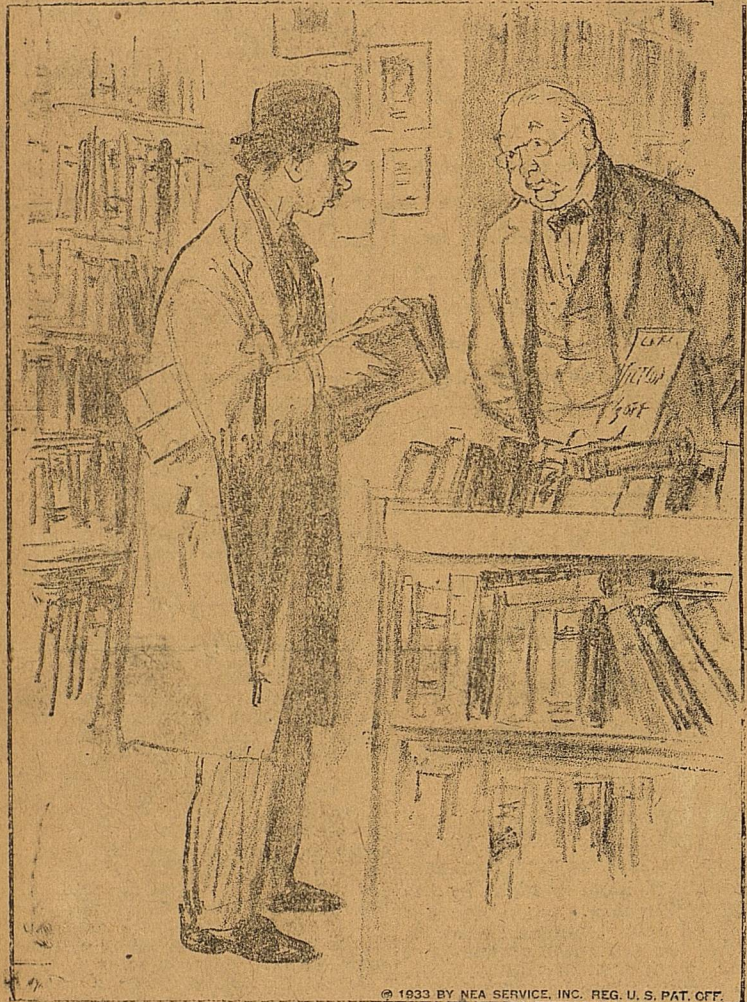
BANDIT OR PATRIOT?

