"There is no duty we so much underestimate," says Stevenson, "as the duty of being happy. By being happy, we sow anonymous benefits upon the world which remain unknown even to ourselves; or, when they are disclosed, surprise nobody so much as the benefactor. A happy man or woman is a better thing to find than a fivepound note. He or she is a radiating focus of good will, and their entrance into a room is as though another candle had been lighted."

It is strange that contentment should not be more widespread. considering how very common and close at hand are the elements that go into it.

Work is one big ingredient. Simple tastes-the power of finding great satisfaction in little things -is another.

The power to take things as they come, and enjoy them to the limit, is another. St. Paul, for instance, did a good-sized job, and left a shining record.


