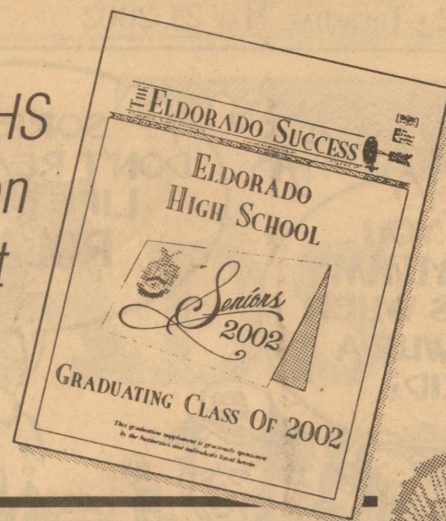

Farm Bill restores Wool & Mohair price supports

Farm state legislators, including Charlie Stenholm of Texas 17th District, were on hand last week when President George W. signed the 2002 Farm Bill into law.

While the growers of staple crops like wheat, corn and rice will benefit the most from the bill, other farmers and ranchers, especially Texas sheep and goat raisers, are pleased with the bill. Specifically, the bill restores price supports for wool and mohair, offering domestic producers a bit more

of a level playing field when compared to highly subsidized competitors in New Zealand and Australia.

Stenholm, the ranking member of the House Agriculture Committee was quick to refute claims that the bill is fiscally irresponsible. "Contrary to what has been said about this farm bill, it is not a budget buster, and in fact the president's own budget provided the spending for this farm bill," Stenholm said. "It is also worth noting

that this six-year farm bill will spend less over that period of time than has been spent in ad hoc emergency payments over the past four years."

Passage of the Farm Bill or the Farm Security and Rural Investment Act of 2002, as the bill was actually called in Congress, was never certain. And, as the bill made its way from committee to floor vote in the House and Senate, and then to the conference committee, there were repeated attempts to strip away major sections of the bill, including the wool and mohair provisions.

Ultimately, the success of the bill depended less on the party affiliation of its sponsors and more on tenure in Congress. Stenholm, a Democrat and Henry Bonilla, a Republican, worked together to fend off attempts to remove the wool and mohair price supports.

The bill creates a marketing assistance loan program for wool and mohair similar to other program commodities. It provides

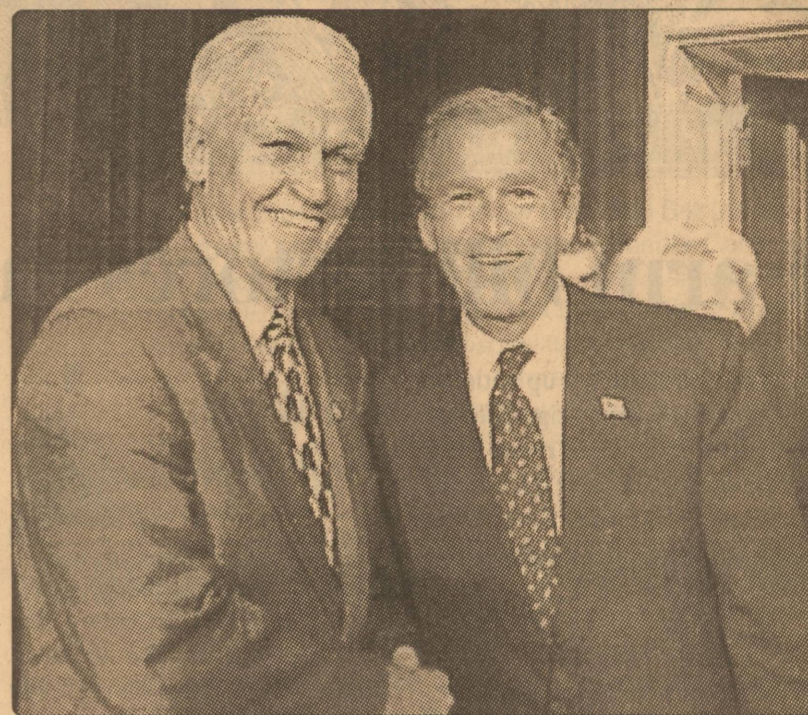
producers price support loans or loan deficiency payments at loan rates of \$1.00 per pound for graded wool, \$0.40 per pound for non-graded wool and \$4.20 per pound for mohair.

Peanut farmers will collect about \$4 billion more over 10 years and, for the first time, in direct checks. The corn support price will rise from the current \$1.89 a bushel to \$1.98 this year and next, and then drop by 2 cents a bushel.

The bill also reauthorized and provided funding for several assistance programs including the Food Stamp Program.

Conservation programs also received a boost in the bill, with funding increasing by about 85 percent.

"This bill is generous, and will provide a safety net for farmers. And it will do so without encouraging overproduction and depressing prices," President Bush said during the signing ceremony. "It will allow farmers and ranchers to

American Legion to dedicate war memorial at courthouse

American Legion Bev McCormick Post 257 will dedicate its newly completed war memorial on the Schleicher County courthouse square at 9:00 a.m. on Monday. The dedication will be held in conjunction with the Legion's annual Memorial Day program.

