

# Gas rates upped on a monthly basis

An increase in the gas rate to \$5.50 MCF was approved by the Eldorado City Council last Wednesday night. The rate hike was due to the cost of gas purchased from Producer's Gas. The City had been purchasing its gas from Cities Service for \$1.88 per MCF on the average but due to Cities Service's inability to meet the City's gas demand they have begun purchasing the City's gas supply from Producer's Gas at a cost of \$3.70 MCF. An average loss of 40 percent due to leaks, etc. has been lowered to 27 percent and is continuing a downward trend. The Council voted to re-evaluate the new rate before next month's billing whenever new purchase figures are obtained.

Bids were reviewed for the trenching of water and gas lines in Christian Addition. The contract was awarded to Henkels and McCoy whose bid was \$3.00 per foot and \$75 per hour downtime. The other bid submitted was from Scott Thane Ditching at \$4.50 per foot and \$125 per hour downtime. The Council voted to award the contract to the firm in an emergency measure due to the necessity of having gas and water lines installed before the C.D.B.G. contractor can start sewer line installation. Work is scheduled to begin on the 20th with the City crews clearing the right of ways.

The C.D.B.G. project was updated in a report submitted by City Secretary

Carolyn Mayo and the Outside Superintendent. They reported that the payment had been made to Joe Christian and LaVita Brooks for the 19.507 acres in the Christian Addition and the deed filed. Also a letter from the railroad stipulating sales price was reviewed.

Superintendent Whitten reported that Marvin McAngus had agreed to work for the City in the capacity of resident inspector for the C.D.B.G. and Wastewater Project for an hourly basis for \$10.00 per hour as necessary.

The City Secretary was instructed to consult with the City of Sonora regarding their policies on charges for admittance to the landfill. The

Council also gave its approval to order twelve additional large dumpsters from Emco with payment to be made from Revenue Sharing. Those dumpsters will be obtained via the City of Ballinger who is considering the new system and the dumpsters will be shipped to Ballinger and picked up by the City of Eldorado in Ballinger.

Bill Radle requested and received \$150 to attend the A&M Training School.

Juan Arispe Sr. was hired by the City to read all City meters at 15 cents per meter as he had previously done in the past.

Thank you notes from Wilma Topliffe were read and appreciated by the Council.

In other business the Council initialed the tax report for the month of December 1983. They agreed to terminate the employment of a City worker who had not reported for work in three days. The Council voted to make their first semi-Annual payment to the Schleicher County Appraisal District. Bills were reviewed and approved for payment with one exception. The minutes were also read and approved.

# Local college courses still a possibility

The possibility of college courses being offered in Sonora was the topic of discussion of the members of the Continuing Education Committee last Wednesday. Members of the committee included Smith Neal, Jr. High Principal of Sonora Independent School District; W.A. McAndrew, Supt. of Sonora I.S.D., Gus Allen and Carol Jones.

Special guests included Senator Bill Sims, who has expressed much interest in seeing Sonora participate in the college courses and Bill Askins, ED.P. professor and Associate Dean of the College of Education at Texas Tech University. Also on hand for the meeting at the Adm. Bldg. was Ted Cotton, Assistant Superintendent of Ozona I.S.D. and Jackie Pederson, associated with Texas Tech's computer program.

Askins stated that extension courses would yield college credit for up to six hours of graduate level work but could not be specific about undergraduate level work. He advised the group he would consult with Dr. Michael Mezack, Director of Continuing Education at Texas Tech concerning this matter and would report his

findings.

