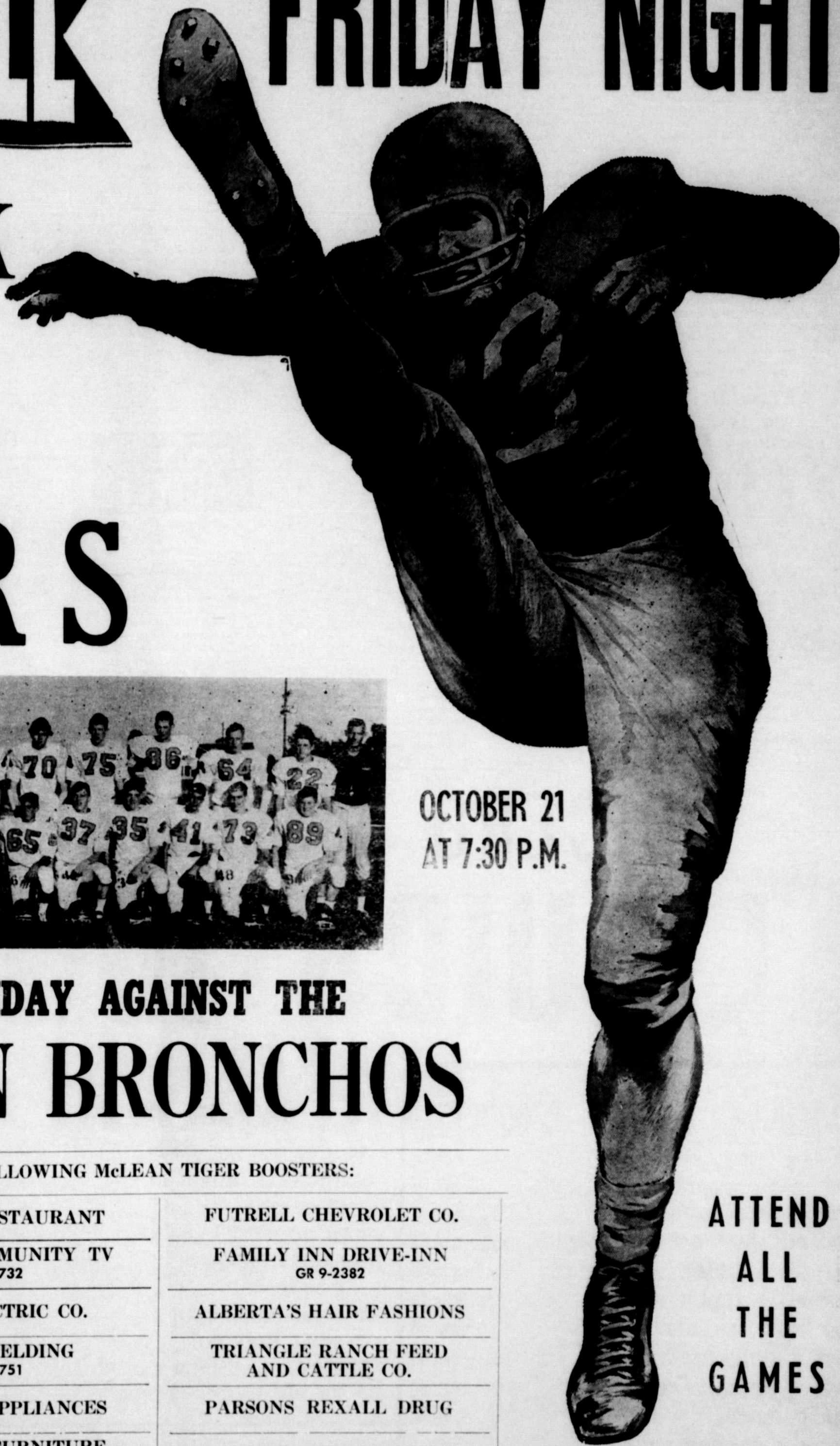

Moisture Content Of Seed Cotton Key to Good Quality

The moisture content of seed cotton is the key to preserving fiber quality during ginning. Fiber breakage is the major adverse effect of ginning on quality, and the degree of such breakage is directly related to the moisture content of the cotton at the gin stand. For maximum quality preservation, the USDA Ginning Research Laboratories recommend that moisture content during ginning be kept in the range of 6½ to 8 per cent. Fiber breakage increases progressively as moisture content is reduced below these levels. When fibers are broken in ginning or ruptured so that they break in initial mill processing, there is an appreciable loss in use value. This is because length properties directly affect yarn strength, mill processing performance, and the amount of manufacturing waste. Length properties also determine the size yarn which can be made from a given cotton. From the grower's standpoint, length is a principal factor that determines price. It also exerts a strong influence on the demand for cotton from a given area and on whether a premium will be offered or how much premium is paid. The National Cotton Council stresses that moisture content of cotton should be checked at frequent intervals to make sure it is maintained at 6½ to 8 per cent levels during ginning. The operation of a pulpwad truck represents an average of \$25,000 annual business to the community in which it operates.