At the heart of the war memorial is M101A1 105mm towed Howitzer canon. The artillery piece was donated to the local Legionnaires by the U.S. Army and came to Eldorado from the Lexington, Kentucky. When it was in active service, the field piece could fire a 33 lb. projectile some 14,500 meters, or approximately 9 miles, at a maximum rate of fire of 10 rounds per minute. Similar weapons saw action in every conflict

from World War II to the Gulf War. Work on the Legion's memorial began in early 2002 and includes a flag pole, complete with American flag. Several members of Post 257 assisted in construction. Crowder Oilfield Services helped with transportation of the piece as well as painting the Howitzer. The memorial was completed only days ago, just in time for the Memorial Day dedication.

A color guard from Goodfellow AFB in San Angelo will be on hand to help with the program which is scheduled for 9:00 a.m. on Monday, May 27, 2002. As always, the public is invited to attend to help honor America's fallen heroes, as well as to dedicate the new memorial.

DPS urges drivers to use caution on holiday weekend

During Memorial Day weekend, Texas drivers face increased traffic on the roadways and a greater risk of involvement in car crashes. Drivers can improve their chance of safely arriving at their destination by following a few simple steps - do not speed or drink and drive, and always buckle up.

"If you travel the roadways during the holiday weekend, remember that one bad decision can jeopardize your life or the lives of others. If you plan to drink - don't drive. Choose a designated driver who will stay sober and get you home safely," said Col. Thomas A. Davis Jr., director of the DPS. "Avoid speeding, drive alert and use your safety belt."

DPS troopers and many other police agencies are increasing patrols over the weekend to stop drunk drivers, speeders and seat

belt violators. Through a statewide campaign, Click It or Ticket, DPS and the Texas Department of Transportation are urging motorists to buckle up or face a fine. Law enforcement officers throughout Texas are focusing their efforts on enforcing the state's occupant protection laws for adults and children.

Another nationwide effort designed to reduce fatalities is the C.A.R.E. - Combined Accident Reduction Effort - program. State police across the nation participate in C.A.R.E., maximizing enforcement on major interstate highways to reduce fatalities commonly associated with holiday weekends.

Statistically, the most deadly time on the road during Memorial Day weekend is between 9 p.m. and 6 a.m.-a time frame when alcohol and fatigue often are cited as factors.

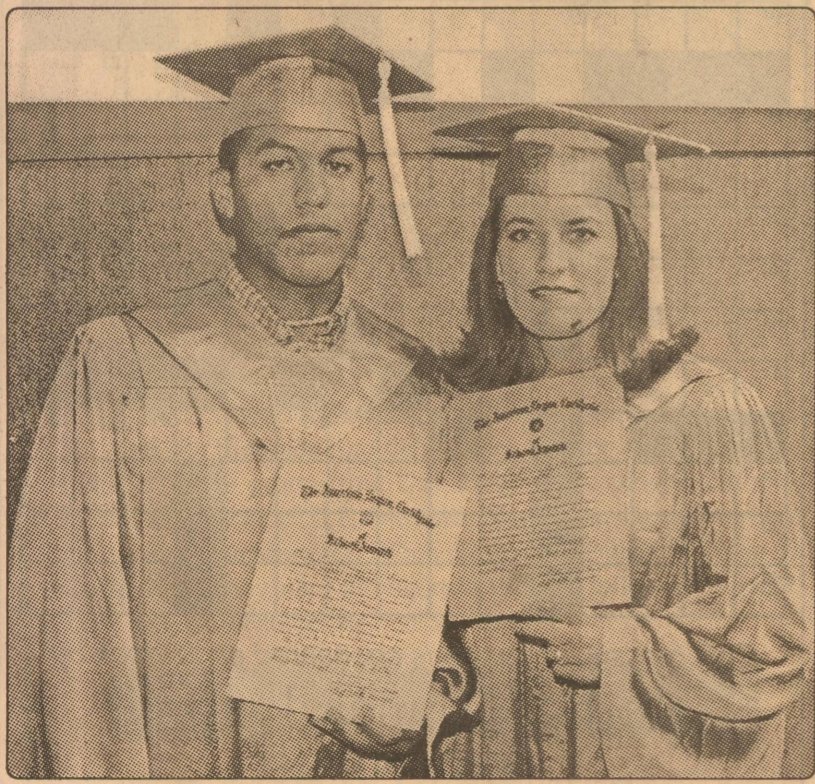
EHS commencement exercise slated for Friday evening

Ten year pins went to Thomas Gray and Marilyn Whitten.

