## Entities share $\$ 100$ million from tobacco settlement

AUSTIN - Two hundred and
eighty-eight Texas cities, counties and hospital districts have received checks totaling $\$ 100$ million from the Texas tobacco settlement to help offset costs of providing indigent health care.
Checks based on the amoun reimbursed in the previous year were mailed last week by the state comptroller's office Funding came from the $\$ 2.28$
billion Texas tobacco settlement reached in 1998. Those funds are separate from the $\$ 15.3$ billion set tlement between tobacco companies and the state. An initial $\$ 450$ million was set aside for payments
