
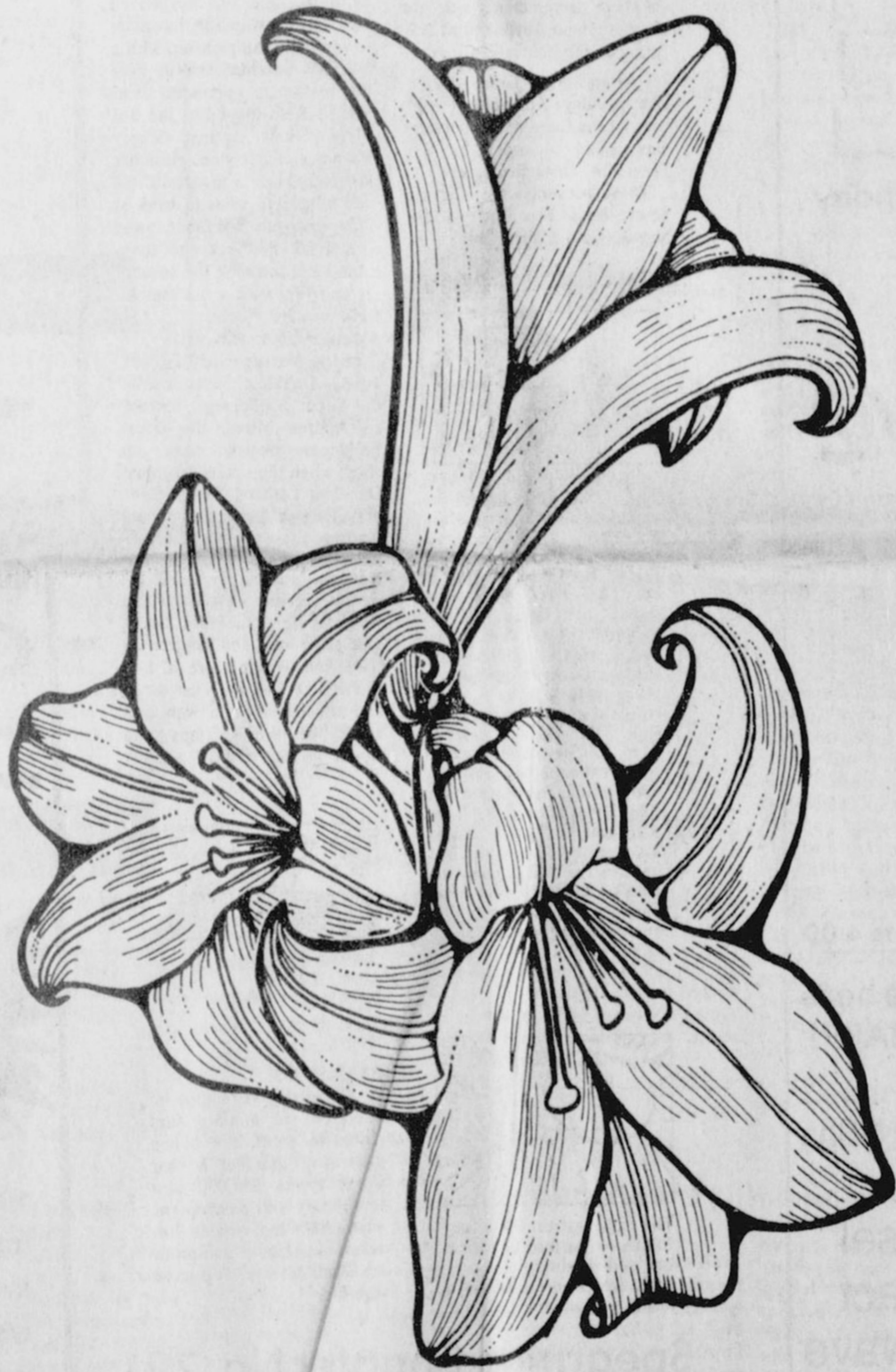

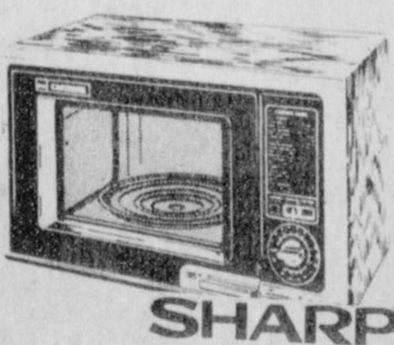

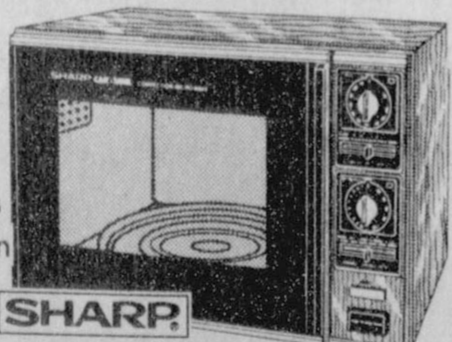

Midway Island, June 6, 1942. The Allies halted the Japanese advance across the Pacific. And back in Oakland, Penn. was a young man, Edgar Hutton. He quietly sprayed his roses. Experts give tax advice

Don't miss those

COLLEGE STATION — In the time of year when Uncle Sam asks adherence to honesty as millions of us file our income taxes, two Texas A&M University business experts offer advice for those filling out long forms.

