

Initially, however, the plant will process a minimum of 8 million cubic feet of residue gas per day, and on or before Jan. 1, 1967, the rate will be increased to its ultimate capacity. In addition to residue gas, the plant will process and sell propane, butane and condensate.

The gathering system, which will extend more than 24 miles through the Ozona field, will deliver gas initially from 17 completions in 12 wells to the new plant, Pauley stated. Pauley Petroleum Inc., has an approximate 50 per cent interest in 40,000 acres in the field an din the 12 completed wells.