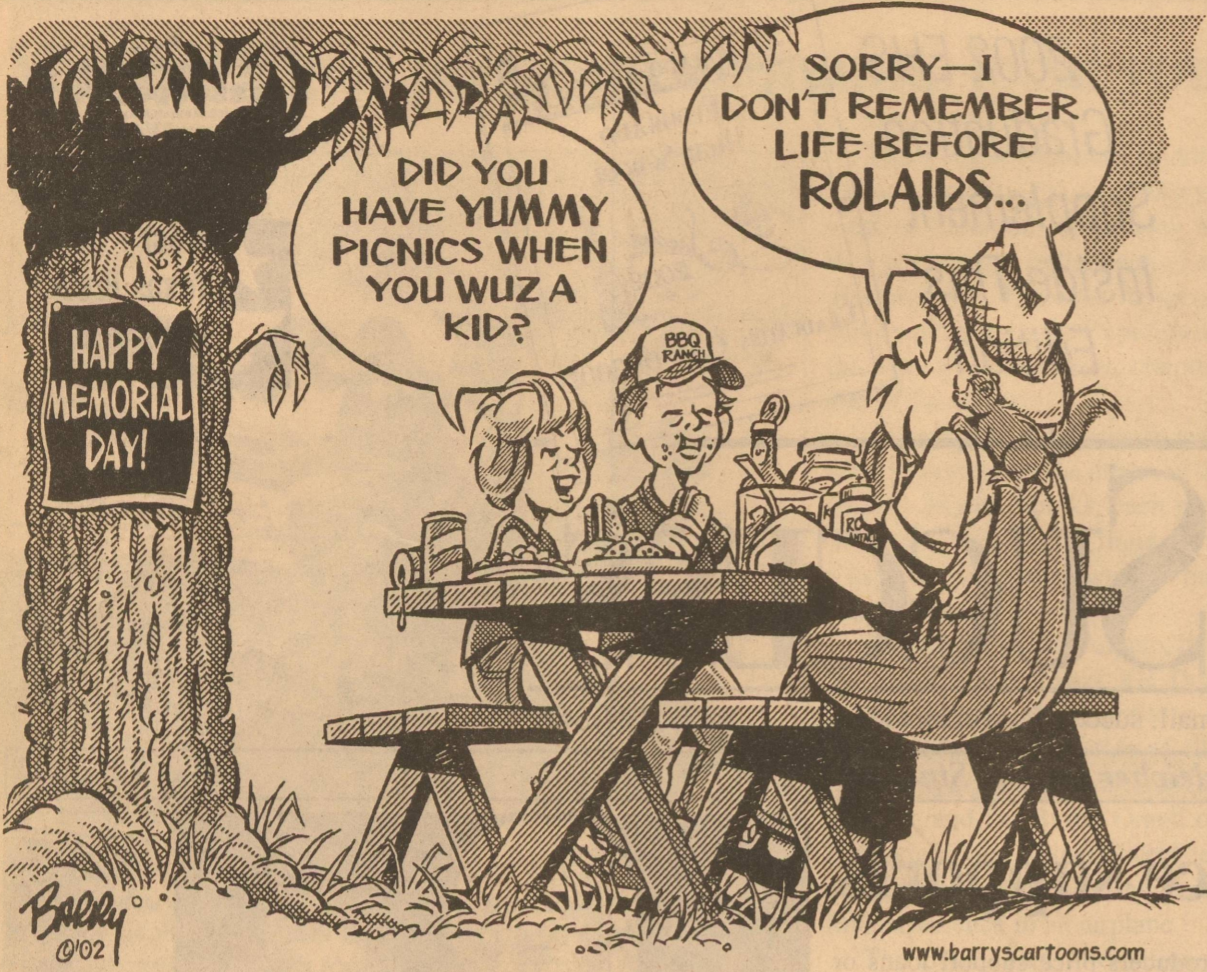
Yolanda Adame, Nell Edmiston, John Kotsch, Chris McCravey and Don Richters each received 15 year service pins.

Twenty year pins were given to Margaret Gutierrez, Andy Martinez and Betsy Thackerson.

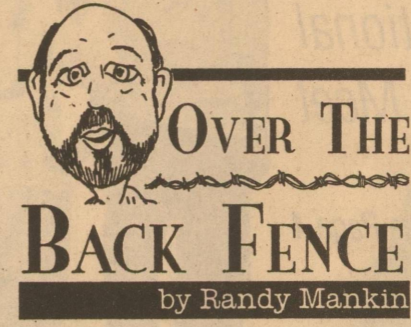

Farm bill restores mohair price supports

President Bush got up with the chickens last week to sign a federal farm bill that could mean \$190 billion during the next decade for Americans who make their living providing the food that goes on our table.

Bush turned the bill into law at 7:45 a.m. on May 13 in time to make the early morning agricultural news programs on radio and TV stations in rural areas across the nation.

The bill will have a tremendous impact on Texas, especially West Texas. For one thing, it provides direct checks to peanut farmers. Secondly — and huge news on the Edwards Plateau — it restores price supports for wool and mohair.

That longtime economic mainstay to Texas' sheep country had been removed several years ago.

Exceeding current programs by \$83 billion, the new bill raises by

two-thirds the government subsidy for large-scale corn, cotton, rice and wheat farmers. The last three of those commodities are big crops in Texas.

Education plan released

Democratic gubernatorial contender Tony Sanchez released his campaign set piece last week, a report called "Texas Education Beyond Tomorrow."

