

### BUICK valve-in-head engine is being added to the chassis in the cture above. Previous to this step assembly, the chassis started as a bare frame. Body brackets and running board brackets were riveted on, exles, torque tube, cantilever springs,

etc. were instened in place by auto-matic tools, as the chassis moved slowly forward along the assembly line on an endless conveyor. The engine is fastened to the frame at three points. This type of suspen-

on, with the single, automatically bricated universal joint, takes up

stresses and torsional twists and de-livers the power directly to the rear wheels. Here the torque tube comes into play, taking the strain of driving away from the rear springs so that the engine is in effect pulling the car

As the car moves forward after receiving the engine, other important parts are added. The wheels are placed on the axles and the four-wheel brakes adjusted. The radiator is put into place and connected. The front fenders, mud guards and running boards are fastened to the chassis.

Editorially speaking, we seldom have anything to say.

Mosquitos are becoming so numerous as to become a trial to the residents of the town, who find their sleep broken at night by the bites and buzzings of the pesky things. As a means of ridding the town of the insects, we suggest that all weeds be cut from around the premises, see that all stagmant and standing water is either removed or a film of oil poured over it, and see that all cosspools and sewers are not harboring the insects. Silly campaign issues, mudsling-ing and crooked politicians have made the State a je ke to the rest of the world, and Dan Moody has the chance of a lifetime to earn the respect of Texas people by giving us a couple of real administrations of State affairs free of shady deals and questionable policies. Four years of the right kind of executive control will go a long way toward restoring the State to its former

#### Moody Wins Out

Dallas, Aug. 2.— Dan Moody won the Texas gubernatorial nomination in the recent primary by a majority of 1,013 votes over his five opponents complete and revised unofficial returns to the Texas Election Bureau show tonight.

Returns to the bureau from 252 out of 252 counties in the State all complete, showed the following totals for candidates for State offices: Governor—Moody, 411,390; Ferguson 281,-939; Davidson. 123,025; Zimmerman 2,910; Wilmons 1498; Johnson 1,006.

When returns from Fisher county the last county reporting were tabulated tonight the total vote for Governor stood at 821,-767 raising Moody's majority to the new figure.
