
#### Edmiston's meat goat "Marfa" crowned **Grand Champion at**







#### Central Texas group pushing upgrade of U.S. 190 to 4 lanes

The prospect of an upgrade of U.S. 277 to a four-lane highway is already looming in Eldorado's future. Now, comes word that U.S. 190 is also a candidate for upgrade to four-lane status. A coalition, calling itself the Gulf Coast Strategic Highway Coalition, which includes several cities and counties along U.S. 190, and with the apparent support of the U.S. De-







#### Woolen Mill's facelift helps preserve local landmark



#### First-ever Tagoo calling honors man who discovered bird in 1959

Some say he dreamed it all up, others claim he never saw one at all, but Claude Spencer has been adamant about the issue since 1959. That's when he says he spotted a Tagoo bird in Eldorado.

What's a Tagoo? Well it's a bird that looks sort of like a woodpecker, but not really. Some claim it more closely resembles a roadrunner, except it's more colorful and slightly faster. Still others suggest that it appears more like a cross between a tufted titmouse and a barn owl.

It's all speculation, however, since Claude Oran Spencer of Eldorado is the only human ever to have seen one of the elusive birds. He was on hand Saturday for the formal dedication of the Tagoo Bird Refuge and Sanctuary, and he shared his observations with the assembled crowd.
