#### A SERIOUS ACCIDENT

George Richardson, one of Angelo's veteran sheepmen and wool commission merchants, met with a serious accident at 5 o'clock last Wednesday morning and narrowly escaped death. He is able to be at his office with his head bandaged up. Mr. Richardson and Loftin Henderson left here Wednesday morning in an automobile for J. E. Henderson Kiekapoo ranch, arriving there about noon. Shortly after dinner they hitched up a double team to a buggy and went into the Chambers pasture, adjoining, to look at some of Mr. Henderson's sheep. All went well until they started to descend a long hill, when one of the horses went on one side of a cactus and the other on the opposite side and thus separating the buckle by which the check rein or short line is fastened to the main line slipped thru the ring on the harness saddle, and control of the team was lost immediately. The horses bolted and made a quick turn, throwing the occupants of the buggy to the ground with terrific force. Mr. Richardson landed on his head, and the scap on the whole right side was badly cut by the sharp rocks and he sustained severe bruises on his body and face. Mr. Henderson escaped with only a few scratches, and he ran down the hill after the team.

He caught the horses after they had become tangled up round a mosquito tree, and as the outfit was little damaged he up around a mosquito tree, and as quickly as possible, helped Mr. Richardson in the buggy and drove back to the Henderson ranch, where the two got their auto and came back to Angelo, arriving here at midnight. A physician was called at once to dress Mr. Richardson's wounds. This is the third accident with which Mr. Henderson has met in the past few months, and he is now recovering.

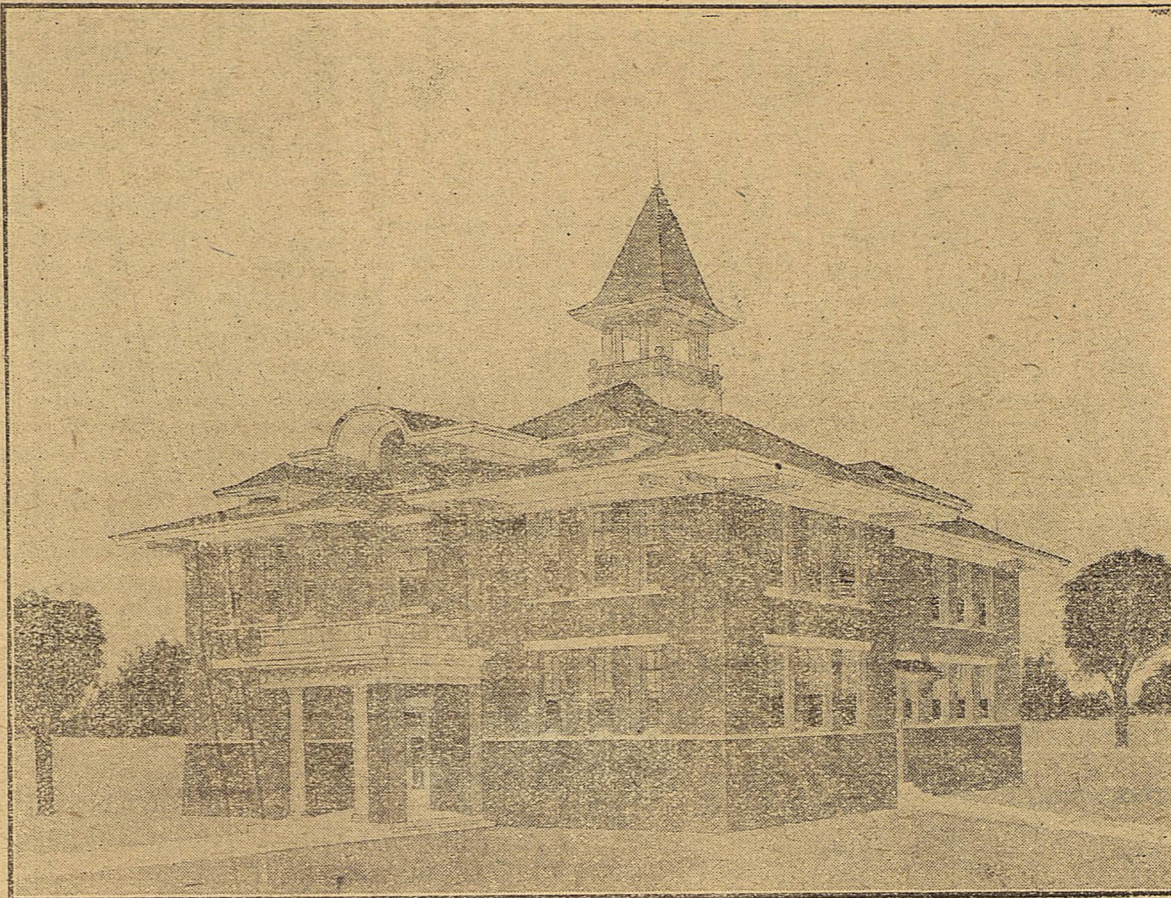

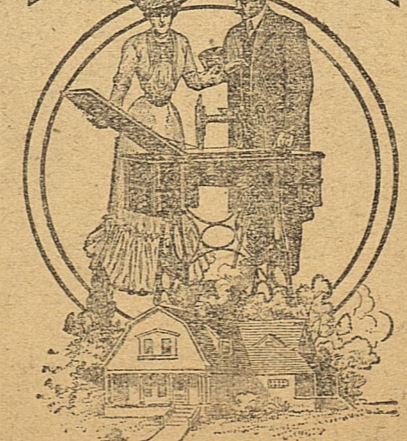