The plan calls for teacher pay hikes, a statewide pre-kindergarten program, reducing class size and flexible skills testing. All of it could be done over the next four to eight years, he said, without raising taxes.

Of particular interest to anyone with children in public elementa-

ry schools is a segment of the plan calling for a pilot program allowing third-graders to take the Texas Assessment of Knowledge and Skills when their teachers think they are ready, not at one time.

The state's two largest education groups, the Texas Federation of Teachers and the Texas State Teacher's Association have already endorsed Sanchez.

Republican Gov. Rick Perry's campaign said the Sanchez education plan was a budget buster that could cost \$5 billion and lead to cuts in health care.

Tony the tiger

The gubernatorial election is still more than five months away, but like the weather, it's heating up. Sanchez' campaign has been running negative TV spots with this refrain: "We didn't elect him, we don't have to keep him."

That refers, of course, to the fact that Perry assumed the office with Bush's election.

Given that tone this early in the campaign, no telling what will be on the air this fall.

Another kind of storm

Speaking of this fall, the National Weather Service says Texas' coast could be in for a big blow a few months from now.

Water temperature in the Gulf of Mexico is higher than normal, not a good sign. Hurricanes thrive on warm water. Last year, more than half of the Gulf stayed below 80 degrees, the mark considered the threshold for storm development.

Already this year, most of the Gulf is above 80 degrees. The water temperature at Corpus Christi last week hit 83 degrees.

"That makes me nervous," one meteorologist said last week. "The Gulf of Mexico is really, really hot."

The last significant hurricane to strike the Texas coast was Gilbert in 1988.

Pete Terry's Big Rocking Chair

Pete Terry lives at Ponta (PONTAY), a small community in Cherokee county, just up the road from Rusk. He has worked with wood since he was in high school.

"I dated a girl whose father was a really good carpenter," says Pete. I hung around him and learned a lot. He had a little shop and taught me about tools. Then I started getting my own just here and there. Along the way, I acquired a love for woodworking."

He makes all kinds of things. One of his specialties is ball point pens made of East Texas woods. He makes cages for laboratory rats. He makes tables and cabinets and fine furniture.

One thing he made is truly unique. "I made a ten-foot rocking chair. Ten feet tall, seven feet wide. I made it out of solid cedar."

The chair sits in a field near his home. "There's a man who lives not too far from here who has a sawmill. I had some cedar logs and I needed them sawed up and he needed a ten-foot rocking chair. So we did some swapping-out."

"The sawmill's wife wanted that big chair to sit by her swimming pool. So she got her chair and I got some sawed-up cedar."

Pete says when the man came over to get the chair, he loaded it onto a big flat bed truck. "It looked

neat and turned a lot of heads. People just stopped in their tracks to see that big chair going down the road."

Pete's wife thought that big chair was just wonderful, so Pete made her one. That's the one by Pete's house. The chair is gigantic. It's one story tall and has enough lumber in it to build a small house.

"I just tried to make it as I pictured a chair from my childhood. It was at my grandfather's house. After I built the big chair, I was over at my mother's house one day and saw that actual chair. The big one turned out to look just like my grandfather's chair, only bigger."

People driving by notice that chair. "Yeah, all the time. I have people stopping by to take pictures. There was a group of college students, maybe fifteen or so, and they all got on it at one time and had their picture made."

I asked Pete if the chair actually rocks. "I wouldn't advise it. Those college kids got scared when it went to rocking."

He puts lights on the chair at Christmas time. "I've thought about building a night stand with a lamp next to the chair. I'd turn on the lamp at night."

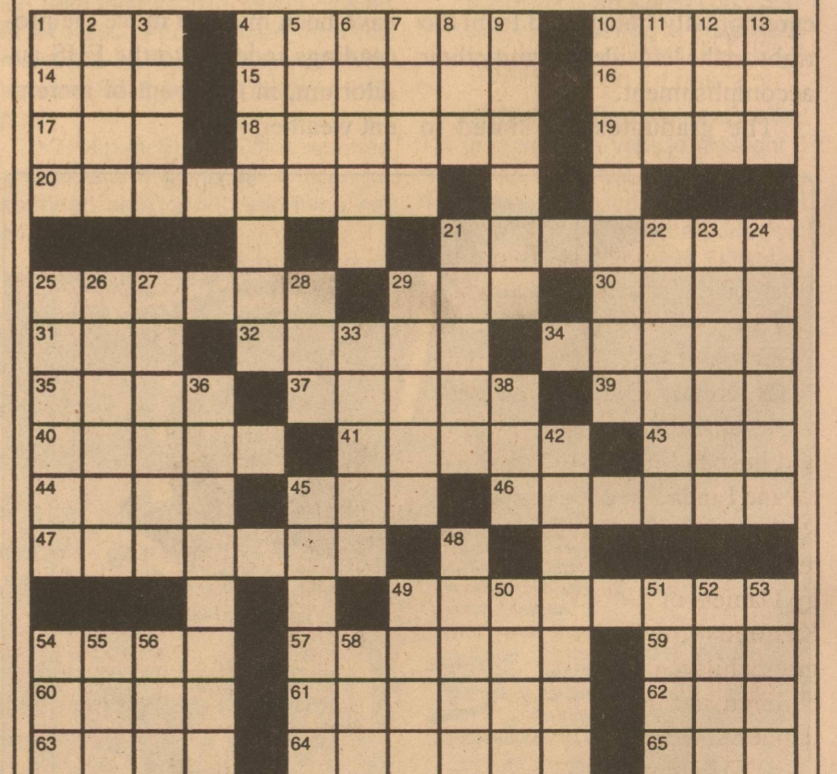

years serving as lineman, line superintendent and manager.

