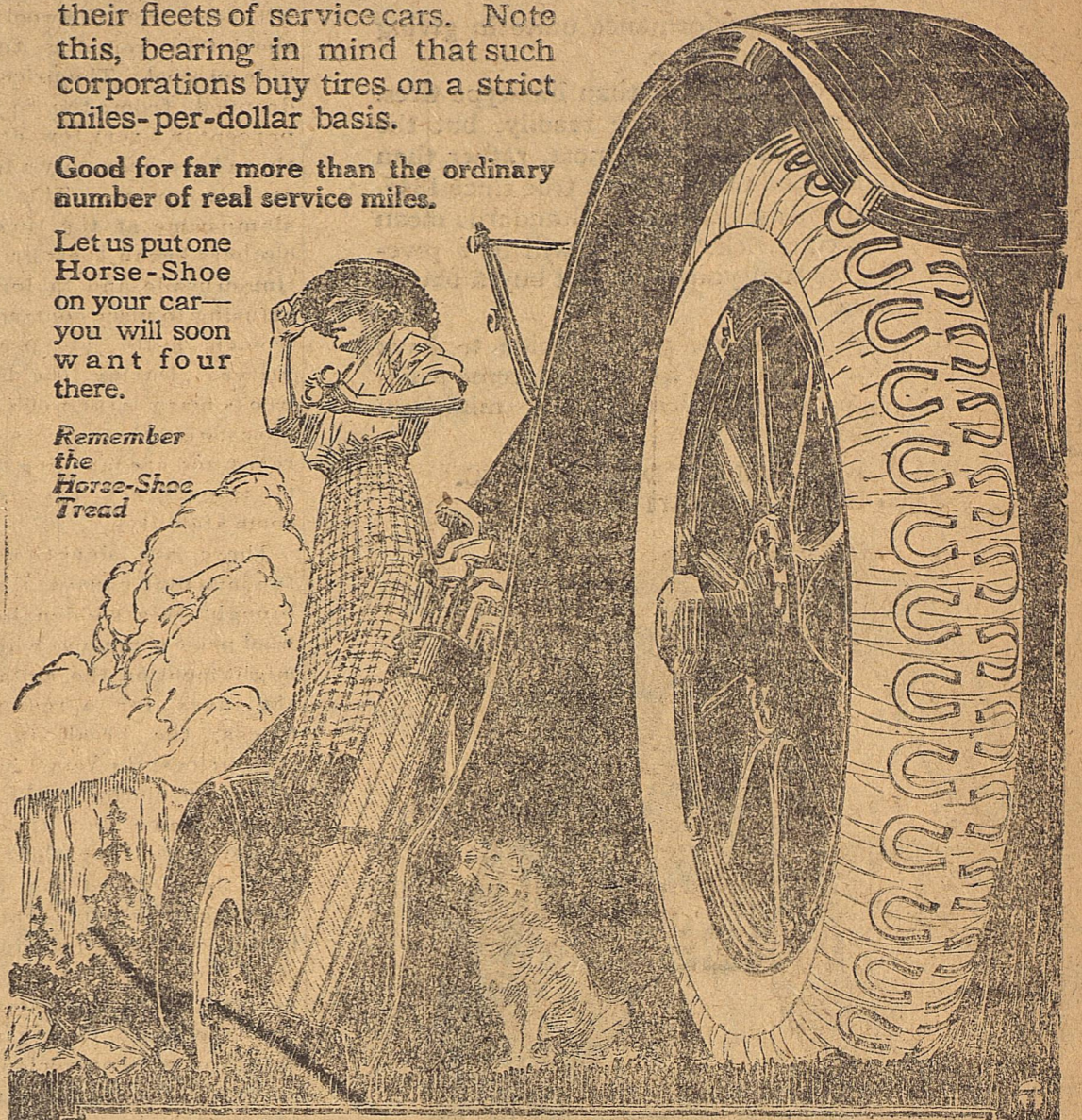

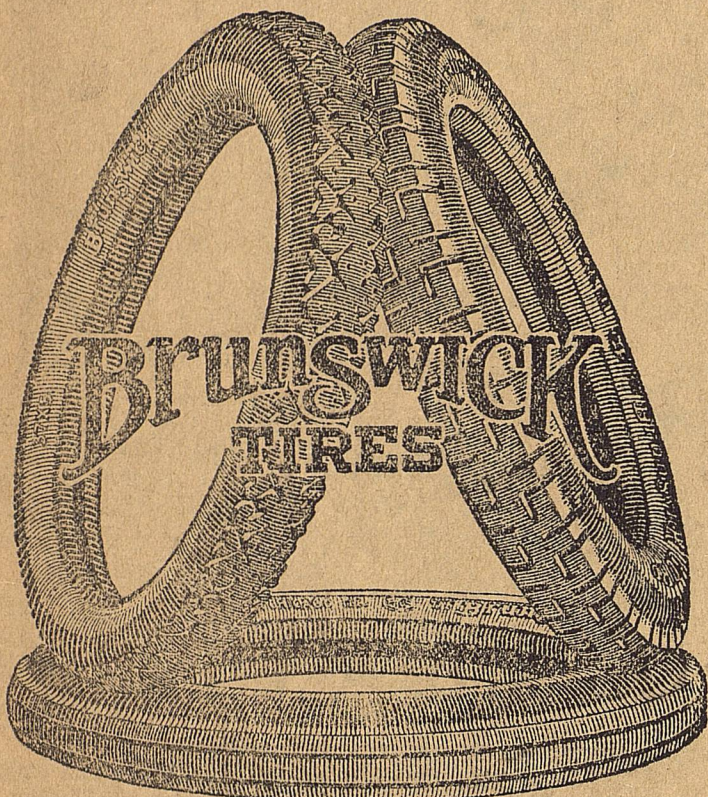

### THE WOOL SITUATION.

To All County Agents:

Dear Sir:

What to do with the wool clip we are sure is a question confronting woolgrowers the country over.

It is common knowledge the bottom dropped clear out of the wool market in a very short time. Buyers the country over withdrew from the wool market absolutely refusing to make bids on wool. The price of wool dropped from ten to twenty percent in a very few days and there have been only a few bids at any price. This unusual slump came at the time retail clothes began their price cutting crusade and tailors were refusing to place contracts with woolen mills at prevailing prices. During the last few weeks many large woolen mills have closed their doors temporarily and are marking time until the market has regained some stability.

There are doubtless many fundamental causes that have brought this sudden break in wool prices, among which one might mention the agitation of the press for a reduction of prices; the break in British wool prices; the very high price of woolen clothing; the period of depression at a time when money was very tight in the east; the efforts of the Federal Reserve Bank to prevent speculation, and general unsettled conditions.

