

Councilmen okay '83 - '84 budget

Monday night Eldorado City Fathers approved a \$978,000 budget for the upcoming year, this figure falls short of last year's municipal budget by just over \$50,000. The Trash Budget has intended expenditures and revenues of \$77,200 this year as opposed to last year's figure of \$80,650. The Utility Fund which is set up for approximately \$707,000 is also down compared to last year's which rang in at \$753,000. A decline of \$1400 is also present in the General Fund when compared to last year's figures.

The City Council placed the new tax rate at \$.48 per \$100 valuation on a motion from Ronnie Sauer with a second from Edwin Jackson, Jr.

Ray Lewis Ballew, the Chief Tax Assessor for the local taxing district was on hand at the Council meeting and informed those present that if so elected the City Council has the ability to attach an additional 15 percent on top of the uncollected delinquent taxes for fees to have a delinquent tax attorney to attempt to regain some of the lost revenues which are found in delinquent taxes. No action was taken on this particular matter and it was tabled for discussion later.

Federal Revenue Sharing monies was the next topic discussed by the Council and they elected to spend the \$12,000 on health services in the community.

The auditing firm of Everett, Ingram, Overman and Tinkler was selected by the Council to prepare an uncertified audit of the City's books. This decision came after the Council was informed that for a complete audit an additional \$1,000 would be necessary in the firm's fee.

The next topic discussed by the Council was the land fill and trash department. It was learned during this segment of the meeting that the land fill had a life expectancy of 5 years and had been prepared in mutual agreement with the county for a \$4500 - \$2200 split. No changes in the policies of the land fill or the trash department were forthcoming.

The Council then gave it's attention to the WTU rate increase and after some discussion they elected not to contest WTU's sought after rate hike.

City Secretary Carolyn Mayo informed the City Fathers of changes at hand of the Texas Municipal League Workman's Compensation. The City Fathers learned that the company providing the coverage to the City as well as the Municipal League was being changed but the effect locally would be nil. At this time Mrs. Mayo informed the Council of the progress concerning the Community Development Block Grant and the sewer bond project. The Council then approved an easement for a sewer lift station in

the Willeke Development.

All Councilmen were present with the exception of Gus Willeke.

