Pursualt to the settlement, while not admitting liability, Southwestern Bell, the other local exchange telephone companies in Texas, and AT\&T Communications of the Southwest, Inc. have agreed to pay refunds to those WATS/800 customers who paid overtime charges attr ibutable to the rounding practices for intrastate WATS/800 services at any time between September, 1976, and February, 1987. The refunds will be based upon either the actual or estimated amount of overtime charges attributable to such rounding practices. An exact refund will be determined for customers able to produce copies of their WATS/ 300 service bills. For customers who do not have copies of their WATS/800 service bills to establish actual overtime charges paid, an average refund of $\$ 4.53$ to $\$ 5.95$ per WATS $/ 800$ service line per month will be applied. All claims will be subject to verification. The refunds will also include interest at the rate of $7.80 \%$ per annum. Claim Forms And Additional Information
