



Proposed Amendment to the Constitution.

Senate Joint Resolution No. 7

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the State of Texas by amending Section 33 and Section 40 of Aritcle 16 of the Constitution of Texas so as to permit officers of the National Guard, the National Guard Reserve, and the Officers Reserve Corps of the United States, and enlisted men of the National Guard, the National Guard Re serve, and the Organized Reserves of the United States to hold office in Texas.

Beit Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Texas;

Section 1. That Section 33 of Article 16 of the Constitution of the State of Texas be amended so as to read as follows:

"The accounting officers of this State shall neither draw nor pay a warrant upon the Treasury in favor of any person, for salary or compensation as agent, officer o appointee, who holds at the same time any other office or position of honor, trust or profit. under this State or the United States: except as prescribed in i sue the necessary proclamathis Constitution. Provided, tion for said election, and have that this restriction as to the upon the Treasury shall not ap Guard of Texas, the National Guard Reserve, the Officers Reserve Corps of the United States law. nor to enlisted men of the Na tional Guard, the National Guard Reserve, and the Organized Reserves of the United States "

Section 2. That Section 40 of Article 16 of the Contitution of the State of Texas be ammended so as read as follows:

"No person shall hold or exercise, at the same time, more than one civil office of emolument, ex cept that of Justice of Peace, County Commissioner, Notary Public and Postmaster, officer of the National Guard the National Guard Reserve, and the Officers Reserve Corps of the United States and enlisted mer of the National Guard, the National Guard Reserve, and the organized Reserves of the United States. unless other wise specially provided herein Provided, that nothing in this Constitution shall be construed to prohibit an officer, or enlisted man of the National Guard and the National Guard Reseve, or an officer in the Officers Reserve Corps of the United States, or an enlisted man in the Organized Reserved of the United States from hold ng in conjunction with such office any other office or position of honor, trust or profit, under

this State or United States.' Section 3. The foregoing Constitutional amendments shall e submitted to a vote of the qualified electors of this State t an election to be held on the first Tuesday in November, A.F. 1926, at which all ballots shall

ave printed thereon; "For the Constitutional amend ment permitting officers and en isted men of the National Guard and the National Guard Reserve, and officers of the Officers Reserver Corps of the United States nd enlisted men of the Organized Reserves of the United States to hold other offices or positions honor, trust or profit under ins State or the United States'

Against the Constitutional a rendment permitting officers nd enlisted men of the National snard and the National Guard Reserve, and officers of the Officers Reserve Corps of the Unit d States, and enlisted men of the Organized Reserves of the United States, to hold other offic s or positions of honor, crust or profit under this State ir the United States".



House Joint Resolution No. 9 A resolution proposing an amendment to Article 7, of the Constitution of the State of Texas, by changing Section 3, eliminating the provision authoriz ing the Legislature to create special districts and making an appropriation therefor.

Be it resolved by the Legislature of the State of Texas;

Section 1. That Section 3, Article 7, of the Constitution be so changed as to read as follows: creating new Section)

'Section 3. Proposed Amendment

to the Constitution.

Senate Joint Resolution No. 10 Proposing an amendment to the Constitution providing for axation of school lands owned by counties.

Be it Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Texas;

Section 1. That Article 7 of he Contitution of the State of Texas shall be amended by addng after Section 6 thereof 6a, which shall be read as follows; Section 6a. All agriculture or

grazing school land mentioned a Section 6 of this Article owned by any county shall be sub. ect to taxation except for State purposed to the same extent as lands privately owned. Sectian 2. The foregoing Con

stitutional amendment shall be submitted to a vote of the quali fied electors of this State at an election to be held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November A. D., 1926, at which all ballot shall have printed thereon: "For the Constitutional amendment providing for taxation of all agriculture or grazing school land owed by any county to the same extent as and privately owned."

Section 3. The Governor shall ssue the necessary proclamation for said election and have the same published as required by the Constitution and laws of this State. The expense of publicati in and election for such amer c. ment shall be paid out of proper appropriation made by law

ISRAEL ENSLAVED IN EGYPT

LESSON TEXT—Exodus 1:1-14.
GOLDEN TEXT—The Lord will not use off his people.—Ps. 94:14.
PRIMARY TOPIC—A Wicked King to Cruel to God's People.
JUNIOR TOPIC—The Israelites Between States

INTERMEDIATE AND SENIOR TOP-C—Israel Oppressed by a Despotic YOUNG PEOPLE AND ADULT TOP IO-Modern Forms of Oppression.

I. The Increase of the Chosen Seed

This miraculous increase seems only to have begun after the death of Joseph and the passing of his generation. After this Israel quickly grew into a nation. This amazing increase "is expressed as is usual in Hebrew by a climax of verbs: where fruitful is taken from the vegetable world in which the increase varies from the multiple to several hundred fold; increased (spawned-swarmed) is borrowed from the finny tribes in which the rate of increase rises to many myriads; multiply is a general word referring to number; and 'waxed exceedingly mighty' is a similar phrase alluding to the strength which num bers confer, composed of verb and adverb repeated and therefore well adapted to complete the climax."-Murphy. This increase can only be accounted for by admitting the hand of the Almighty to be in it.

II. A New Dynasty Appears (VV.

Joseph's elevation as prime minister in Egypt was during the reign of the Hyksos kings. Being of Semitic origin, they were not hostile to the Hebrews, but when "there arose up a new king which knew not Joseph" (v. 8) their troubles began. This affords a striking illustration of God's providence in history. His purposes include the means to carry them out. The amazing growth of the Israelites excited the envy and fear of the king (vv. 9-10). Fear was twofold-

1. In case of war they might join the enemy and fight against them. 2. Lest they should remove from the land, thus cutting off a vital source of revenue and also exposing to danger the eastern border of the land.

III. Measures to Check the Growth of Israel (vv. 11-22).

These measures with their outcome expose the folly of world wisdom (I Cor. 3:19), If they could have eliminated God from the affairs of men their policy would have been a good one, but it proved to be altogether vanity. The greatest mistake a man can ever make is to leave God out of his calculations. God had promised that His people should become mighty in power as well as great in

1. Placed under cruel taskmasters (vv. 11-14).

The first measure he adopted was to put Israel into cruel bondage by afflicting them with heavy burdens Cruel taskmasters were placed over them, who forced them to labor in building treasure cities and all manner of service in the field. They exacted of them hard service, but this measure was ineffectual for "the more they afflicted them the more they multiplied and grew." This rapid growth resulted in more intense burdens be ing heaped upon them. The Egyptians meant this for evil to the Israelites. but God blessed it to their good. It was part of His plan for them (Gen. 15:13, 14). Indeed, the righteous may expect such treatment of the world (II Tim. 1:12; Heb. 12:6). Prosperity and adversity constitute God's teaching and discipline. While their burdens were heavy and their sufferings very intense, they had the consolation that it would not last forever. The presence of Joseph's dead body was a guaranty that they would one day be delivered. Though the Christian's burden may be heavy and his sufferings keen, he has the guaranty that they shall not last always. The authorized murder of the male infants by the midwives (vv.

3. The drowning of the male chil

dren in the river (v. 22). The king having heretofore been baffled, he now gave the heartless command to cast the male infants into the river. This mandate seems to have been given shortly before Moses was born. This plan likewise failed, and the very child who ultimately upset Pharaoh's throne, was sheltered and nurtured in his own
