ULLETS FOR PROFIT WHEN WINTER COMES

Dpend on the youngsters fo Heariest Laying in Fail and Winter Months when Price are Highest, Says Dr. LeGear. "Youth will be served" so runs
the old proverb. Of course, no reference to poultry was intended, but it happens to fit just the same. As a rule, pullets lay
more eggs druing their first lay more eggs druing their first lay
ing season. Consequently, i ing season. Consequently, i
hatches are correctly timed s that plenty of pullets will b orought to maturity some time
during the latter part of August during the latter part of August
or September, a banner winter arg season is bound to follow
Pullets hatched during. Febraty Pullets hatched during Februar or March, according to breed, the right time for winter eggs. Pullets should not be allowed
to come into maturity too quickly. Normally, a pullet starts to
lay eggs as soon as she has reach ed maturity and her body. has
ceased to grow. Sometimes layceased to grow. Sometimes lay-
ing starts somewhat before full growth has been reached an
further growth may cease. Such pullets may remain undersized and their eggs may be defective
and small. If pullets are maturing too rapidly theor mash and
animal food should be reduced. animal food should be reduced.
The grain rations may also be slightly increased, as pullets should have a good reserve store of body fat before they start lay-
ing. Otherwise they will stand up well under the strain of lay ing and may fall considerably
short of the maximum egg pro duction. For that reason, many increase in the quantity of grain fed to the pullets as their combs
begin to redden. At the same time, they cut down on the mash an danimal food; beef scraps or similar material. The grain
fatteninf, whereas the anima food being no longer required fo muscle building as the birds reach maturity, may start egg production before it is desirable It is usually considered better not to force pullets into prema ture laying by feeding large quantities of mash.