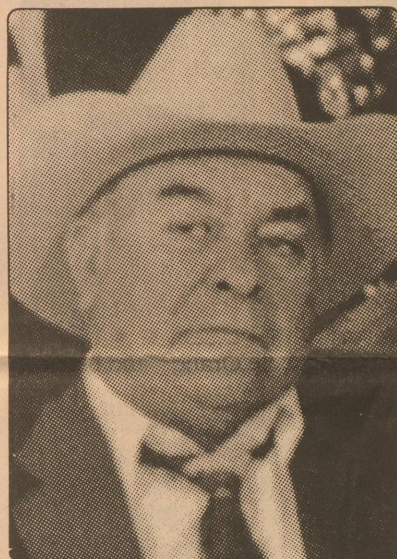

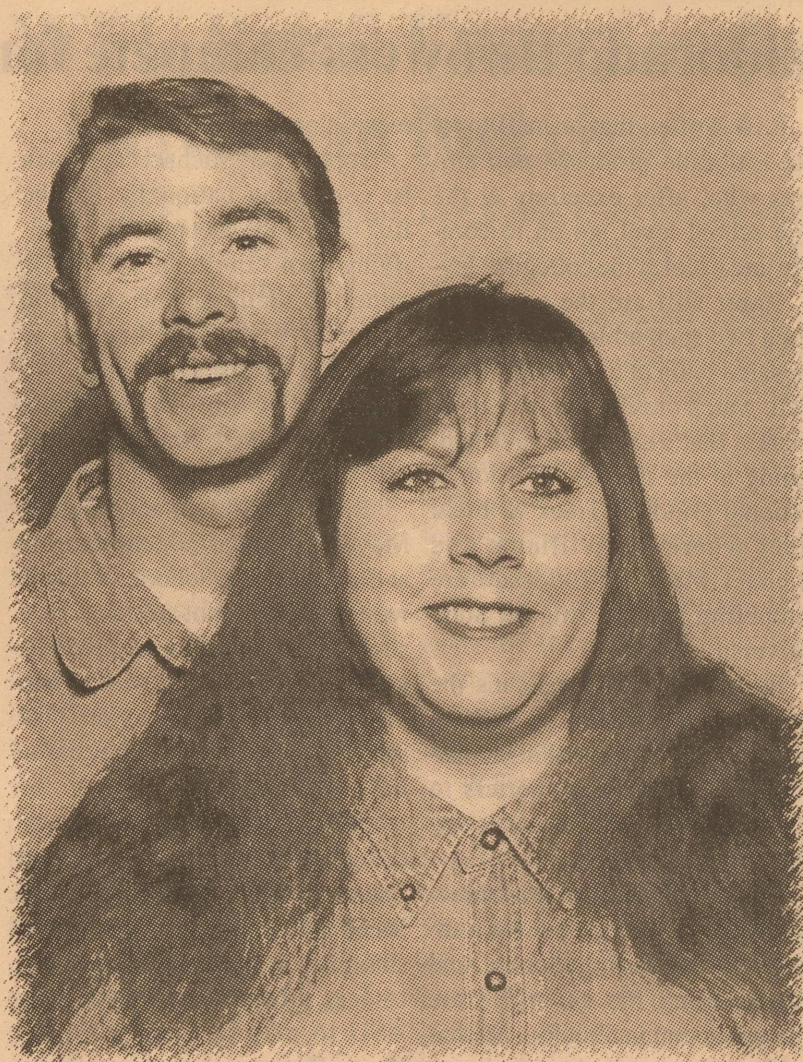
She was preceded in death by her parents, Dudley Barton and Lillian Davis; her husband, Billy Daniels; and by one son, Stephen.

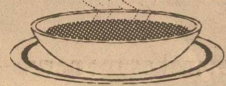

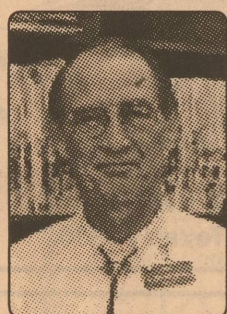

Eldorado throwers compete for ASU in NCAA National Meet

It isn't often that a small town like Eldorado produces two athletes who, after excelling at the high school level, go on to compete and excel at the collegiate level. Rarer still are the occasions when two such athletes end up on the same team at a national event. Well, watch closely this weekend, because that's exactly what's happening at the NCAA Division II National Outdoor Track & Field Meet where Ty Williams and Michael Mayo of Eldorado are competing for the Angelo State University Rams.

