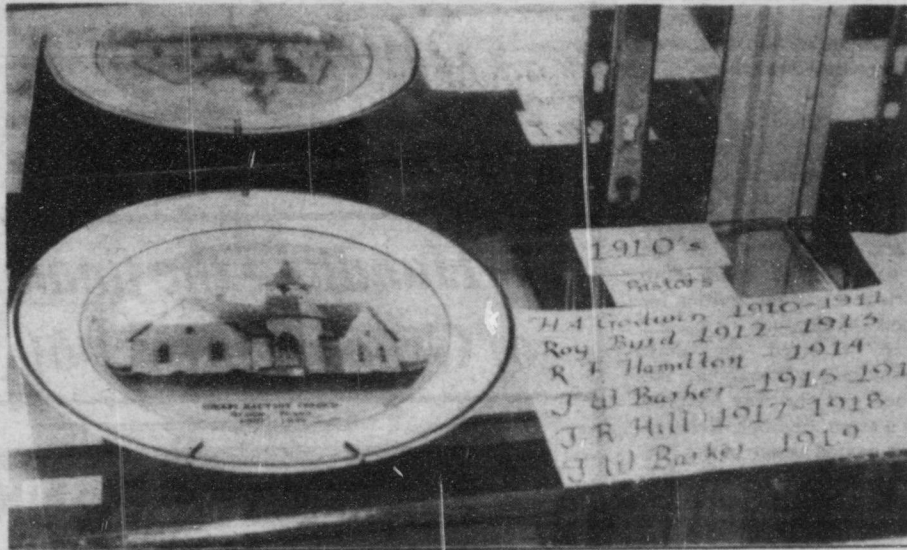
## First Baptist Church Looking At Renovation

The First Baptist Church of Groom invites everyone to stop by and view a historical display of the church's 86 years. The display contains historical documents, pictures and many other interesting documents.

The display was compiled in conjunction of the church's renovation plans underway. The outside structure has been revitalized with the steeple renovated, storm windows installed and winterizing was administered throughout.

The Long Range Planning Committee of the church has voted to present to the church an extensive renovation program on July 16. There will be a pot luck lunch after the morning worship service for everyone. After the meal there will be a special program of music and a devotion, before the presentation of the remodeling plans. Church members are encouraged to attend so they will know the full extent of the plans being made by the church.

Bro. Eddie Hogan explained that the church building is in desperate need of repair. Walls need a fresh coat of paint, there are holes to fill and cracks to patch. The air conditioning and heating system is outdated



and costly. The facilities need to be updated.

The renovation plan includes a complete updating of the educational facilities,

new paint, wall to wall carpet, remodeling of bathrooms and offices and refinishing paneling and kitchen cabinets. In the sanc-

tuary, renovation would include new padded pews, carpet and stained glass windows.

The fifth Sunday offering in July will be the first payment toward this project. Renovation will be made possible by individual gifts. Jessie Faye Tucker left a large gift to the church for

this purpose; however, it will not pay for all the recommended renovations.

The church will vote on Sunday July 23, in a busi-

ness meeting following morning services. During the meeting each item of renovation will be discussed and voted on at this time.

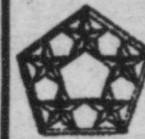
