





Trading at home is one of the best policies that any person can to your town and fellow townsboy's singing is done with no one does not only apply to the people that trade in Eldorado with different business houses but it applies to the business people as well. . The country people expect you to buy their produce as well as you expect them to buy from you, whatever you may be selling. You may in some instances have to pay a little more for some articles at home, than you would at some other place but in a way you have a chance to get th is or part of the money spent at home back in your possession. But if you do not get it back you have given it to some one that will invest it in some kind of improvement for the home town. Most everyone living in the home town will spend more less of their earnings in some class of improvements if they are patronized enough by the home people
