John Nikolauk, newly elected Mayor, is pictured above being sworn in by City Secretary, Carolyn Mayo.

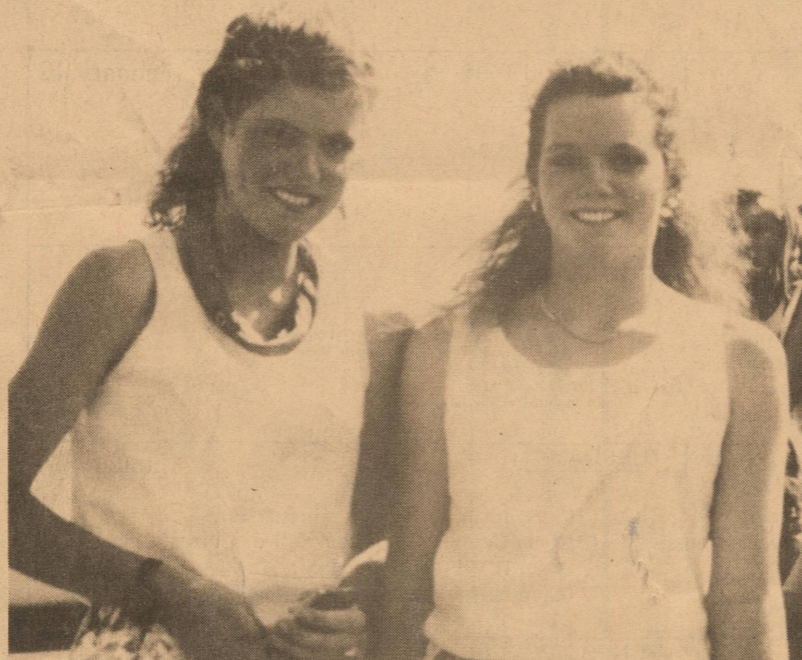
**SEPTEMBER 19, 1991

Mayor John Nikolauk proclaimed this day "9-1-1 Day" for Schleicher County.



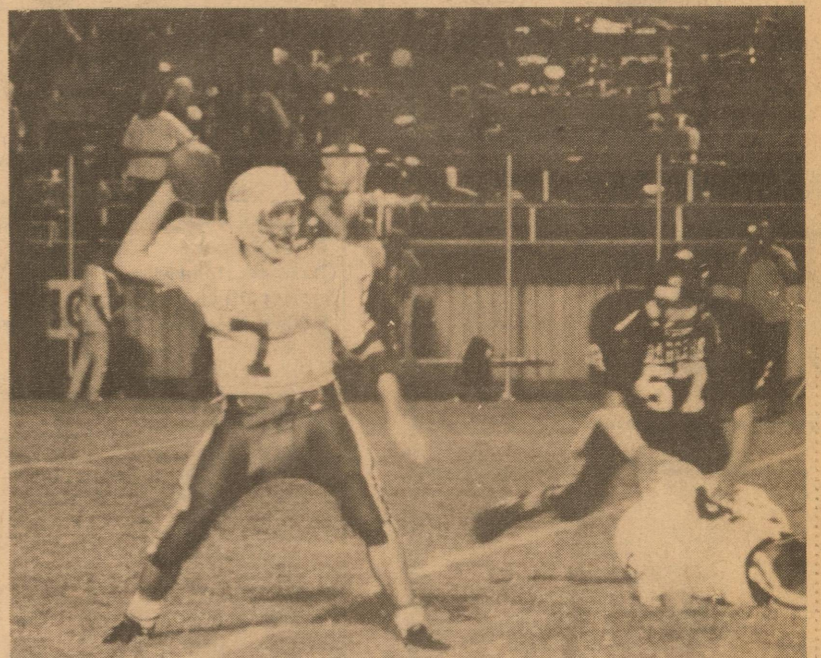
**MAY 23, 1991

TOP OF THE DIVIDE

The year that just passed will, no doubt, go down in history as a fairly important year. Significant political changes occurred last year, some of which seem irrevocable. And, I realize, as I am sure most of you do, that these global changes will have some affect on my life eventually. The real changes this year might not be so apparent just yet.

