





Thirteen children, inmates of the state orphan home at Corsicana, and one teacher, all bitten by rabies-infested dog, were brought to the Pasteur institute at Austin Saturday to begin the 21-day treatment.

Gross production taxes of \$48,356 or. 214,784 tons of sulphur mined in Matagorda county was Saturday paid to Comptroller S. H. Terrell by the Texas Gulf Sulphur Company.

The Citizens State bank of Ranger has been granted authority to do business by the state banking board. The capital stock is \$75,000.

A conference of rural Presbyterian churches of Texas is to be held in Dallas January 18 and 19.

Assisting of public school teachers in their old age and in other cases of distress or loss is the purpose of the Teachers Aid Society of Texas, charter for which was recently granted. Headquarters is at Athens.

A new red snapper fishing ground has been located near the gulf coast off Red Fish bay. No red snapper schools previously had been known closer than about 30 miles off Point

Suitable clays for the manufacture of bricks, tiles and pottery are found all over the state in ample abundance and some kaolins, porcelain clays are also known. The value of the clay products of the state for 1924 amounted to \$5,000,000.

George B. Terrell, state commissioner of agriculture, has gone to the Rio Grande Valley to reorganize the force of inspectors in charge of citrus canker inspection work since state funds were cut off by veto and the counties ave raised money for this work.

One and one-fifth fare for the round rip has been granted to the annual onvention of the Texas State Teach rs Association. This is the lowest ailroad rate ever accorded the assoiation. The convention will be held in Dallas, November 26, 27 and 28.

Shipments of lumber originating on the Angelina and Neches River railway may be stopped in transit for reosoting at Beaumont, Orange and Touston, with like shipments on the exas Southeastern stopping at Houson, the commission has just ordered.

The Texas Midland railway was liminated from the carriers authorzed to give a 50 per cent reduction ling and enjoying a short stay at n freight rates on feedstuff in the routh area of Texas, by the railroad ommission on application of the Inernational-Great Northern.

> A deposit of rock asphalt discoverd while drilling for oil six miles south of San Amonio on the Somerset road will be developed and put on the market, possibly within the near future according to Claude McCauley, owner of the farm on which the deposit has peen found.

> Contracts were signed last week beween the state highway commission and Travis county for \$291,000, for work of completing the Austin-Manor louston highway to the Travis county ine. The county supplies \$97,000 o the funds out of its bond issue, and state and federal funds make up the

> Magnetic iron ores are found in Llano County in deposits of some nagnitude. The quality is good, but the size of the deposits is unknown, but the deposits of limonite ores in Eastern and Central Texas constitute the iron deposits worthy of exploitation. These deposits, carrying from 40 to 50 per cent of metallic iron, occurring in beds of from two to five feet in thickness, have already excited the attention of prospectors. They resemble the iron deposits of the famous Ruhr region and are close to extensive deposits of bituminous and brown

Three kinds of coal are found in Texas—bitúminous, lignite and brown coal. The bituminous and lignite fields are worked for local consump ion mainly and very little is shipped utside of the state, while much coal brought into the state. Present proluction amounts to about 300,000 tons of bituminous coal and more than a million tons of lignite. Bituminous coals occur in northeastern and south western counties and the beds run from three feet to more than fifteen feet in thickness.

A sale of 350,000 pounds of mohair at 82 and 77 cents per pound was announced in San Antonio last week this price breaking all Texas records this year. With returns in from all the big Texas mohair producing points, sales this year are shown to have averaged about 57 to 70 cents The market is now climbing to higher levels, according to commission men Kerrville sold more than 1,000,000 pounds this year at prices not an nounced, but said to be generally in line with prevailing early prices of
