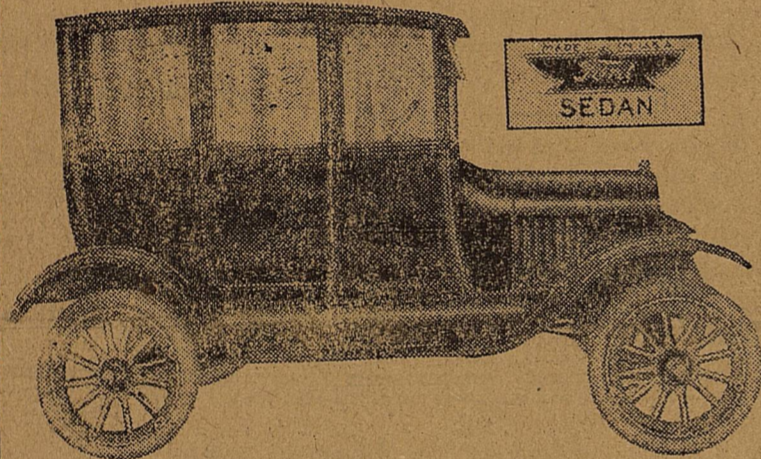

WOOL SHRINKAGE

INQUIRY IS ASKED.

An investigation of the action of the wool division of the Government, operated during the war, with reference to the valuation of wools taken over by the Government in the San Angelo district, is proposed in a resolution introduced by Representative Hudspeth of the El Paso District. The House Agricultural Committee would be directed to make an inquiry with reference to the valuation, shrinkage and purchase of wool taken over by the Government during 1918 at San Angelo and in other concentration points in Texas, with a view of developing why San Angelo wools received a prejudicial reduction in price.

It is asserted by Mr. Hudspeth that the producer of wool in the San Angelo district failed to receive what was coming to him in the allowances for shrinkage. One shipment of 20,000 pounds he states, made from San Angelo, was accepted on a basis of 80 per cent shrinkage, whereas after treatment, at the Boston market it shrunk only 70 per cent. As a result of this and similar situations, he claims the producers of that district failed to receive about \$500,000 which is due them. The matter was placed before the contract adjustment board of the War Department last summer in an application for a refund. The board held against the Texas producers and the matter was then taken before Secretary Baker of the War Department. The Secretary sustained the board's findings.

"The purpose of this resolution," said Mr. Hudspeth, "is to ascertain who profited as a result of the shrinkage in one shipment of 20,000 pounds. I claim that the Texas producers were virtually being defrauded out of the 10 per cent.

It also is shown that for San Angelo wools they paid from 5c to 10c a pound less than at other Texas concentration points.

NEFF ABOLISHES BOARD OF PARDONES.

Austin, Jan. 22.—Efforts of Texas' local, county and state officials to check the "crime wave" culminated here today in what is regarded as the most drastic blow ever aimed at the professional criminals in the state, when Governor Pat M. Neff ordered state board of pardons abolished. The two members of the board were asked to resign and Neff announced that applications for positions on another board would not be considered.

Hereafter a convict can only be pardoned after the district judge, who sentenced him has officially presented his case, and he himself has investigated it.

FOUND OIL WELL.

R. P. Hinyard and G. M. Brown returned from Fort Stockton Friday and report finding an oil well about 80 miles east of Fort Stockton, on the Riley lease. Some three or four years ago a well was drilled to a depth of about 2400 feet, nothing was found, the casing was pulled, the hole plugged and abandoned, last Thursday when Mr. Hinyard and Brown passed they found oil, gas and sulphur water flowing from this well, they got a bottle of the oil from off the water and brought it home with them. They told about their find when they reached Sheffield and Mr. Riley was making preparation to go and investigate the find.

Mr. Brown who has considerable oil leases near the Fort Stockton oil well, says the 96 foot wonder well recently brought in, has been capped, but the oil and gas is still escaping from the hole around the casing, they are getting ready for the pump. Mr. Brown's brother who is working in the field and has seen all developments, believes the well when put on the pump will produce between 100 and 200 barrels daily.

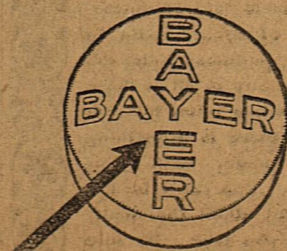

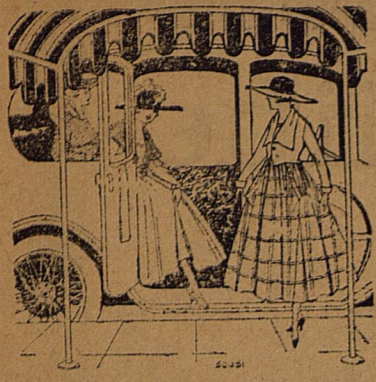

VARIETIES OF COURAGE

"KERSMITH is an awful coward," said the retired merchant. "He hasn't as much spunk as a chipmunk. This morning I saw a man half his size twist his nose, and he never offered to defend himself. He trembled all over and was covered with a cold sweat."

"And yet, under other circumstances, Kersmith might show all kinds of courage," said the hotel-keeper. "It isn't safe to jump to conclusions about such things. A woman will climb a tree, and shriek for the police if she sees a mouse, and if a real peril comes along, she'll exhibit more courage in five minutes than the average man could dig up in a hundred years."

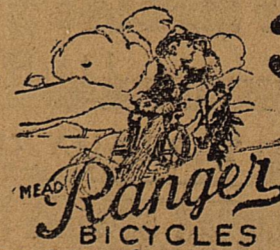

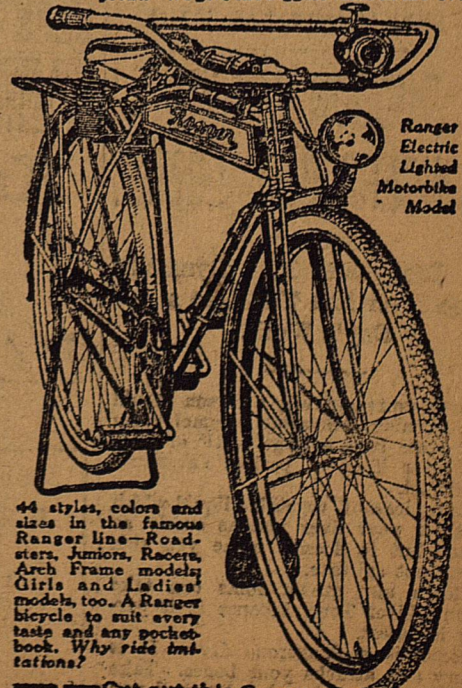