Fortunately for local fans the meet is being hosted by ASU, a mere 45 miles away, making it possible for Eldorado supporters to watch the two former Eagles compete in the same meet.

It won't be the first time, however. When Ty Williams was a senior at Eldorado High School, and was stalking his second State Championship in Shot Put, Michael Mayo came on the team as a freshman. It was then that the two first practiced together, "throwing" the discus and "putting" the shot. And, it was then that they first competed on the same team.

Things are slightly different now. First of all, everything is heavier. A high school shot tips the scales at 12 lbs. while a college shot weighs in at 16 lbs. But strength training has allowed the two Eagles turned Rams to keep pace.

In fact, Ty Williams won the Shot Put event at the National Meet in 1999. This year, as a graduating senior, he will be competing in both the discus and the shot, having qualified with 168' 9" in the discus and 56' 8" in the shot. Only 16 competitors qualified for the

meet in each of the events. Sophomore Michael Mayo will be competing nationally for the first time in the shot put, after qualifying with a throw of 55' 1". He hopes to maintain the tradition started by Williams and qualify in both shot and discus the next two years, and possibly in the javelin where he placed 4th at the Lone Star Conference Meet this year.

Both Ty Williams and Michael Mayo had stellar athletic careers at Eldorado High School. Williams won the State shot put title as a sophomore then came back after a knee injury his junior year to win the event again as a senior. That same knee injury ended a promising football career.

Meanwhile, Mayo not only excelled in shot and discus, an event that carried him to the State Track Meet his senior year, he was a standout on the basketball court. In fact, Mayo was recruited by ASU to play basketball for the Rams. He gave up the sport, however, to pursue his track career.

There will be 620 competitors in all at the National Meet, scattered across 21 men's events and the 22 women's events. Interestingly, of the 21 ASU athletes who qualified for the National Meet, 7 are throwers and...two of them are from Eldorado!

The NCAA Division II Outdoor National Track & Field Meet gets underway today at ASU. The action will continue through Saturday.

Things like this don't happen very often, so don't miss this chance to see a bit of Eldorado history play out in San Angelo. After all, it is likely to be a long, long time before it happens again. Good luck, Ty and Michael!

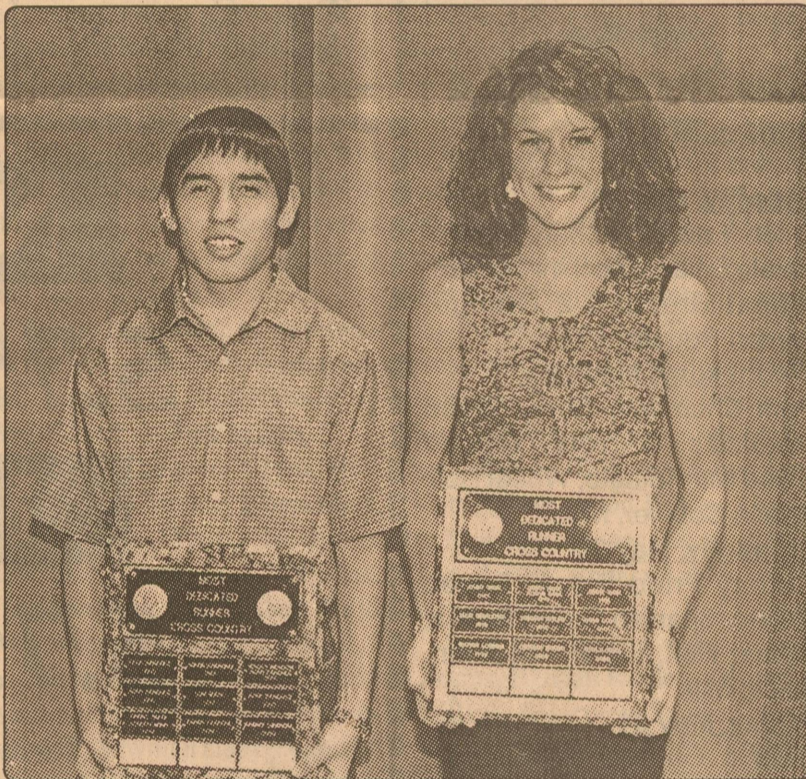

WTU Retail Energy seeks increase in fuel charge

ABILENE — WTU Retail Energy has filed a request with Public Utility Commission of Texas (PUCT) to adjust the fuel portion of electricity prices for its residential and small business "Price to Beat" customers to reflect significant increases in natural gas prices. The earliest the new prices could go into effect would be June 28.

For a typical residential customer using 1,000 kilowatt hour a month, the current average price is 8.796 cents per kwh. With the fuel adjustment, the average price will be 9.648 cents per kwh, increasing the total monthly bill for that typical residential customer by approximately \$8.52 per month. Despite the increase, that typical residential customer bill will still be approximately \$2.42 a month lower than last year.

