Sorghum Residues Help Protect Soil

Now is a good time to consider how we will manage our sorghum residues to help protect the land from wind and water erosion.

Crop Residue Use is a term or conservation practice where residues are left on the surface through the critical erosion period—about April when when residues are followed by a spring planted crop and about Aug. 15 when followed by a fall seeded crop.

Residues may be left undisturbed, shredded, mowed or knocked down by a stalk cutter. Normally, loose residues need to be "tucked in" by tillage to prevent blowing away. Normally, residue left standing will catch and hold more snow.

On irrigated land it is usually desirable to shred the stalks in late winter and disk them into the soil surface. This will help to protect the land from blowing following late winter snows and rains.


