

WOODMEN INJUNCTION CASE TRANSFERRED.
Houston, Texas, March 12—Because Judge J. D. Harvey of the Eighteenth District Court is a member of the Woodmen of the World the injunction case involving a restraining order obtained by Judge R. H. Buck, elected head counsel by the insurgent group, and others, restraining W. A. Fraizer, sovereign commander, and other officials of the order, from certifying to the national body the names of the supreme delegates elected by that group, has been transferred to the Eleventh District Court and will be heard before Judge Charles E. Ashe.
Before transferring the case, Judge Harvey dissolved the temporary injunction granted Mrs. Hortense Ward and others of the Woodmen Circle, restraining head officers from electing officers. As the convention adjourned without electing officers and delegates, it was held that the injunction was no longer needed.

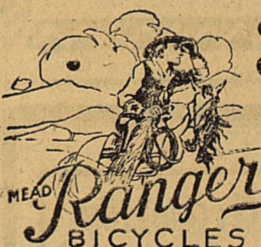

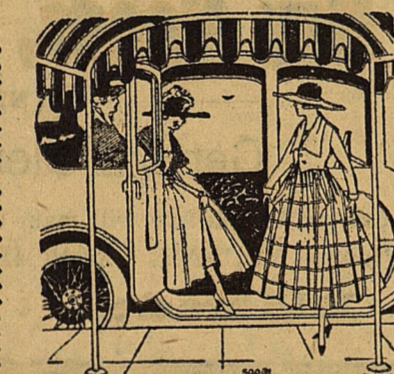

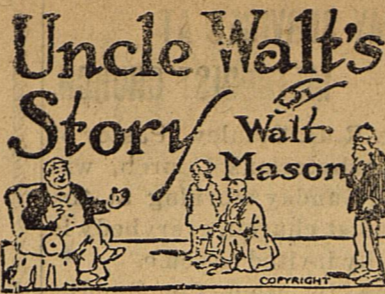