"Before filing, first check with an accountant, tax consultant or a representative of the Internal Revenue Service for possible changes in tax laws," advises Dr. Charles Maurice, head of the Department of Economics at Texas A&M.

Maurice said because tax laws often change, long forms could be confusing — particularly for those being pushed by inflation into higher income tax brackets who want to reduce the amount of taxes they will pay.

"Frequently people don't know what they can claim against their income," Maurice said, "and some pass up deductions simply because they don't know tax laws."

Although most Americans will file the 1040A, or short form, this year, those who choose the long-form route, the 1040, will fill out an average of two to three additional forms. While the total number of forms is over 30, there are about six or seven most commonly attached to the 1040, said Dr. Clair Nixon, professor of accounting at Texas A&M.

"The object of filing taxes is for individuals and businesses

to accurately declare income or losses," Nixon said. "The incentive is for people to get their due return or pay a due amount without being fined or penalized for mistakes or false statements. The government counts on us being honest."

He explained deductions commonly overlooked include travel, medical and charitable expenses. Other deductions are local and federal tax preparation expenses, interest expenses, theft and damage to property.

"People often deduct vacations as business travel expenses because they make them business-related trips," he said. "When you drive, it's easier to take the whole family."

Traveling to and from a doctor's office, pharmacy or hospital can also be deducted, as can travel expenses incurred when working for the church or a charitable organization such as the Red Cross.

Though many families will declare one income, an increasing number of families will declare two.

"That will cost them more in taxes," Nixon said, adding, however, he doesn't advocate "living together" for a tax break.

"In some instances married couples can expect revenue back in addition to their tax refund," he said. "This applies to couples with one or more children making less than \$10,000 a year."

City Council

Newcomers Seated; Ingle Pro-tem Mayor

At the regular meeting of the Spearman city council, Tuesday night, a public hearing on zoning, consideration of bids, regular reports and getting the council organized after installing three new members, made for a lengthy agenda.

In organizing the council, Ray Ingle was named to act as mayor pro tem (pro tem is the colloquial expression used for the term that literally means "for the time being...") in the absence of

Spearman Mayor Ralph Blodgett.

Members of the council then conducted a public hearing on four requests to rezone specific locations within the city. Three were approved and one denied. Three of the petitions were for mobile home residential zoning and one for general commercial operation.

The first petition of the four was denied. It was a request to make lots 1-12, block 63 of the original town of Spearman open

to mobile home residences.

Approved for this purpose were lots 4-6, block 33, original township and a 60 by 140 foot section of the west half of outlot 12, Spearman.

Approved for general commercial enterprise was the north half of outlot 13, Spearman.

Denial of one of the petitions necessitates an amendment to the amendment granting the zoning changes. This is purely a "red tape" matter.

The council had taken under consideration the taking of bids on a grass lease involving 86.3 acres of city property located next to the Spearman golf course.

This item was tabled. The contract between the city of Spearman and the Hansford County Library for providing library service to city residents was renewed and the stipened the city pays toward library operation was upped to \$500.

Ray O'Herron, Danville, Ill.,

was the successful bidder in supplying the Spearman Police Department with two light bars for patrol vehicles. The low figure was \$510 each for a total of \$1,020.

Fire Appliance Co. of Texas was the successful bidder for 1,000 feet of three-inch fire hose with a figure of \$2,430.

The job of conducting a gas leak survey of the municipal gas system went for the low bid of \$2,700.

E.J. Copeland, Helen Etter

and Vicky Bullard were reappointed to the Planning and Zoning Commission. L.L. Anthony and Verlin Behne were to the Electrical Board of Examiners for two years, while Eddie Clemmons and Ed Garner were named to the Disaster Committee.

The Remainder of the action agenda had to do with consideration of the routine monthly reports of various departments of city government and approval of payment of current bills.

School Trustees Organize

Salient points on the agenda of the Spearman Independent School District board of trustees regular meeting Tuesday night, were organization of the panel following elections, teacher resignations as the end of the school year approaches and a look at various reports that are a matter for consideration at ever session.

The board canvassed the votes cast in the recent election for places open and officially declared winners.

Following the canvass, the panel organized naming Jim Davis, president; Kent Guthrie, vice president and Tom Latta, secretary.

