## Obama sweeps past McCain to claim presidency

Schleicher County voters returned Sheriff David Doran to office Tuesday with a 967 to 326 win over challenger Shane West. The win, in Schleicher County's only contested race gives Doran a fourth term in office.
Doran's victory came despite threats made by FLDS spokes man Willie Jessop that residents at the YFZ Ranch would register and vote in large numbers. While just over a hundred residents of the ranch did register, and an unknown number dic show up to vote, they apparently didn't target Doran, or there just weren't enough of them to influence the outcome. Schleicher County's vote totals closely resembled statewide returns where Republican U.S. Senator John Cornyn coasted to an easy victory over his Democratic Challenger and the McCain/Palin ticket easily outdistanced the Obama/Biden ticket. Things went differently in the national polling, however, as Barack Obama surged ahead in several battleground states to make an early night of it and secure his place in history as the first African-American to win the presidency
Obama will be succeed George W. Bush as the 44th President of the United States when he takes the oath of office on January 20, 2009.

Meanwhile, Schleicher County representatives in Wash ington, D.C. and Austin will remain the same. U.S. Repre sentative Mike Conaway (R- Midland) won easy re-election over his Libertarian challenger John R. Strohm. With almost all precincts reporting, Conaway was garnering almost 90 percent of the vote.
State Senator Robert Duncan (R-Lubbock) likewise won easy re-election over Libertarian challenger M.J. Smith. Dun
can also captured nearly 90 percent of the votes cast. Closer to home, State Representative Harvey Hilderbran, (R-Kerrville) won re-election over Libertarian challenger Brian W. Holik. At press time Hilderbran had received just over 88 percent of the vote.

One unexpected result of Tuesday's election were the number of straight party votes. Local voters cast 169 straight Democratic ticket votes and 259 straight Republican ticket votes. There were also 24 straight Libertarian ticket votes.


Sheriff David Doran accepted congratulatory calls from supporters Tuesday night after the election returns came in.

All of this isn't socialism, however, but emer gency measures to preserve credit, the lifeblood of capitalism. The Wall Street axiom that "the markets can stay irrational longer than you can stay solvent" applies particularly to banks, which can't exist without market confidence. The architect of the American economic system, Alexander Hamilton, acted just as aggressively to prop up the banks during a panic in 1792 , although on a much smaller scale. In so doing, he saved the U.S. financial revolution that fueled the young country's economic rise. By the 1820 s, the United States caught up to England in per capita output.
Financial panics aren't new -- as economic historian John Steele Gordon has noted, they've occurred about every 20 years throughout American and loan and the Long Term Capital Management bailouts didn't denote the end of American capitalism. If the Treasury and the Fed, along with their counterparts around the globe have acted quickly and boldly enough, they will have forestalled economic calamity.
Then, we will still face a sharp recession, b we have weathered those before. We can return we have weathered those before. We can return
swiftly to economic growth, as long as the necesswiftly to economic growth, as long as the neces-

The sentencing phase of the trial will begin Tuesday, and Wharton County District Attorney Josh McCown has indicated he will seek
the death penalty the death penalty. was rendered by the jury today," said Texas Parks and Wildlife Department Executive Director Carter Smith. "It is a fitting decision given the horrific nature of the crime com-

Freeman was suspected of poaching, and opened fire on Hurst and other law enforce ment officers following a high-speed police chase on the eve of the game warden's 34th birthday.