Bird Habitat Seen As Woodpecker Aid

These bird watchers do get around and see things. Two of them, signing their names as "Marjorie and Red Adams," penned an appreciative note to the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department after visiting Palo Duro Canyon State Park in the Texas Panhandle and noting its "wildlife and bird sanctuary."

"We were delighted," they wrote, "in the several days we parked our 22-foot travel trailer there to find birds quite abundant. . . . In particular, we were pleased to see wild habitat allowed to remain wild, which meant ample dead timber for woodpeckers and other hole-nesting birds to find homes. Never have we seen more red-headed woodpeckers. They are growing scarcer in some areas because of 'neat' habitat with no dead trees."

A "dusty" concrete condition can be corrected by hardening the surface with a zinc sulphate solution. Mix powdered zinc sulphate—three pounds to one gallon of water—and pour mixture over the floor. Antlerless Bonus Tags Restricted

The Texas Parks and Wildlife Department cautioned sportsmen that the third deer tag, or bonus tag on this year's hunting license is **ONLY** for use on an antlerless deer.

The license bears an extra tag because of the three-deer allowance made in some counties in a special effort to reduce the herd surplus in heavily populated areas.

The usual two tags, attached by perforated paper to the right end of the license, are intended for buck deer but also bear a notation on the back validating their use for antlerless deer.

The department makes no restriction as to how the two regular tags are used, when attached to legally taken game.

But the third tag, attached to the left side of the license, is designated exclusively for a bonus antlerless deer. It is so labeled and may **NOT** be used for a buck deer.

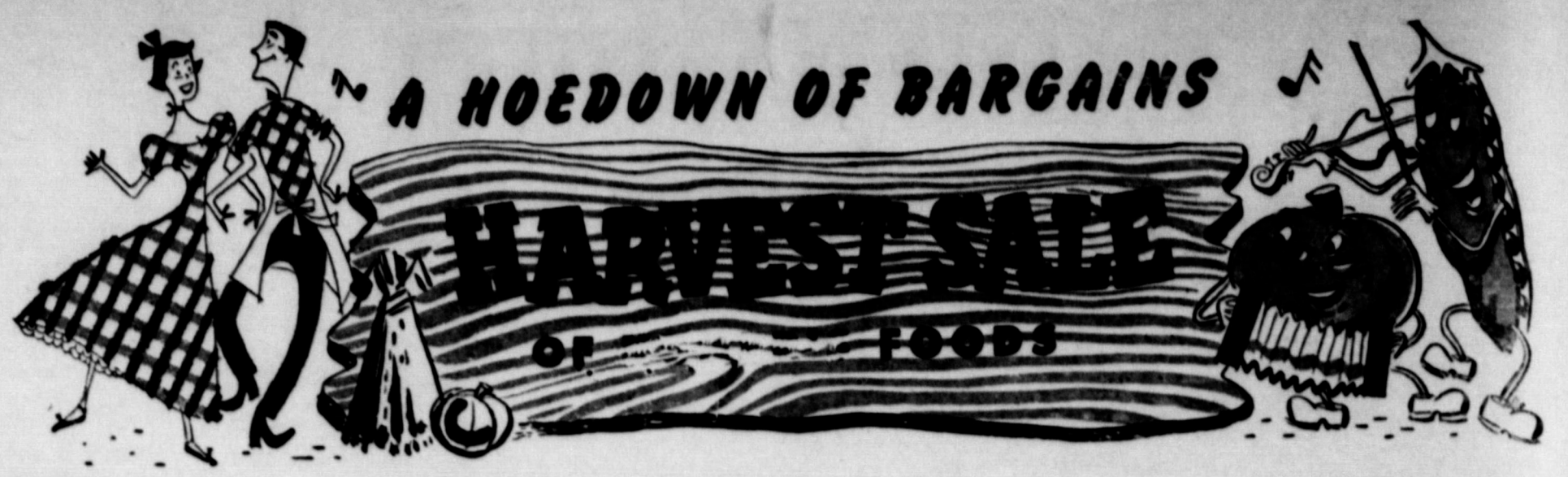
The department advised hunters in any event, whether the regular license tags are used or the bonus tag is used for an antlerless deer, the antlerless deer can be legally taken only by permit.

That is, persons using a tag on an antlerless deer bonus tag or the regular tag, must have a signed permit on their person authorizing the harvesting of an antlerless deer.

The caution was considered vital since Texas is earmarking a record number of antlerless deer for harvesting as a means of cutting range overpopulation.

BOLT KILLS BIRDS

A Jacksonville school teacher reported to the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department a bolt of lightning struck a back yard tree and killed 127 birds. The victims were mostly English sparrows. There were also a few blackbirds.