The Texas Electric Choice Act, which established retail competition in Texas, required that affiliate retail electric providers, including WTU Retail Energy, reduce prices for residential and small commercial customers by 6 percent below the rates charged in December 1999 after an adjustment for the price of fuel used to generate electricity. This reduced price became known as the "Price to Beat", adjustable twice a year for significant increases in the price of natural gas and purchased power.

The company notes that since its Price to Beat was established last year, the market price of natural gas has increased over 22 per-

cent as reflected by the New York Mercantile Exchange natural gas prices.

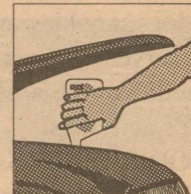
The company further explained that programs are available to help mitigate the impact of higher bills for customers who qualify. Low-income customers may qualify for a discount on their electric bills through a new state-administered energy assistance program called LITE UP Texas. In addition, balanced billing is available to help even out monthly payments, which can spike as a result of higher summer electric usage.

WTU Retail energy provides electric service to residential and small commercial Price to Beat customers and is affiliated with West Texas Utilities, a subsidiary of American electric Power (NYSE: AEP). With the introduction of electricity deregulation in January, customers of AEP-West Texas Utilities who did not select another energy provider became customers of WTU Retail Energy.

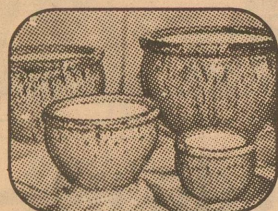

PUBLIC NOTICE OF APPLICATION TO ESTABLISH RATES

Pursuant to Section 104.103 of the Texas Utilities Code, TXU Lone Star Pipeline (TXU LSP), a division of TXU Gas Company, hereby gives notice of intent to establish a supplemental firm transportation rate and an interruptible transportation rate designed to recover the costs of constructing and operating a 76.5-mile, 24-inch pipeline extending from the Bridgeport area in Wise County to the junction of Lines W and W7 in Denton County and then in an easterly direction to the junction of Lines D 17-9 and D9 in Collin County, hereinafter called the "Northside Project." The supplemental firm rate and interruptible rate are proposed to be charged upon the initiation of service on the Northside Project. The proposed supplemental firm rate constitutes a major change and will result in an annual increase in the revenues of TXU LSP of approximately \$9.8 million. These revenues will represent an 8% increase in the total revenues of TXU LSP.

The proposed supplemental firm transportation rate will be applicable to all firm transportation customers contracting for capacity on the Northside Project. The only current customer directly affected by the supplemental firm transportation rate will be TXU Gas Distribution. No other customer has agreed to contract for firm capacity on the Northside Project. The supplemental firm rate may, however, indirectly affect all residential and commercial customers served by TXU Gas Distribution in the state of Texas. The supplemental firm rate will be assessed to TXU Gas Distribution for its contracted capacity on the Northside Project in addition to the city gate rate approved in the Railroad Commission of Texas (Commission) Gas Utilities Docket (GUD) No. 8976. The supplemental firm rate may then be passed on to TXU Gas Distribution's residential and commercial customers. If any other transportation customers contract for firm capacity on the Northside Project, those customers may also pay the supplemental firm transportation rate in addition to any other applicable rates charged such customers.

TXU LSP also proposes an interruptible transportation rate for the use of the Northside Project. To the extent that shippers other than firm transportation customers use the Northside Project, they will be charged this interruptible rate. TXU LSP proposes to reduce the proposed supplemental firm transportation rate charged to firm customers on the Northside Project through an annual revenue crediting mechanism based on revenues from the interruptible rate approved in this proceeding.

Construction of the Northside Project is estimated to be completed in approximately 23 months after approval of this rate application. The proposed supplemental firm rate and interruptible rate will be effective on June 4, 2002, but will not be charged until the initiation of service on the Northside Project and will be charged for an initial seven year period. TXU LSP further proposes to reconcile the projected capital costs with those actually incurred and to adjust the supplemental firm transportation rate and interruptible transportation rate accordingly.

A Statement of Intent to make such change has been filed with the Commission in GUD Docket No. 9292 and is available for inspection at the Commission's office at 1701 North Congress, Austin, Texas, and at the offices of TXU LSP at 301 South Harwood, Dallas, Texas. Copies of the Statement of Intent have also been sent to the appropriate city official of each incorporated city served by TXU Gas Distribution. Any affected person may file written comments or a protest concerning the proposed changes in the rates with the Docket Services Section of the Office of General Counsel, Railroad Commission of Texas, P.O. Box 12967, Austin, Texas 78711-2967, at any time on or before June 17, 2002. Any person or agency that has a justiciable or administratively cognizable interest in this proceeding who desires to be designated as a party may petition for leave to intervene and request to become a party to this proceeding. The final date for intervention in this case shall be June 17, 2002.