They find all kinds of ways to present to us the economic situation in this country, but even without facts

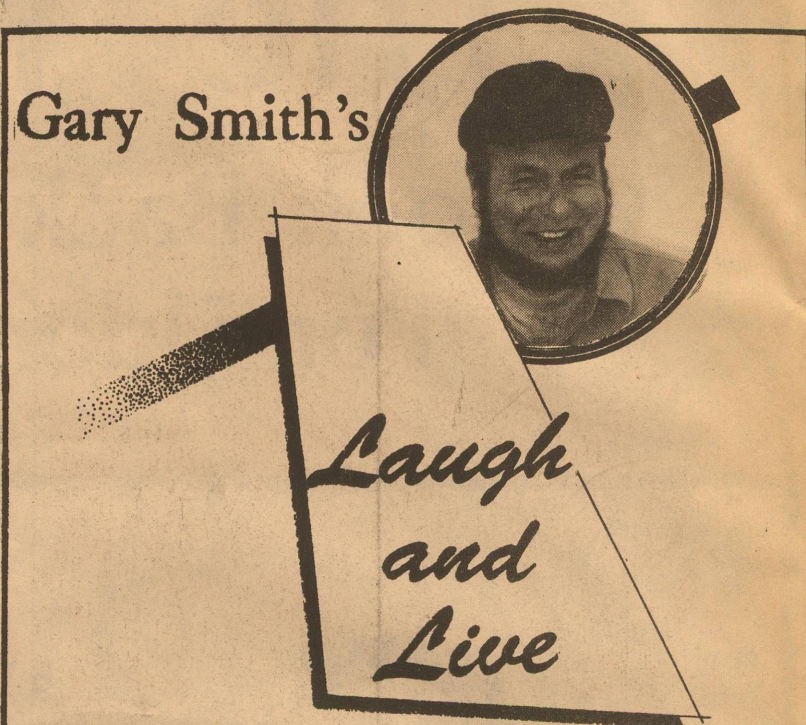
it appeared to me that this Christmas season just did not appear to be too festive. I guess it is not all wrong for there to be a drop in consumer spending, except when you add to that all of the jobs lost. General Motors, for one, is laying off considerable numbers of workers and it appears those jobs won't be coming back.

Yeah, we one a war against a dispirited enemy with overwhelming world support, and the communist leadership realized that they in fact did not

rule a super power but merely a backward third world country, and so they scrapped a political economic system probably doomed from the start anyway. 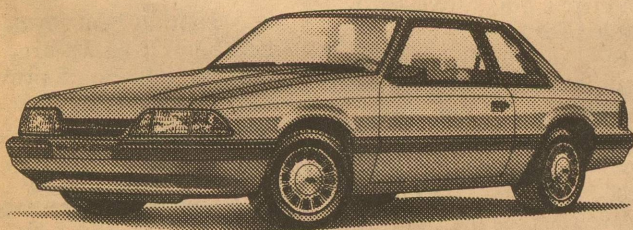
**OCTOBER 3, 1991

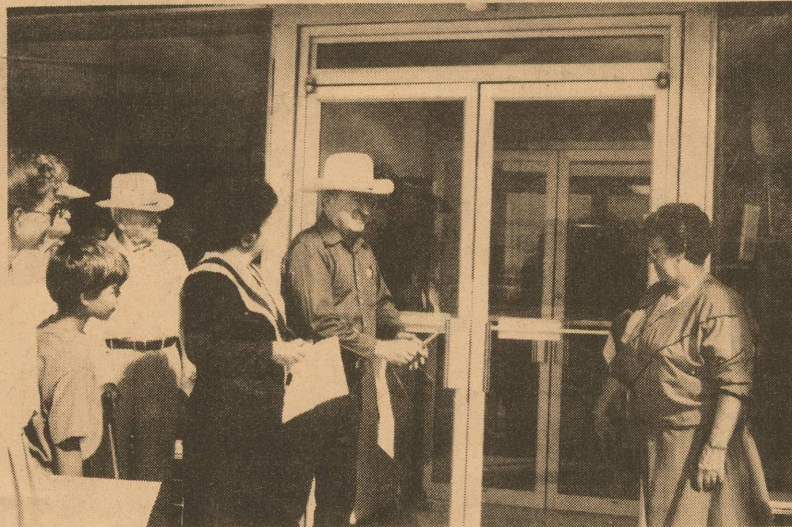

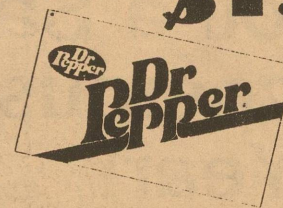