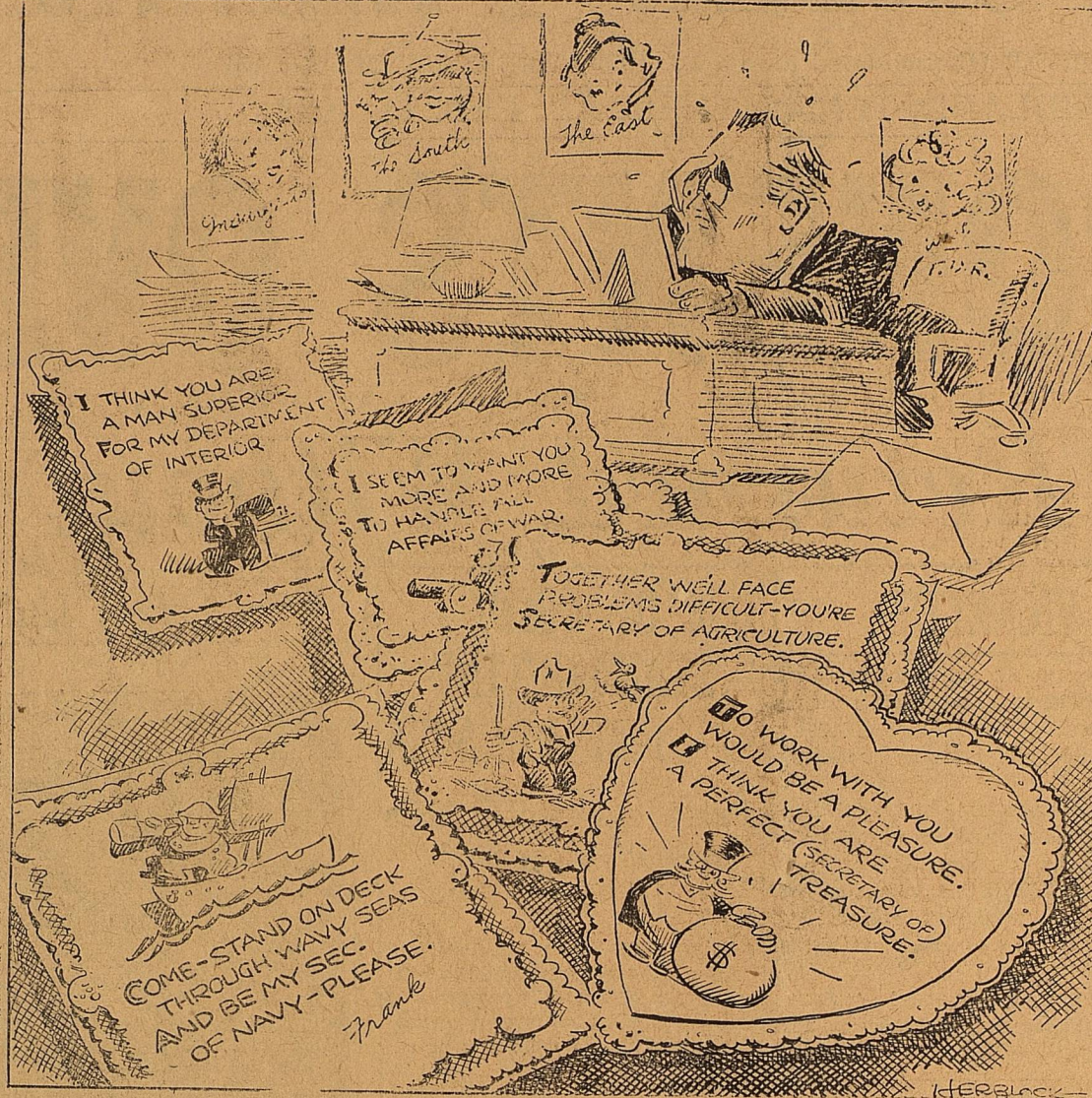

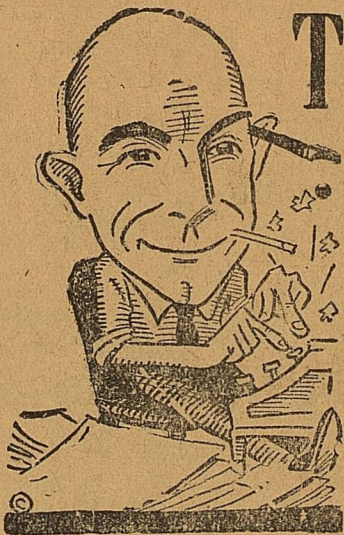

Currency issued in lieu thereof will circulate because hoarded it shows no profit. No one could say that such currency would have a less basis for value than do the bonds have. Inflation would be useless unless on a plan that would put it immediately into all communities. Incidentally the plan would save the government considerably more than 500 million dollars per year in interest obligations.

Dear Sir: Recently I addressed the following plan to all national congressmen and senators.

Regardless of what the claim may be there is not more than \$12 or \$15 per capita money in circulation. One needs but know conditions over his own state to realize the absolute necessity of money inflation. A number of bases have been suggested, some of which are sound. Permit me to suggest the following:

Provide a temporary moratorium on federal farm loans; require federal farm banks to call their bonds and issue currency against their land notes in lieu thereof; permit this new medium to be loaned on unincumbered real estate; and to re-finance distressed real estate where the equity permits at a low rate of interest; at intervals, issue additional currency under approval of the board; real estate, our basic wealth, will undoubtedly provide a safe basis for the issue.

