



CARE OF CONVALESCENT IN SUMMER

The patient, though well on the road to recovery, is usually weakened by the rigors of disease and the excessive heat is wont to sap his energy. Where the milk supply is uncertain or the quality not of the best, evaporated milk should be employed. It is sterile; it is just pure milk with about sixty per cent of the water removed. Its double richness may be modified, if desired, by the addition of water or it may be used just as it is, where

rich, creamy dishes are desired. Many people make the mistake of confusing evaporated milk with condensed milk. They are not at all similar in appearance, composition or taste. They cannot be used for the same purposes; condensed milk is a combination of sugar and milk; evaporated milk has no added sugar, being pure milk of double-rich quality and

Following are recipes of easily prepared dishes and foods that are well suited for the invalid and the con-

Loganberry Cream.

% cup evaporated % cup loganberry juice
% cup water 2 tbsp. lemon juice Pinch salt

Put all ingredients in a Mason fruit jar and shake thoroughly. Chill and serve in glasses filled ¼ full of ice chips. Raspberry, blackberry, and cherry juice may be used instead of the loganberry.
