Frank R. Murray, 98, died Wednesday, Dec. 13, 1989. Services are pending with Rix Funeral Directors.

The former U.S. Bankruptcy Judge was among the oldest active judges on record in the United States.

Murray taught school in Coleman, graduated from Southwestern University and was Carson County Attorney before being appointed Bankruptcy Referee for the Northern Judicial District in Amarillo in 1947.

The Coleman native later was appointed Federal Bankruptcy Judge and served in that capacity until retiring at the age of 89.

Murray was a U.S.Navy veteran of World War I. He married Maymee Low in San Saba in 1919. He was a member of Lubbock Rolary Club and was a Paul Harris Fellow in Rotary International.

He had lived in Lubbock since 1948 and was a frequent contributor to The Lubbock Avalanche-Journal's "Letters to the Editor"

# Representative Dick Waterfield Announced Candidacy For Congress

Rep. Dick Waterfield, a veteran state legislator from Canadian, today announced his candidacy for the U.S. Congress, representing the 13th Congressional District.

Waterfield, a conservative Repulican, has represented the Panhandle's 88th District in the Texas Legislature since 1986. During that time he has served on the Agriculture and Livestock, and Human Services Committees, and is regarded as a leader in the block of legislators representing the agriculture and ranching interest.

In announcing his bid for the Congressional seat representing this District, Waterfield said he would devote his time and energy to improving the economic lot of people in the 13th District.

"I have decided to give up my seat in the Texas Legislature and seek this Congressional seat because I am convinced our people deserve better representation than they now have in the U.S. Congress, and that I can give them that representation," he said.

"I will not spend my time agitating for a Congressional pay raise, now or in the future. I will not use the office to feather my own nest. I will, on the other hand, do everything I can to hold down, and reduce the tax burden on our people. And that includes voting to reduce the tax on capital gains. I believe a reduction

in the capital gains tax will be of tremendous benefit to our farmers and ranchers, our small business owners, and homeowners generally. I cannot imagine anyone representing this District voting against a reduction in that tax, but the present incumbent did just that," Waterfield said.

Waterfield said he has

visited with a number of voters from throughout the 13th District before making up his mind to seek the Congressional seat. He also visited with President Bush and U. S. Senator Phil Gramm, he said, and was promised their full cooperation and support in achieving his legislative goals in Congress.

# A CHRISTMAS SAFETY CHECK

Before hanging strings of lights, spread them on the floor and check for frayed or bare wires, cracked insulation, loose connections, and damaged plugs or
light sockets.

Check extension cords for wear or damage and don't run them across walking areas.

lest lights before putting them on the tree. Unplug them before making repairs or replacing bulbs.

Overloading circuits with too many lights can cause fire. Follow manufacturer's instructions about the number of lights allowed on one circuit.

Never string lights on a metallic tree.

Choose a fresh, green tree, trim its base and keep it in plenty of water. If the needles are brown and break off easily, it could be a fire risk.

If you buy an artificial tree, make sure it has been tested for flammability by Underwriters Laboratories (UL).

Always turn off lights before leaving home or going to bed. You'll save money and be safer, too.

Do not use inside lights on the outside All outside lighting equipment, including lights, cords and plugs, should be waterproof and made for outdoor use. Also, hang sockets downward and don't leave a socket empty.

When hanging lights on the rooftop or in tall trees outdoors, stay clear of electrical lines



Groom improved to 6;3 on the season while Miami is now 5;4.

Led by Shannon Fields' 21 points, Groom swept by Miami, 59-41, in the girls' game.

The Tigers broke away late in the first quarter and built a 10-point lead at halftime. The Warriors trimmed the margin to seven points twice in the fourth quarter, but couldn't get any closer.

Groom was led by the hot hand of 6-1 junior Mike Conrad, who was high scorer for both teams with 24 points. Conrad, who hit 10 of 14 field goal attempts and was four of four from the foul line, downed his first eight shots from the floor.

'Our offense is mainly designed around the high post and Conrad took advantage of it last night. He did a good job," said Groom Coach Jay Lamb.

Four other players scored in double-digits for the Tigers, who shot 46.8 percent (22 of 47) from the floor. Jay Britten had 14 points while Brian, Baker, Jeff Fields and Richard Jenkins added 11 points each. Britten also pulled down 10 rebounds.

Sophomore guard Don Howard topped Miami in scoring with 20 points.

Others scoring for Miami were Kyle Fields with eight points, Jason Ott, five Brock Thompson, Melvin Seymour and Clay Mercer, four points each; Aaron McReynolds, Scott Tolbert, Cleve Wheeler and Greg Kauk, two points each.

