## JIM KENNEY KILLED NEAR BARNHART BY OFFICERS

Jim Kenney, alias Jack Jones, was shot three times and instantly killed on the Suggs ranch near Barnhart Friday, the officers went out to arrest Kenney and claim he resisted arrest. The officer MeShon was accompanied by two other men, they found Kenney near the Suggs ranch driving a team of horses to a wagon, the man was haulted near a gate and told he was wanted on a charge at Hillsboro, N. M., the man said he had rather die than go to Hillsboro and ordered the officer to get out of the way or he would run his team over them, he then started the team, also had a small knife in his hand, when the officer shot him three times, killing him instantly.

Kenney was a married man and had two children, a boy about years old and a girl about 6, the wife and children reached the scene shortly after the shooting.

## TAKE TRIP UNEXPECEDLY.

A "Hi-Jack" held up C. A. Jetton of Junction, and Miss Annie Taylor of Rocksprings, while pleasure riding near Junction Tuesday night August 30th, and at the point of a revolver told the young couple to head for San Antonio via the Mason route, and when they came to a good piece of road he would insist on a little more speed. On the way to San Antonio he made Mr. Jetton trade trouseuse with him and took what money he had, they reached San Antonio about daylight, when the gasoline gave out on North Flores street, the gunman left the couple saying he would go get some gas, but never came back. Mr. Jetton immediately notified the police force who came to the scene at once and put out a drag net to apprehend the Hi-Jack.

Mr. Jetton immediately wired the homefolks at Junction their whereabouts and of their unexpected flight to San Antonio.

The Hi-Jack is supposed to be the same man who was arrested Sunday at Sonora for stealing a casing in Mason County and selling it at Junction, for which offence he was arrested on the T half circle ranch and taken to Sonora, on account of the small offence he was not placed in jail, but was allowed to stay with his wife and baby at a garage from which place he left, he then stole a Ford car from Wirt Stephenson and drove it to within 15 miles of Junction when he lost a casing, he then abandoned the car and hid in the hills nearby until night, when he stole a horse from a ranchman and was riding toward Junction when he met Mr. Jetton and Miss Taylor and with them made the San Antonio trip. He gave his name to the Sonora officers as Jack

Johnson. The woman and baby that accompanied him left for San Antonio with some tourist in her Hudson Super Six.

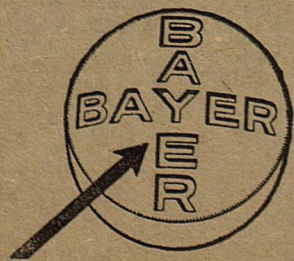

"MR. SQUILL, the druggist, is selling some wonderful liquid porcelain, and I think we ought to have a bottle," said Mrs. Jamesworthy. "There are a dozen things about the house which would be greatly improved if enameled. The bathtub, for instance, is a disgrace, as most of the white coating has disappeared."
