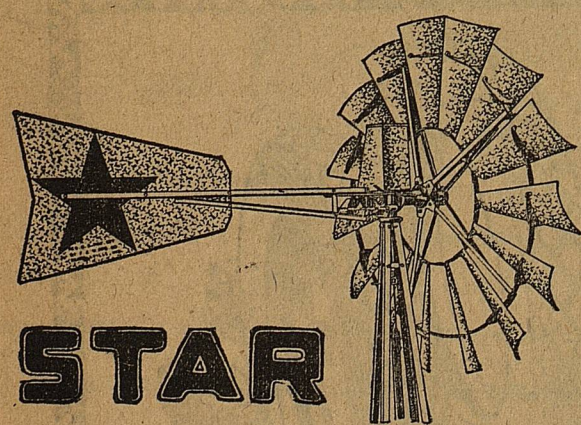

## BY-LAWS OF THE INCORPORATED TOWN OF EL-DORADO, TEXAS.

Be it ordained by the board of the incorporated town of Eldorado, Texas.

Section 1. Regular meetings of the Board of Aldermen shall be held on the first Tuesday of each month at Court House, Eldorado, Texas at 9 o'clock A. M.

and the meeting at which these by-laws are adopted shall constitute the first regular meeting here under.

Section 2. Special meetings of the Board of Aldermen may be called by the Mayor or three Aldermen by giving twenty-four hours notice by mail provided that a special meeting may be held at anytime without notice if the Mayor and all the Aldermen are present.

Section 3. The Mayor or, in his absence, one of the Aldermen, shall call the meeting to order and direct the roll to be called and if a quorum be present the business of the meeting shall be proceeded with.

Section 4. The Mayor or Alderman presiding shall have the power to send the Marshal after absent members and a member shall not leave a meeting without permission of the Mayor.

Section 5. Any member failing to attend the regular meeting or a special meeting of which he has due notice, shall be subject to a fine not exceeding \$5.00.

Section 6. The order of business at regular meetings shall be as follows until changed by the Board of Aldermen:

- 1st. Roll call.
- 2nd. Reading of the Minutes.
- 3rd. Petitions read and disposed of.
- 4th. Report of Town Officers.
- 5th. Report of Committees.
- 6th. Unfinished business.
- 7th. New business.

Section 7. Every resolution or motion placed before the Board of Aldermen must be made in writing if requested by the Mayor or any member and the Yeas and Nays upon any motion or resolution shall in like manner be entered of record at the request of the Mayor or any member.

Section 8. No member shall vote on any question in which he is financially interested.

Section 9. These By-Laws may be temporarily suspended by unanimous vote of the members present.

Section 10. Vacancies in the offices of the Town shall be filled by appointment of the Board of Aldermen for the unexpired term.

Section 11. The Mayor shall preside over all meetings of the Board of Aldermen when present and shall cause the or-

## CITY COUNCIL MEETING.

(Continued from first page)  
 ordinances and By-Laws of the Town to be enforced.

Section 12. The Mayor shall act as Recorder of the Corporation Court and he and the other officers of the court shall receive for their services in connection therewith such fees as are allowed by law.

Section 13. The Town Secretary shall be appointed by the Board of Aldermen and shall take the oath of office before he enters upon his duties and shall hold office at the will of the Board of Aldermen. He shall perform the duties of Secretary, and Treasurer.

Section 14. Before entering upon the duties of the aforesaid positions he shall enter into a good and sufficient bond with two or more sureties to be approved by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen in double the estimated amount of the annual revenues of the Town as estimated by the Board of Aldermen which bond shall be filed and recorded in the minutes of the Board.

Section 15. The Town Secretary shall be general accountant of the town, he shall attend every meeting of the Board of Aldermen and shall keep accurate minutes of the proceedings thereof in a book provided for that purpose, and shall engrave all Laws, Resolutions and ordinances, and perform such other duties as are prescribed by law, and such as may be prescribed from time to time by the Board of Aldermen.

Section 16. The Town Secretary shall receive and safely keep all moneys belonging to the town, and disburse the same upon the order of the Mayor, attested by one of the Aldermen under the seal of the corporation, provided no order shall be paid, unless it shall show upon its face that the Board of Aldermen directed its issuance and for what purpose and on what date.

Section 17. The Town Secretary shall receive such compensation for his services as the Board of Aldermen may from time to time prescribe.