Wilbur Kemph added one point for Groom.

Groom girls opened up a 40-25 halftime bulge in posting their ninth win against two losses.

"We came out and shot better this game," said Groom coach Jimmy Branch. "We went to the Samnorwood Tournament last week and shot only 18 percent.

We had a meeting when we came back and I told them just to go out there and relax. I was pleased with the way they shot the ball, especialy in the first half."

Following Fields in Groom's scoring attack were Katonia Meaker with 17 points, Kristi Case, 12: Julie Burger, five; Jenni English, two, and Karen Babcock,

# **DPS Predicts 75 To Die During Holidays**

Estimates from the Department of Public Safety indicate that 75 persons may perish on Texas roadways during the upcoming Christ-mas and New Year's holiday periods.

"We expect there could be 40 traffic fatalities reported during the Yuletide watch and 35 more in the New Year's period," said DPS Director Colonel Joe Milner. "Nothing would make us happier than to find out these numbers are much too high. We'll have additional troopers on duty during these hours to help hold down the potentially deadly violations of the traffic

laws."
Each counting period of 78; hours in length. The Christmas watch starts at 6pm Friday, Dec. 22 and ends at midnight Monday (Christmas Day). The New Year's program begins at 6 pm Friday, Dec. 29 and con-cludes at midnight on New

The final number of traffic deaths resulting during the 1988 Christmas period was 42, with another 38 reported over the New Year's hours.

Colonel Milner said the many excellent programs to decrease the DWI problem in Texas have made a difference. But he emphasized the fact that drinking and driving remains at the top of the list in factors causing fatal accidents.

"It is still the number one killer on our roads, in many cases combined with exceeding the speed limit. And it strikes with a ferocity and frequency that cannot be ignored," he stressed. "It's one thing to make a promise not to drive after consuming alcohol, but another to hold to that promise."

Rose 2. In boys action the McLean Cubs fell to the Wheeler Colts by the score of 32-19. The first half saw the game go back and forth with a very



# Report On "Bibles To Communist Nations"

Reverend Mark Wilson. Pastor of the United Methodist Church of McLean, announced at the morning worship service of December 10th, that \$374.86 has been contributed by the congregation for the purpose of purchasing & sending Bibles and New Testaments to the Soviet Union and other communist nations of Eastern Europe. The church's decision to raise money for this purpose came as a result of a historic agreement concluded by the United Bible Societies and representatives of these nations, which permits a combination of 1,000,000 Bibles and New Testaments to be sent into the areas. The Scriptures will, of course, be in the respective language of the various nations. The contribution from the McLean Methodists will be forwarded to the American Bible Society, which is engaged in an urgent effort to raise the funds needed to provide the Bibles and New Testaments.

Reverend Wilson noted that by virtue of having contributed at least \$300.00, enough to provide a combination of 100 Bibles and New Testaments, the church has qualified to have its name included in a book entitled, "Friends of Faith," which will be presented by the American Bible Society to high church officials in Russia who played key roles in negotiating the agreement, which opened the doors to the Scriptures.

He further announced that by virtue of having made contributions of at least \$30.00, the following organizations in the church will be entitled to have their names included in the American Bible Society's, "Book of Appreciation." Builder's Sunday School Class, Friend ship Sunday School Class. The New Life Sunday School Class of the McLean Nursing Center, the Win-some Sunday School Class, the Sunday School's Youth Division, and the Susannah Wesley Chapter of the United Methodist Women.

As a conclusion to the worship service, Reverend Wilson led the congregation in a special ceremony in which all present formed a circle around the audito-

rium, and each member held a lighted candle to signify the increased light that is now to be permitted through the Scriptures to shine in nations where for so long the Holy Word has been muted and efforts made to keep its light all but extinguished. He further offered thanks for the favorable changes that have recently been occurring in many of these nations, changes which have resulted in the granting of permission for the Scriptures to be provided.

In addition to this project, the McLean United Methodist Church has sent cards to the Soviet Union in conjunction with the 1,000th Anniversary of the Russian Orthodox Church, had one of its young people, Dollie Haynes, participate in a mission trip to the Soviet Union, and sent a contribution to the Soviet Republic of Armenia to help with relief works occasioned by the tragic earthquake there.

Friday night Dec. 15th the Lighthouse Church groups visited the McLean Care Center. Christmas Carol's were sang, Christmas bags were given to each resident.

We appreciate everyones donations in order for the bags to be prepared.