According to estimates we do not have more than a normal supply of wool or woolen goods on hand. In other words we are sure the break was not due to an over supply.

The cut made by the department stores does not mean that they have bought their clothing cheaper but shows they are willing to turn their stock at a smaller profit. The price of clothing for fall delivery shows an advance of from twenty to thirty five percent over our spring delivery prices. There is no doubt but what the present wool clip is needed at a price which will pay the grower a profit. If this is true, then the best thing to do is to store his wool until the market becomes steady and the general trend can be determined.

In my opinion the wool that has been concentrated by the various organizations in this state should be stored for the present. The members of the organizations in this state should make a special effort to hold all wools that have been stored and not let the buyers buy the best clips to break up the pooling system. After the market settles down, the associations may arrange sales dates or ship to commission firms if they are not offered what they think the wool is worth.

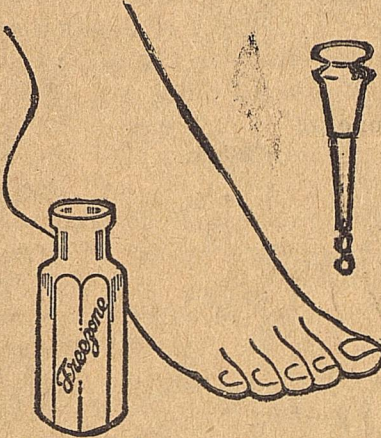