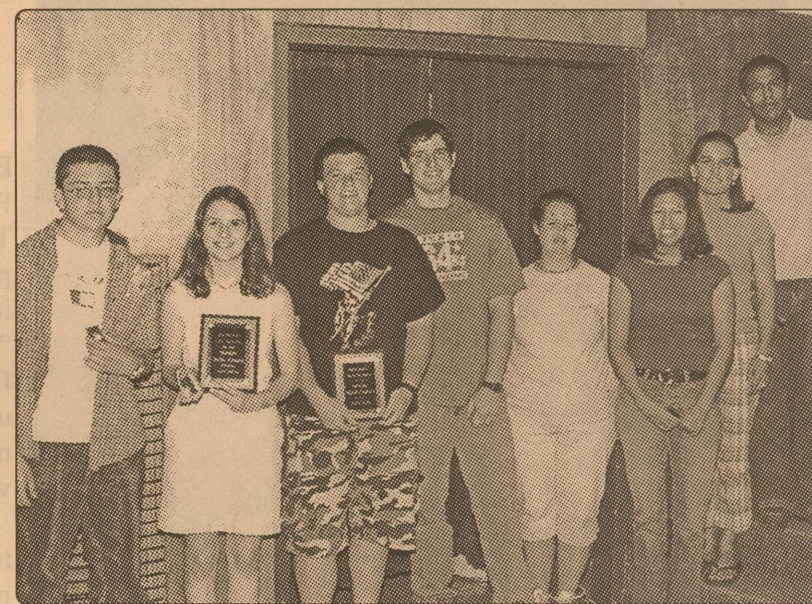

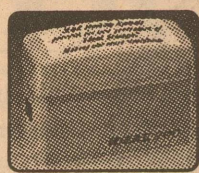

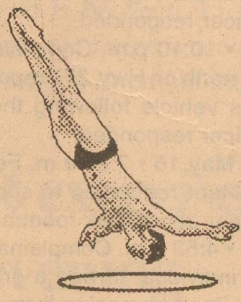

Science teacher Sharon Spinks want to thank these men for their time and expense they incurred showing these students the joy of flight.

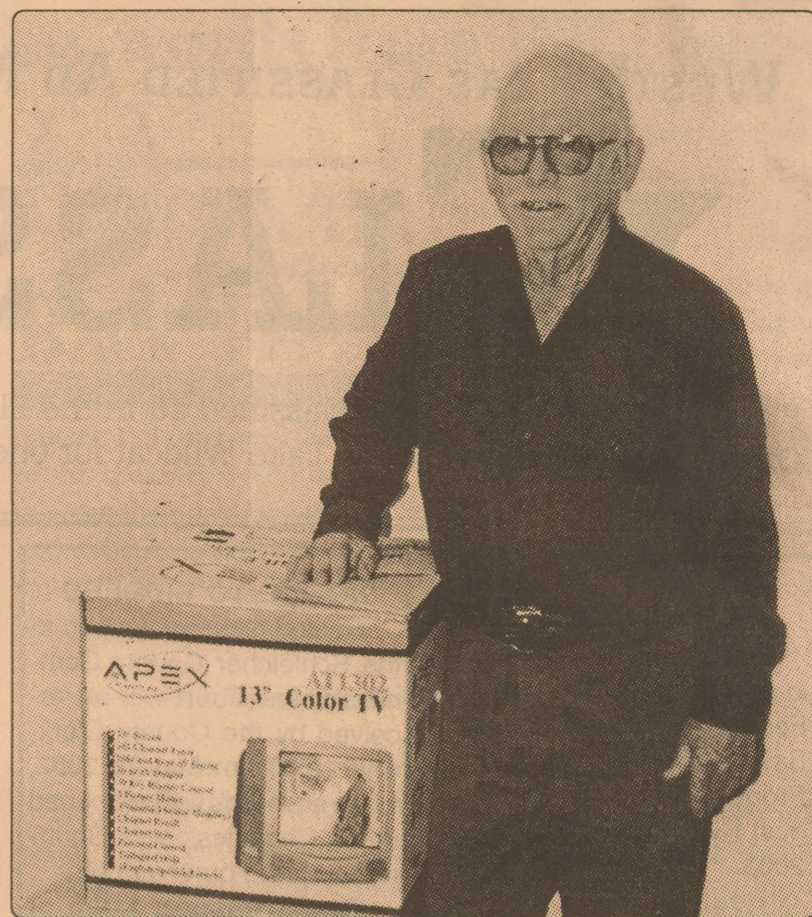

plan and operate based on market realities, not government dictates."

The new bill, which must be renewed after six years, replaces the yearly assistance Congress has approved since farm prices languished following passage of the 1996 act. Bob Stallman, president of the American Farm Bureau Federation, said the new law "assures farmers and our lenders that we will have an adequate safety net in place and prevent the need to rely on emergency assistance in the future."

Local reaction to the bill has been cautiously favorable. "We'll have to wait and see how the rules are written and how the program is implemented," said rancher Matt Brown. "We didn't get everything we wanted but it's definitely better than nothing."

Farmer and rancher Ricky Fuessel echoed the sentiment, "I think it's a good deal. Not only does it help agriculture, but indirectly it supports the local economy by helping the businesses that depend on agriculture," Fuessel said. "Now if we can just get some rain."