Section 18. That the Town Marshal shall be Assessor and Collector of taxes and shall keep one or more books containing written or printed blank receipts, with corresponding marginal summaries, and before the delivery of any receipts for taxes, he shall fill up a blank therefor, and also the corresponding marginal summary in said book, leaving therein the corresponding marginal summary as a permanent register of his office, which shall be produced before the Board of Aldermen when ever required.

Section 19. The Assessor and

Collector shall prepare an assessment roll for the town in which he shall set down in separate columns in alphabetical order the names of taxable citizens of the Town, the amount and description of their property, real or personal, and the taxable value thereof and the amounts of taxes due thereon, for which purpose he shall between the 1st day of January and the 1st day of June of each year, call upon each and every person living in the Town, subject to taxation, for a list of his or her taxable property and of all property subject to taxation, held by such person, either for himself, as agent or attorney, trustee or guardian, executor or administrator, within said Town. And the Assessor and Collector in taking said list of taxable property shall enter the same upon his books with a description thereof, and shall in each separate assessment cause the person making the same, to subscribe his name thereto which assessment shall be under oath of the person making the same, provided that the Assessor may procure the lists from the property owners above provided for, for the year 1925 at anytime before the meeting of the Board of Equalization for that year.

Section 20. That it shall be the duty of the Assessor and Collector to keep one or more books to be called the "Register of Lots and Blocks" and to enter therein, in numerical order, every lot or block in separate columns the names of the owners thereof, and the value at which the same is assessed. And it shall be his duty at the first subsequent meeting of the Board of Aldermen after the last day of each month after the passage hereof, to render a report to the Board of Aldermen setting out the means and exertions used by him to discover the names of the property owners, and the Board of Aldermen shall judge as to the sufficiency and diligence so displayed by him.

Section 21. The Assessor and Collector after he has completed his assessment rolls as provided in this Ordinance shall place the same in the hands of the board of equalization to be approved; after which work has been performed, the aggregate amount of taxes, as shown in the final footings on said roll shall be entered in on account against the Assessor

and Collector, and the Assessor and Collector shall make settlement with the Board of Aldermen as herein provided.

Section 22. The City Marshal shall be the Assessor and Collector of taxes for said Town of Eldorado, Texas, and, for the faithful performance of his duties as such, shall give bond with two or more good and sufficient sureties to be approved by the Board of Aldermen in the sum of \$2,500.00 which bond shall be conditioned for the faithful performance of his duties as such Collector of taxes as well as his duties as City Marshal.

Section 23. Between the 1st day of October of each year and the 31st day of January following he shall proceed to collect the taxes herein mentioned except that for the year 1925 taxes may be collected by him at anytime after assessment rolls have been approved and delivered to him and not earlier than January 1, 1926 and on or before the 31st day of January following and if any person shall fail or refuse to pay the taxes imposed upon him or her by law as herein provided by virtue of such tax list on or before the 31st day of January as aforesaid, then the Assessor and Collector may nevertheless collect same but shall add thereto and collect from any such delinquent taxpayer the interest, costs and penalties provided by law in the case of the collection of State and County taxes and the Assessor and Collector shall make out a list of delinquent tax payers and property at the time and in the form and manner and under the regulations provided by law as in the case of State and County taxes and such delinquent list in any suit for the collection of taxes shall be admissible in evidence as by prima facie proof of the fact that all requirements of law with reference to the levying and assessing of said taxes have been complied with and shall be prima facie proof of the indebtedness of the defendant therefor.

Section 24. The Assessor and Collector shall make monthly report to the Board of Aldermen at their first meeting of each month, showing the amount of taxes that have been collected by him for the previous month. Said report shall be in writing, showing the amount collected, and what disposition has been made thereof. No allowance shall be made by the Assessor and Collector in the settlement of his account for delinquent and unknown tax payers but he shall report a list of the same to the Board of Aldermen and show what effort has been made to collect the same.

Section 25. That whenever the Assessor and Collector shall ascertain that any taxable inhabitant or property, real estate, land, lot, block or personal property of any description have from any cause, not been assessed for any previous year, he shall at once note the same in a book kept for that purpose and assess the said property, etc., on his next assessment roll at the rate under which the said property, etc., should have been assessed for such past year or years, and such assessment shall be entered at the end of his next assessment roll, stating the year for which such inhabitant or property should have been assessed, and the taxes so assessed and due thereon shall be collected in the same manner as other taxes.

Section 26. If the taxes be not voluntarily paid, the Board of Aldermen shall have the power to make the collection in the same manner and with like effect as is prescribed for collection of taxes in Towns. And all the remedies available to Towns and Cities under the general laws of the State of Texas for the collection of said taxes shall be available and shall apply to the collection of such taxes by said

Assessor and Collector, and the Assessor and Collector shall make settlement with the Board of Aldermen as herein provided.