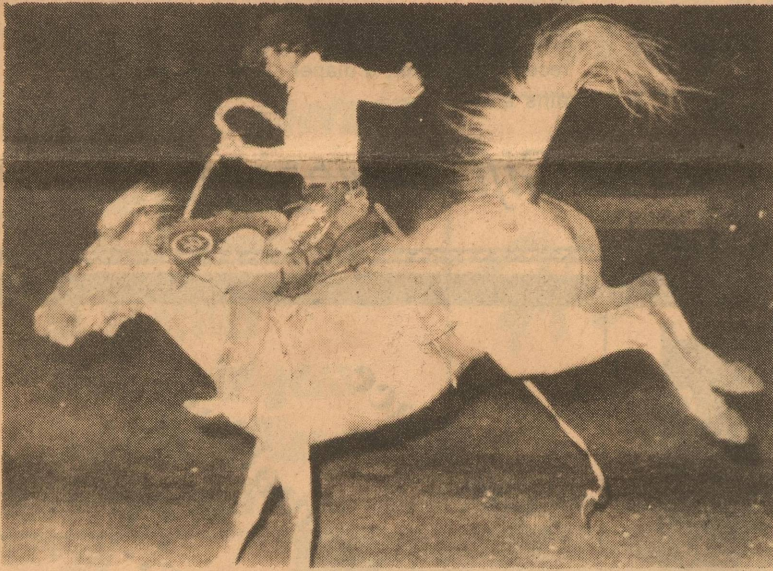
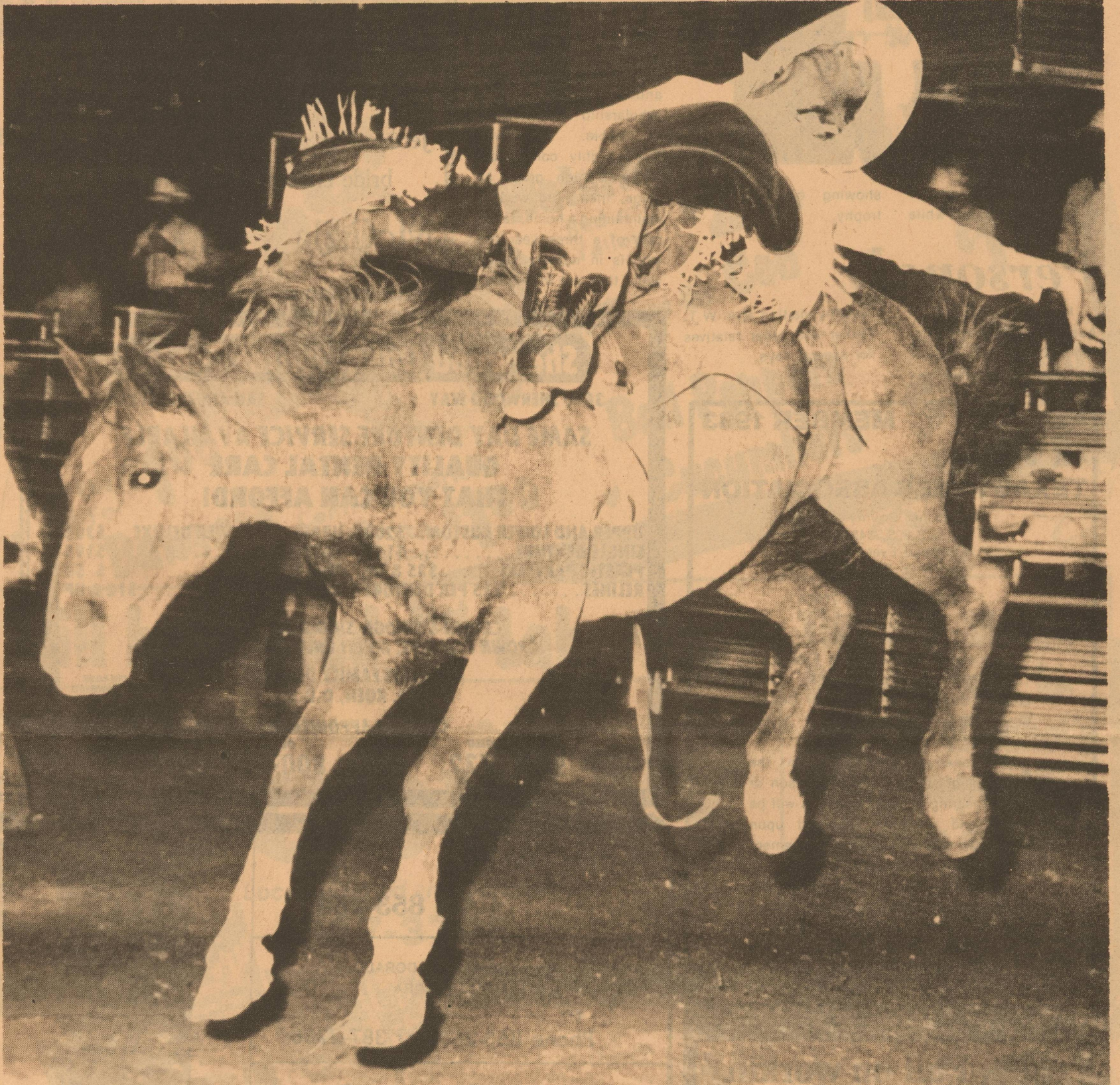
The Council then retired into Executive Session to discuss personnel.

