



THE WOMAN WHO WORKS

In this new order of things, with women, both married and single, broadening their business activities, very serious problem arises. It is the problem of what, when, and where to

Breakfast is always a hurry-up meal for the men but much more so for the on it. woman who goes to business. Lunchcons, of course, are taken in the lunchrooms and restaurants in the business districts and are no problem. But how about dinners?. Shall they, too, be restaurant meals or can they be so planned that business women may enjoy the home cooking of which they are so fond? Take away the element of haste and anxiety and in its place put carefully thought-out menus, well planned and easily prepared, and home dinners will again regain their high favor with the working housewife.

One of the big worries is frequently your orders. with the milk. Did it come? Is it fresh? Is it frozen? Has the milk man been paid? 'Are the bottles washed and set out? However, there is no cause for worry about milk. Why not keep a dozen cans of evaporated milk in your pantry? There are large cans, equal to a quart of milk and smaller cans that will meet the lesser needs.

For evaporated milk is just pure, fresh milk with more than half the water missing. This water can be replaced in a jiffy, if you so desire or you can use it as cream if rich and creamy foods are desired.

Here are a few recipes that may be used by "The Woman Who Works" for forming her plans for self help and good home cooking.

Scalloped Ham and Potatoes. 1 pound smoked 1% cups water

1 green pepper (may be omitted) 6 medium potatoes 1% cups evapo-rated milk diluted with

Cover the bottom of an oiled baking dish with sliced, raw potatoes. Sprinkle with flour and pieces of ham ½ inch square. Repeat until dish is full. Fill dish ½ full of diluted milk. Bake until potatoes are tender.

Eggs en Casserole.

6 hard-boiled tomatoestbsp. buttertbsp. flour % cup evaporated milk % cup water % cup grated cheese Buttered crumbs

2 tsp. salt Cut hard-boiled eggs in half and ar-Cut hard-boiled eggs in half and arrange around the edge of a greased casserole. Slice tomatoes in center of dish. Make a white sauce of the milk, water, fat and flour. Add cheese and stir over a low fire until cheese is well mixed and smooth. Pour over tomatoes and eggs. Cover with crumbs and bake twenty minutes in a moderate oven. rate oven.

Texas Items BALLINGER VS. EL

A potato curing plant is being erect

A commercial college has been established at Mount Pleasant.

Estimates place the total cotton reeipts this year at Lindale at 5000 bales, or 2000 bales more than the receipts in 1924.

Tentative plans have been made by Wood county for an Armistice Day celebration to be held at Mineola Wednesday, November 11.

An issue of \$5000 Henderson Independent School District bonds, bearing 5½ per cent and maturing serially, has been approved by the attorney general's department.

According to statistics released by the state department of education, during the last year there were more than million school children-1,194,655enrolled in the public schools of Texas.

Construction of the first link of the Timpson-Mount Enterprise highway through Rusk county is being supervised by Contractor Bob Leath. The part of the road in Rusk county extends from Concord to the Shelby county line.

Fifty thousand pounds of candelilla wax was shipped from Brewster county to New York by one firm last week it was the largest single shipment of this wax leaving the county in several months. The wax comes from a plant which grows in profusion in Brewster county. It is used for the manufacture of rubber.

The state of Texas can not collect a franchise tax from a state bank that becomes a national bank, after the change is made, an opinion from the attorney general's department, rendered recently to the state banking de partment, held. This means that a state bank has to pay its franchise only until it enters the federal system, at any period of the fiscal year.

Cassiterite, the oxide of tin, has been found in a mass of pegmatitic granite, on the northeast flanks of Mount Franklin, El Paso. The mineral occurs in veins of quartz and disseminated in the granite. The formation is similar to the tin deposits of England. There has been some desultory prospecting, insuffi cient to determine the commercial

Complete data on the composition of Willacy county soils will be mide available to the public as the result of a survey which is to be conducted by Herman W. Hawker, soil expert of A. and M. College, under the direction of that organization, and at the expense of the state. The Texas Railroad Commission has led a hearing for October 13 o he application of the St. Louis-South vestern Railway Company of Texas for an order fixing a charge of \$6.30 per car for stop for planing or dress ing of lumber in transit. A schedule of charges varying from \$7.20 per ar for 15 miles, up to \$14 for over 5 miles for backhauls involved in the planing or storing-in-transit privilege, is also proposed.

Eight permits looking toward irriga ion of 5505 acres were granted the ast week by the state board of water ngineers. Permit for largest acre ge was given to G. S. Combs of Mara hon, who purposes to irrigate 3040 acres by pumping from Mariavillas Creek, a tributary of the Rio Grande Brewster County. J. Lee Davis of Waco was granted a permit to irrigate 042 acres in Falls county by pumpng from the Brazos river.

CONDENSED AUSTIN NEWS

The Texas State Library has re ceived more than 600 pages of transcripts of material in the archives of Mexico City bearing upon Texas

Blue sky permit was granted by Secretary of State to the Greater Texas Speedway Association of Dallas to sell \$395,000 worth of stock, 2,950 shares at \$120 a share, increasing the stock from \$5,000 to

H. E. Wattinger of Austin was recently awarded by the State Board of Control contract for construction of three new buildings at the Austin State School (colony for feebleminded), his bid being \$65,620. The buildings include a dormitory, emplaye's home and doctor's cottage.

Constitutionality of the act of the Thirty-Seventh Legislature fixing a standard weight for a loaf of bread the Court of Criminal Appeals in the case of C. H. Ford, from darris County, convicted of violating the statute and fined \$110.

A total of \$315,887 tax on gasoline was paid the State in August by the Gulf Refininy Company, the Texas Company, the Magnolia Petroleum Company, Pierce Petroleum and Humble Oil and Refining Company This is \$277 less than the amount paid by these companies in July.

As a result of a shake-up in the State Industrial Accident Board. three long-time clerks will retire on Oct. 15. Two of them are men and the other a woman. The clerks who are to be displaced are said to have long been recognized as among the most efficient employes of the State government.

Peanuts grown in China are imported into this country, pay a dut and then are transported half way across the continent and sold in Dallas at a cent per pound cheaper than Texas-grown peanuts, according to testimony adduced before the Rail road Commission by peanut experts who declared that the local rates are choking the Texas industry.

While banks desiring to become State depositories have until Oct. 15 in which to make application for State funds, nearly all of the funds which can be placed in State de ositories have already been applied for, according to State Treasury W Gregory Hatcher. The applications came from banks in every section of the State, Mr. Hatcher sadi.

The ma ly determining whether there triculation fee of \$15, the library fee of \$7 and a gymnasium fee of \$1 make up the \$43.

No artist ever worked with a larger and more itinerant "gallery" observ ing than Miss Margaret Brisbine of Houston, who is making a large reproduction of Huddle's famous painting of the surrender of Santa enna at San Jacinto. The original hangs in the main corridor of the Capitol and, perched some dozen feet above the floor, Miss Brisbine is copying the painting.

The Railroad Commission granted the petition of the Fort Worth & Denver Railroad and certain con necting lines for the storage of but ter in transit when moved in car load shipments. Elaborate rules are prescribed for the single stop allowed for storing and reshipment within "twelve months." This might seem to make stale butter, but cold storage saves it.

The teachers' college of Columbia University, New York, has written Gov. Ferguson requesting full infor mation about the budget system used in this State, and reply will be made by the Board of Control, which builds the budget every two years The college advised that it is making a survey of the entire United States.