Section 27. There shall be levied and collected from every person over the age of Twenty-one years resident within the said town on the 1st day of January, 1925 and each 1st day of January thereafter an annual poll tax of \$1.00 which shall be due and payable at the same time as hereinabove provided for the payment of property taxes.

Section 28. Passed and approved as provided by law on November 3rd A. D. 1925.

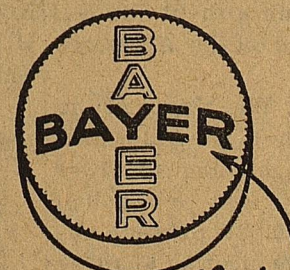

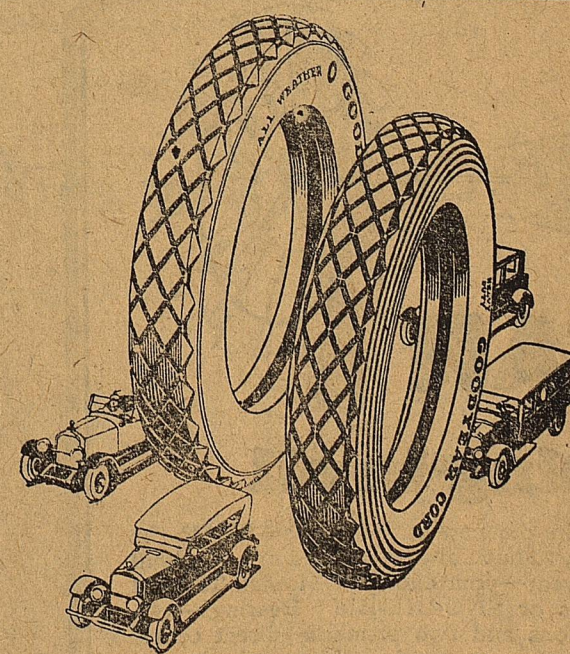

## ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATIONS.

At a recent meeting of the State Highway Commission, Division Engineers were instructed to take steps to see that all motor vehicles operating in that State have paid correct license fees, and are not carrying loads in excess of their registered capacity.

In Division No. 7 lists of all trucks, tractors, trailers and busses registered will be compiled from the Tax Collector's records and furnished Maintenance Superintendents and Section Foremen of the various Counties, whose duty it will be to report any violations of the motor vehicle laws to the County Officials.

While it is not intended to place the Maintenance forces of the State Highway Department in the position of Highway police, it is intended that drastic steps if necessary be taken to insure that Highway laws are complied with, especially those that pertain hundreds of thousand dollars worth of damage to higher type pavements, besides undue wear on gravel and earth roads.

The Maintenance forces in this division have their hands full in maintaining the roads and if owners of motor vehicles will acquaint themselves with and comply with registration laws it is to be hoped that minimum of their time will be used in checking up on and reporting such violations.

It is therefore urged that all owners of motor vehicles who are not at present complying with the laws, inform themselves and immediately comply with same in order that the Counties and State receive all taxes due them and our existing roads be

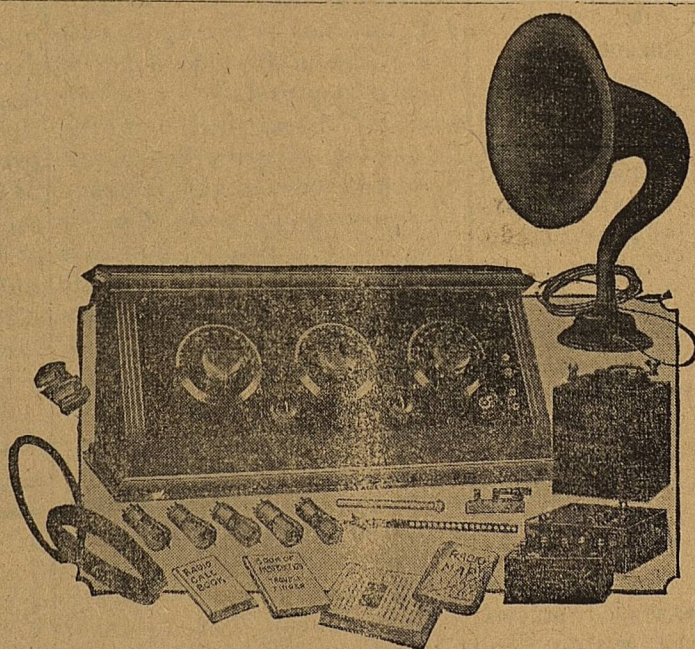

## MEETING OF ALDERMEN.

Eldorado, Texas.