After allowing a reasonable time for exchange, provide that interest accrues on liberty and treasury bonds; that these bonds be called and held in the treasury, uncancelled; this currency delivered in lieu thereof;

Direct the immediate purchase of all available silver billion at prices available, take it in payment of the debt of foreign countries where possible; provide exchange in foreign countries of cotton and other commodities of the farm board for silver; then provide a basis for the issuance of silver certificates.

Twenty-five per cent of the 42 billion dollars now on deposit in all banks of the nation is invested in the bonds above mentioned—frozen.

Every wholesale and retail nursery would suffer a great loss, every grower of cotton, citrus fruit and other industries, by failure in the past to properly prevent and control injurious insect pests. To weaken this department at this time would be exceedingly unwise. The public should be protected from the various pests in Texas for some time, every nursery has been warned, and every effort has been put forth to stamp out all enemies to plant life, and much and lasting good has been accomplished. Now if we abolish the inspection law, or turn it over to some educational institution who could not or would not enforce it as it was intended, the department of agriculture, what would be the outcome?

Mother Earth Meteor Target

LOS ANGELES. (UP) — Mother Earth, the most long-suffering, if unsmiling, clay pigeon on record! The old lady has a history of targethood that makes the famous tin plates of Annie Oakley look like new merchandise.

According to Dr. Clyde Fisher, curator of astronomy at the Museum of Natural History, the earth's whirling through space these many millions of years has exposed it many times over to the aimless trajectories of speeding meteors, all of which have crashed into oblivion against her sturdy sides.

The great meteoric crater of Arizona, believed to contain some 12,000,000 tons of meteoric iron, is an example of one of these cosmic collisions.

"The earth has received many such visitors," he said, "and in time will receive many more."

"Most astronomers now are agreed that the craters on the moon are the result of the impact of meteorites on the moon, rather than of volcanic origin. Because the moon has no moisture, and there can be no erosion, the craters remain as they are made."

"There is ample evidence that the world has been struck many times by giant meteors and that erosion has washed away the signs."

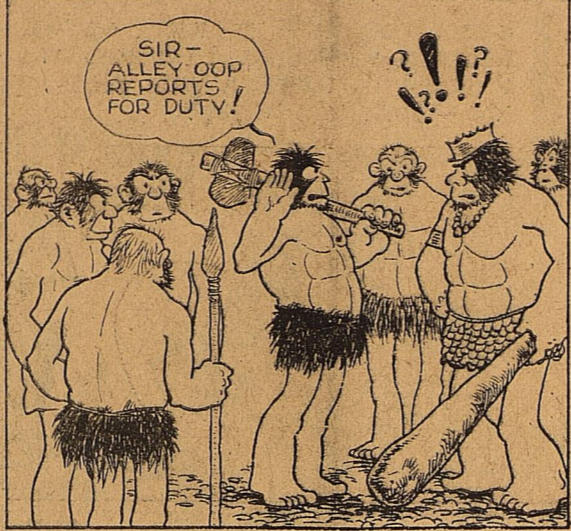
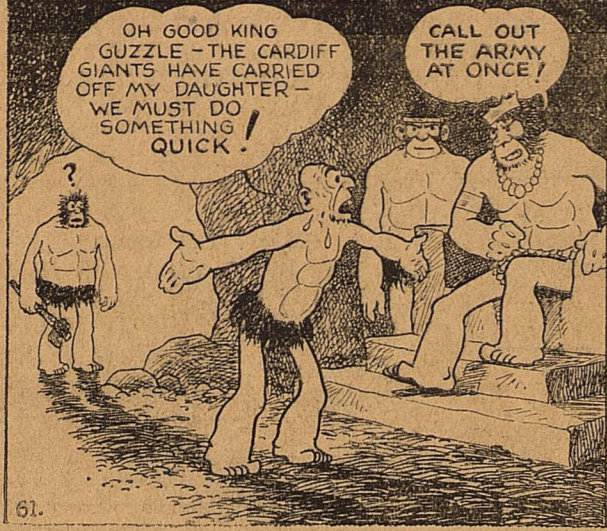
