lives were lost and the damage
to property was estimated at
from \$12,000,000 to \$15,000,000.
One thousand homes was wash-
ed away, mostly in the mexican
part of town.

inches of rain from Saturday
morning to Sunday morning.
San Marcos was flooded and
some damage done to property,
in fact the whole of central east
Texas, from the Red River to
to Larado on the Rio Grande
was soaked.

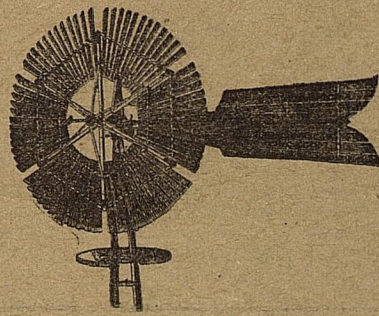

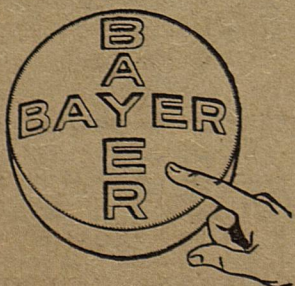

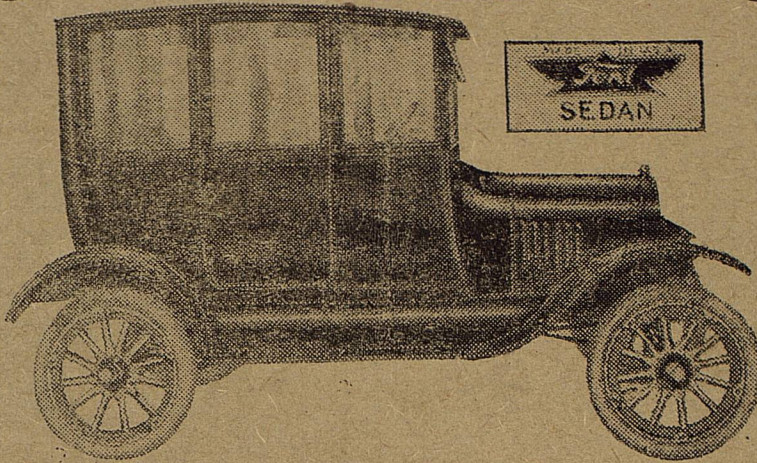