November 3rd. 1925.

On this the 3rd day of Novem-  
 ber, A. D. 1925, at a regular  
 meeting of the Board of Alder-  
 men of the town of Eldorado,  
 Texas, duly called by the Mayor  
 of said Town of Eldorado, Texas,  
 by giving personal notice to each  
 member of said Board of Alder-  
 men of Eleorado, Texas, and  
 there being present the said C.  
 A. Spencer, the Mayor of the  
 Town of Eldorado, Texas and A.  
 T. Wright, L. M. Hoover, T. K.  
 Jones, A. A. Bush and D. C. Hill,  
 all of the members of the Board  
 of Aldermen of the Town of El-  
 dorado, Texas, and said meeting  
 having been held in part for the  
 following purpose: For the levy-  
 ing of taxes for general purpo-  
 ses upon the property subject to  
 the taxation in said Town of El-  
 dorado, Texas, for the year 1925,  
 for the passage of an ordinance  
 directing the Tax Assessor and  
 Collector of the Town of El-  
 dorado, Texas, to assess the  
 taxes and collect the same and  
 specifying the manner in which  
 said taxes shall be assessed and  
 the rolls therefor made up and  
 returned to the Board of Equal-  
 ization for the appointment of  
 the Board of Equalization for the  
 year 1925 for said Town of Eldo-  
 rado, Texas, and fixing the time  
 for the meeting of said Board  
 and notice of purposes of said  
 meeting as above stated having  
 been given by the Mayor C. A.  
 Spencer, to each of the members  
 of said Board of Aldermen, of  
 said Town of Eldorado, Texas,  
 when said meeting was called  
 and having been announced be-  
 fore said meeting by the Mayor,  
 the following proceedings were  
 had; On motion of Alderman A.  
 T. Wright, it was moved and  
 seconded by D. C. Hill that the  
 following ordinance be passed  
 by said Board of Aldermen at  
 said meeting to-wit;

### An Ordinance.

Of the incorporated Town of  
 Eldorado, Texas, making the  
 tax levy of said town for the  
 year 1925 at the rate of one-fourth  
 of one per cent on the assessed  
 value of all real and personal estate  
 and property within the limits  
 of said town subject to taxation  
 for current expenses and gener-  
 al purposes; providing that said  
 taxes shall be due and payable  
 January 1, 1926 and shall be paid  
 not later than February 1, 1926.

"Be it ordained by the Board  
 of Aldermen of the Town of El-  
 dorado, Texas, that a tax of and  
 at the rate of one fourth of one  
 per cent on the assessed value of  
 all real property within the  
 limits of said Town of Eldorado,  
 Texas, not exempt from taxa-  
 tion by the Constitution and the  
 Laws of the State of Texas be  
 and is hereby levied upon the  
 said property for the year 1925  
 for the current expenses and  
 general purposes, which said  
 taxes shall become due and pay-  
 able January 1, 1926 and shall  
 be paid not later than January  
 31, 1926."

Which motion was seconded  
 by Alderman, D. C. Hill and af-  
 ter a full discussion thereof  
 by said Board of Aldermen said  
 motion was put before said  
 Board of Alderman for a vote  
 and the following was the vote  
 cast thereon; For the passage  
 of said Ordinance, A. T. Wright, D.  
 C. Hill, T. K. Jones, L. M. Hoov-  
 er and A. A. Bush, and Against  
 the Passage of said Ordinance,  
 NONE.

Whereupon the Mayor declar-  
 ed said Ordinance passed.

Next in order of Said proceed-  
 ings, Alderman, A. T. Wright,  
 made a motion that said Board  
 of Alderman pass the following  
 Ordinance to-wit;

### An Ordinance

Of the incorporated Town of  
 Eldorado, Texas, providing that  
 the Town Marshall shall give  
 bond in the sum of \$2,500.00, to  
 be approved by the Board of Al-

dermen and instructing him af-  
 ter giving such bond and taking  
 the oath of office to assess for  
 taxes for 1925 all property in the  
 said town subject to taxation;  
 providing a form of blank for  
 making such assessments and a  
 form of book for the tax rolls  
 and the manner of making up  
 such assessments sheets and tax  
 rolls and the manner of giving  
 in assessments by taxpayers and  
 providing that such rolls shall  
 be duly certified and returned to  
 the board of equalization on or  
 before December 15, 1925, and  
 that such Town Marshall, as  
 such tax collector and assessor  
 shall proceed to collect such tax-  
 es on January 1, 1926.