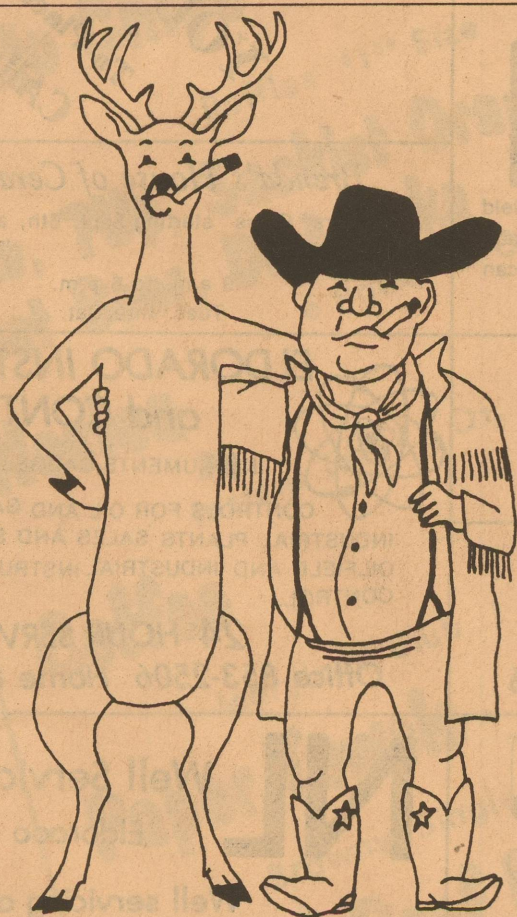

This Monday is Labor Day and some area offices will be closed in observance of the holiday. All schools will be closed as will the bank, city offices and county offices and several local businesses.

Everyone is urged to take precautions over the holiday as the Texas Department of Public Safety has estimated as many as 51 persons will be killed in traffic accidents during the Labor Day holiday. The estimate includes traffic deaths which may occur on urban streets and rural highways.

Help at Last

During his speech Monday to the annual meeting of the West Texas Association of Soil and Water Conservation District Directors in San Angelo, Congressman Tom Loeffler announced that the United States Department of Agriculture has designated three more counties in West Texas in the federal disaster area.

Those counties are Schleicher, Reeves and Loving. Furthermore Congressman Loeffler announced that the Small Business Administration has informed him by letter that the Small Business Administration will designate as an economic injury disaster area all counties determined to be natural disaster areas by the U.S.D.A. This means that the small businesses in the now declared 23 West Texas counties could be eligible for economic injury disaster loans. These loans are available to small businesses unable to obtain credit in working capital from private sources. The loan can be equal to the amount of injury suffered during the drought. Loans are at 8 percent and the maximum amount available is \$500,000 per small business once the S.B.A. declaration becomes official. Small businesses can apply through the nearest S.B.A. office. S.B.A. office notification of intent regarding the pending declaration was in response to an August 3rd letter from Congressman Loeffler.

Said Congressman Loeffler of the announcement Monday, "This is further good news for those who have suffered economic and personal hardship due to this terrible drought.

However, I will continue to actively pursue all forms of federal relief which are available and will continue to work actively with the counties still awaiting a disaster declaration."