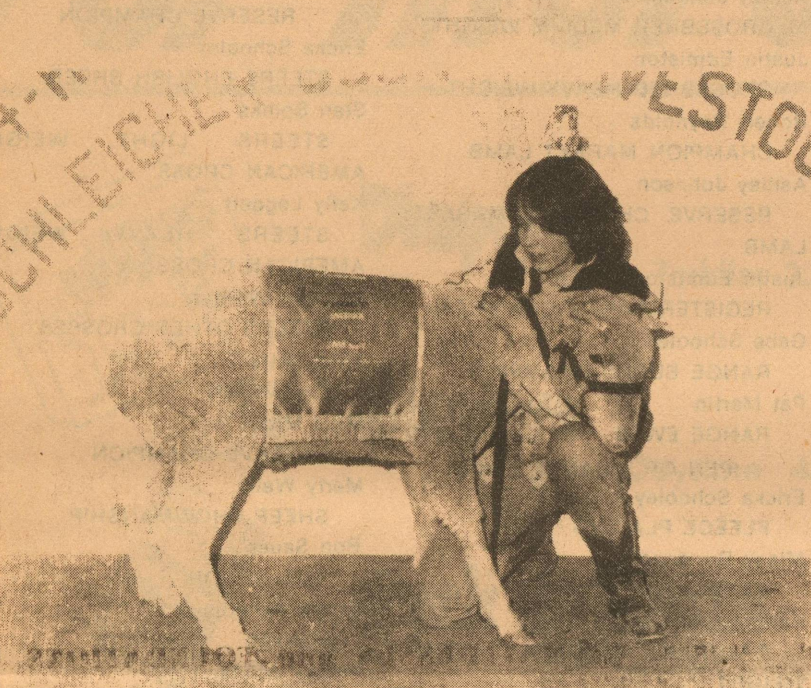
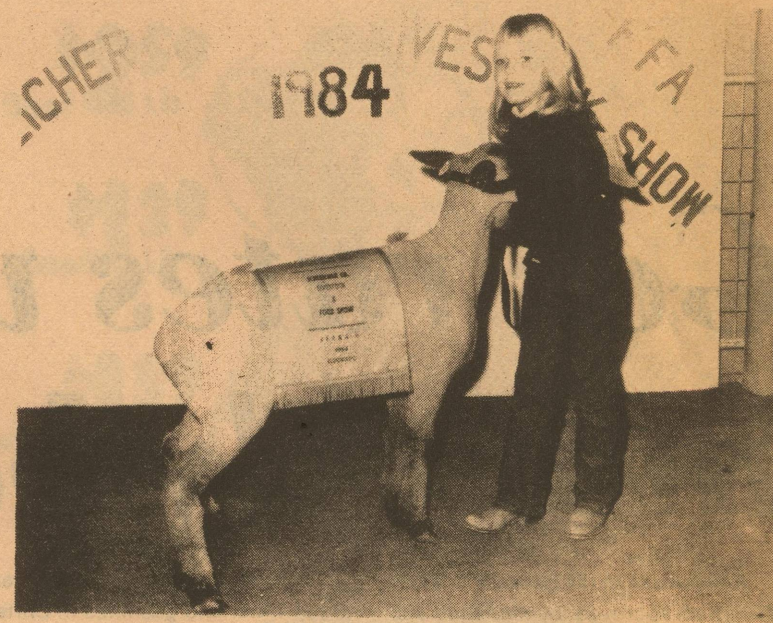
Resident off-campus courses would, although, give credits for all courses at both levels. The extension program would benefit persons interested in self-improvement courses and the off-campus resident courses could benefit the person seeking a degree.

Interest in the courses has been impressive. One hundred fifty replies have been received during the recent survey. The most interest was expressed in business courses, in computer science and Spanish language courses.

Askins stressed the fact that English Second Language was one of the courses that would be available and all teachers must have E.L.S. to be able to teach.

According to Askins, courses would cost approximately \$90 per student based on a 15 student classroom plus textbooks and materials. He also advised the group that he would be back January 31st to answer any more questions and to provide more information to the committee and to interested citizens.

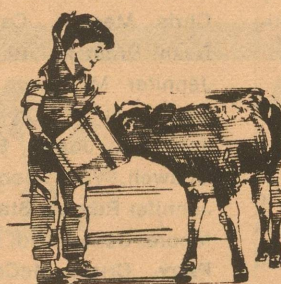

# Butter and Cheese

Commodity Butter and Cheese will be distributed on Wednesday Jan. 25, at the Memorial Building from 2 pm - 5 pm. New income guidelines have been set to determine eligibility for receiving this food. The income guidelines are as follows:

Persons who receive foodstamps, AFDC, SSI, or Medicaid (non-institutional) are automatically eligible to receive donated foods.

Persons may receive food only once a month. To receive the food you must bring some form of identification with you. This might be a drivers license, Food Stamp ID, Medicaid Card, AFDC Eligibility Letter, SSI Award Letter, Social Security Card or other.

## PUBLIC NOTICE

In proceedings pending before the Public Utility Commission of Texas (PUC), local exchange telephone companies are requesting authority to charge AT&T Communications of the Southwest, Inc., for use of their facilities. These proposed charges are higher than AT&T Communications can pay at current Texas long distance rate levels. To position itself to be able to implement rates that are sufficient to produce revenues that will recover the costs facing the company, AT&T Communications must now file for rate relief to be able to implement rates that reflect the costs of access that are ultimately imposed on the company.

While AT&T Communications does not want to increase its Texas rates, an increase would be required to recover the increased access charges AT&T Communications will have to pay to the local exchange telephone companies under several proposals pending before the Commission. These access charges at the proposed increased levels represent more than 80 percent of AT&T Communications' operating expense in Texas.

Accordingly, AT&T Communications, in accordance with the Public Utility Regulatory Act and the rules of the PUC, hereby gives notice of the company's intent to implement a new schedule of rates for long distance calls within Texas. The proposed rates will be effective January 28, 1984, unless otherwise determined by the Commission. All customers and classes of customers would be affected by AT&T Communications' proposed rates.

If higher access charges are ordered, AT&T Communications has no recourse but to pay these charges and recover the costs from its customers as a cost of providing long distance service within Texas. AT&T Communications has filed rates which would mean a maximum overall increase in adjusted test period revenues of \$301.4 million, or 27.85 percent. This amount would help recover cost increases due to the proposed level of access charges now pending before the PUC.

A complete copy of all tariffs and rate schedules is on file with the Texas Public Utility Commission at Austin, Texas, and with every municipality in Texas.