"Be it ordained by the Board  
 of Aldermen of the Town of El-  
 dorado, Texas, that the Town  
 Marshall, as Tax Assessor and  
 Collector of the Town of Eldoro-  
 do, Texas, after he shall have  
 duly qualified by taking the oath  
 and giving good and sufficient  
 bond as required by law in the  
 sum of Twenty-five hundred  
 (\$2 500.00) Dollars, be and is  
 hereby authorized and instruct-  
 ed to assess for taxes for the  
 year 1925 for general purposes  
 all of the real and personal estate  
 and property within the limits  
 of said Town of Eldorado, Texas,  
 not exempt from taxation by the  
 Constitution and Laws of this  
 State and that he make said as-  
 sessments by giving a good de-  
 scription of said property upon  
 a printed blank furnished for  
 that purpose.

And that from said assess-  
 ment sheets said Tax Assessor  
 and Collector make up the as-  
 sessment rolls upon a book show-  
 ing the year for which said prop-  
 erty is assessed, the descrip-  
 tion of said property, the name  
 and address of the owners there-  
 of, if known, and if unknown, so  
 state. Said rolls shall contain a  
 description of the property of  
 unknown owners in a separate  
 place from that of known owners  
 and opposite the description of  
 said property and the name and  
 address of the owners thereof  
 there shall be placed the value as  
 fixed by said Assessor when  
 said value is not fixed by rendi-  
 tion made by the owner and when  
 said value is fixed by owner-  
 thereof or duly authorized agent  
 by rendition, then such value  
 shall be placed upon said assess-  
 ment roll and said roll shall be  
 made up in duly tabulated form  
 and completed and certified to  
 by said Tax Assessor and Col-  
 lector and returned to the Board  
 of Equalization of said town of  
 Eldorado, Texas, on or before  
 December 15, 1925, and on Jan-  
 uary 1, 1926 said Tax Assessor  
 and Collector shall proceed to  
 collect said taxes."

Which motion was seconded  
 by Alderman T. K. Jones and af-  
 ter a full discussion thereof by  
 said Board of Aldermen, the  
 Mayor put said motion before  
 said Board of Aldermen for a

vote thereon and the following  
 is the the vote of said Board of  
 Aldermen thereon to-wit: For  
 the Passage of said Ordinance, D.  
 C. Hill, L. M. Hoover, T. K. Jones,  
 A. T. Wright and A. A. Bush.

Against the Passage of said  
 Ordinance, NONE.

Thereupon the Mayor declar-  
 ed said Ordinance passed.

The next proceeding had at  
 said meeting was the following:

Alderman, A. T. Wright, made  
 a motion for the enactment for  
 the following ordinance:

### An Ordinance

Of the incorporated Town of  
 Eldorado, Texas, providing for  
 a Board of Equalization for the  
 town and naming the members  
 thereof for the year 1925, pre-  
 scribing a time and place for the  
 meetings thereof and the length  
 of time they shall continue in  
 session.

"Be it ordained by the Board  
 of Aldermen of the Town of El-  
 dorado, Texas, that F. M. Brad-  
 ley, Sam E. Jones and Van Mc-  
 Cormick resident citizens and  
 property tax payers of the Town  
 of Eldorado Texas, be and they  
 are hereby appointed as a Board  
 of Equalization for the Town of  
 Eldorado, Texas, for the year  
 1925 and the time of meeting of  
 said Board shall be from Decem-  
 ber 15 to December 25, 1925, in-  
 clusive, at the regular meeting  
 place of the Board of Aldermen

of the Town of Eldorado, Texas  
 for the purposes of performing  
 the duties of the Board of Equal-  
 ization for said Town of Eldora-  
 do, Texas.

Which motion was seconded  
 by Alderman, T. K. Jones and  
 after a full discussion thereof  
 said motion was put for a vote  
 before said Board of Aldermen  
 and the following was the vote  
 thereof:

For the passage of said Ord-  
 nance, A. T. Wright, D. C. Hill,  
 T. K. Jones, L. M. Hoover and A.  
 A. Bush; Against the Passage  
 of said Ordinance, NONE.

Thereupon the Mayor declared  
 said Ordinance duly enacted.

Whereupon all business of  
 said meeting having been finish-  
 ed a motion to adjourn was made,  
 put before the Board of Alder-  
 men was carried and said meet-  
 ing was thereupon, by the Mayor,  
 declared to stand adjourned.
