
The Commissioners approved the purchase of a new Facit typewriter for the county clerk's office at a cost of \$820.





# **Oil Industry Cites Top Stories Of The Year**

The top stories in 1980 were the Windfall Profits Oil Excise Tax, the treinendous surge in drilling activity and the national elec-tion. The Windfall Profits Oil Excise Tax, proposed in the Spring of 1979, because law early in 1980. Major oil companies and royalty owners taxed the most while independents were taxed at a lower rate. 




