> sold last year. The wool incentive pay level was but a fraction of a percentage point below last year's figure of 65.8, indicating an almost level nationwide price for wool last year with the year before. Mohair, on the other hand, showed an improved price return to the grower, the 1968 incentive figure dropping from the previous year's 86.8 percent to 71.2 for the 1968 marketing year.

The total payment, being disbursed this week from the local ASCS office, to Crockett county ranchers will be \$931,664 against last year's

producers and 168 wool producers (these figures overlapping, of course, since many ranchers run both sheep

and goats.) Crockett county ranchers sold a total of 1,972,752 pounds of wool last year, the lowest volume of production pile up enough points for a 2,119,601 pounds which brought \$889,886.


Flimsy as a Kite
