

## INQUIRY IS ASKED.

An investigation of the action by the Government during 1918 sidered. at San Angelo and in other concentration points in Texas, prejudicial reduction in price.

It is asserted by Mr. Hudspeth that the producer of wool in the San Angelo [district failed to in the allowances for shrinkage. One shipment of 20,000 pounds he states, made from San An gelo, was accepted on a basis of 80 per cent shrinkage, whereas after treatment at the Boston market it shrunk only 70 per cent. As a result of this and similar situations, he claims the justment board of the War Department last summer in an application for a refund, The board held against the Texas producers and the matter was then taken before Secretary Baker of the War Depratment. The Secretary sustained the board's findings.

"There are scores of different kinds of courage in this world, and you can't expect one man to have them all. A man may tremble and cringe when threatened with physical vio lence, and yet stand up serene and magnificent when the assessor come to the door, and there's nothing finer than that sort of moral courage.

"There used to be a blacksmith it this town who had a wide reputation as a fire eater. He wasn't afraid of anything, people said. If he heard of a promising bruiser anywhere in the countryside, he couldn't rest until he had mixed things with him. And he didn't ask for purses or other inducements. He engaged in combat just because he loved it, and was happiest when his nose was knocked to one side, and his eyes were bunged up so that he couldn't see whether he was going or coming. He acted the hero on several occasions, rescuing people from burning buildings, and saving gents who were drowning and his nerve became a byword.

"Well, in the fullness of time his teeth went wrong and his head swelled up until it looked like a squash. He bought about a million things at the drug store, and they wouldn't relieve the pain.