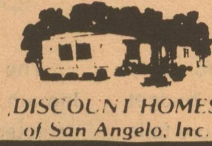

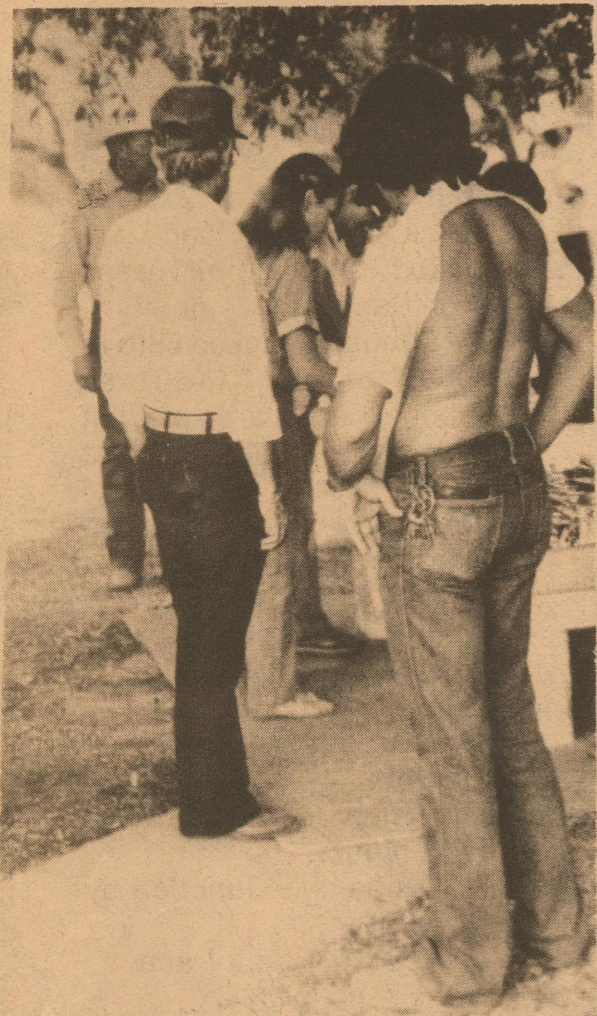
Mike and Sheila Prater have a new daughter, Kristina Jean. She was born August 16th and her weight was 6 lbs. 14 oz.

The Eldorado Eagles were home last week the 26th of August to take on the Punchers from Mason on the Eagles' field. The stands were packed with Eagle fans enjoying themselves, eating BBQ brisket, beans and there were smiles everywhere. Meanwhile out on the field the Eagles were giving the Punchers more than they could stand. The Eagle fans had two treats in one, a good taste of BBQ and a good look of what can be expected from the Eagles this coming season. Friday was the Eagles' second scrimmage of the 1983 season. Like all scrimmages it was for learning and this one was no different. The Eagles learned Friday that they can win.

The JV took the field first against the JV team from Mason. Last year the JV had an undefeated season, and they are very proud of that and this year they will try to repeat that record. The Eagles have shown signs of it in their last two scrimmage games. The Eagles scored three touchdowns and Mason scored one. The Eagles took over the ball first, while the Punchers went on defense. The Eagles had a good all-around attack on the ground and threw in the air. It did not take the Eagles long to find the end zone. From about the 5 or 6 yard line James Harlin who we call "Smurf" for his size, not because of his ability, took the ball in for the Eagle touchdown.

The Eagles had a strong running game with Steve Saldivar being the work horse. Talking to Steve, he was confident that they would beat Mason. He said, "the last game against Brady, I got a little tired, but against Mason I will be going full speed." When the Eagles went to the air they went on the arm of Eloy Martinez. Martinez threw the ball well and he also ran a 20 yard touchdown on a quarterback keeper. The Eagles' third score came on a long pass from Martinez to Turbeville. Jimmy Turbeville played a fine all around game, he also had two interceptions. Mason was able to surprise the Eagles on a long 50 yard run from scrimmage, in which they scored, but that was all the Punchers could muster. Talking to Ron Mittel before the game he felt that "we will have to use our speed and quickness." Mittel showed some of that quickness when rushing through the line to sack the quarterback for about a 25 yard loss. Troy Daniels put in a good defensive game also, he knew that "he would have to step in his gaps and stick somebody." 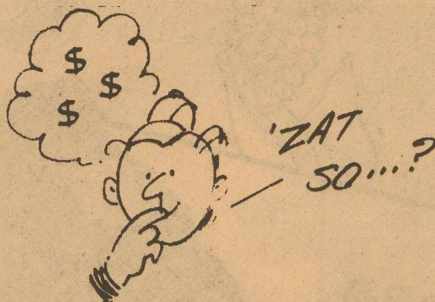