Resignations were accepted from Pam McMullin, Mollie Holton, Le Ann Josephson, Ramona Sims and Miriam Mercer.

Among the reports considered and other action items, it was noted that the girls bi-district basketball game garnered \$692.30.

In other action, the board approved renewal of the communications agreement with the local Classroom Teachers Association (CTA) and approved the superintendent's request to attend the I.D.E.A. Institute, July 12-18.

All other routine reports were approved and before adjournment, these important dates were noted: the FFA Banquet, May 4 and the Athletic Banquet, May 5.

Speeders beware: highway patrolmen sharpen radar skills

COLLEGE STATION — Drivers who fudge on posted speed limits will soon face increased odds of being ticketed for speeding, say law enforcement training officials for the Texas Engineering Extension Service (TEEX).

Texas highway patrolmen are going back to school on the Texas A&M University campus to learn how to use radar speed measurement equipment.

The course is a result of a recent Florida court case, in which a speeding citation based on radar measurement was thrown out. The defense proved to the court that the equipment was improperly calibrated and operated.

The radar operators course offered by TEEX's Law Enforcement and Security Training Division will instruct officers on scientific principles and theory of technology. Factors that can limit the accuracy and effectiveness of radar equipment will be emphasized along with operating procedures to circumvent or minimize the factors.

Other departments include lawn and garden supplies, housewares, toys, appliances, sporting goods, plumbing and electrical items, which will be carried in stock or may be ordered from the HWI catalog. Deliveries are made each Monday from the Distribution Center in Waco, Texas. Special orders can be delivered during the week in which the order is placed, if the item is ordered before Thursday.

Ben & Tim have been assigned as the Area Supervisors for the local firm. Their responsibilities include employee training, inventory control, management training, and product knowledge training. In addition, training meetings are conducted periodically in Waco, Texas for specialized instruction of all phases of retailing.

Hoobler is 1981 PM Pioneer Queen

GUYMON, OKLAHOMA - A Pioneer Hooker, Oklahoma housewife, Mrs. Arthur "Essie" Hoobler has been chosen as 1981 Pioneer Queen to reign over the 51st Annual Pioneer Days of No Man's Land Celebration the first weekend in May.

Mrs. Hoobler was selected for this honor after being nominated by 12 individuals and clubs from Hooker and Texas County according to Al Jackson, chairman of the Old Timers Committee.

Pioneer Queen Essie Hoobler said "We must keep busy and I do that by sewing, quilting, church work and visiting in my community. But I do also enjoy staying at home." (Since 1971 she has made 195 quilts.)

"I was born January 3, 1898 in Jasper County, Illinois the oldest of 10 children to Daniel and Bertha (Fouty) Hampsten. I attended school at Round Prairie Illinois School and in December 1905 at eight years of age I came to Hooker with my parents. The entire Panhandle was then old Beaver County.

The ride on the train to the Oklahoma Panhandle was my first and I enjoyed it very much. When we arrive and headed by wagon to my father's claim, which was 5 1/2 miles west of Hooker, all I could see was earth and sky. There were no trees, scarcely any houses and only a few dugouts. Many of the pioneers lived in dugouts until they could afford to build a house.

There were big prairie fires caused when the men would burn off their fields to clear the land for farming and the fires would get out of control.

My two brothers and I went to a subscription school, taught by Mrs. Jacobs, eight miles north of Hooker for a while. We later attended Lemon School which was a dugout. The Lemon School was later consolidated with Hooker. (A subscription school was financed by parents paying the teacher.)

The winds blew and dry weather came and my father became dissatisfied, sold out, and moved to West Plains, Missouri for only a few months.

We then moved to Woodward County, Oklahoma for a short period and then returned to Texas County and have been here ever since.

I remember moving to the Panhandle by covered wagon. The old cow would trot along behind the first wagon and the dogs Old Curly and True would swim across the streams. My brothers felt they would drown but they always got across.

My 5 brothers are Roy Hampsten (deceased), Cecil Hampsten (deceased), Floyd Hampsten of Alva, Lester and Otis Hampsten, both of Hooker. My 4 sisters are Stella Griffin (deceased), Sadie Nash, Bessie Herald, and Geneva Ray all of Hooker. My father, Daniel Hampsten passed away in 1953 and my mother, Bertha Hampsten passed away in 1969.

We settled in the Lemon Community of Texas County where I met and married Arthur Hoobler in 1916. We lived on our farm for almost 30 years where our three children were born. They are Arden, Eileen and Arthena. Arden Hoobler

lives on the place where he was born. Eileen Purcell lives in Hooker and Arthena Witt lives at Flagler, Colorado.

I never did anything special, only tried to be a good farmer's wife, milking cows, feeding calves and hogs, and raising chickens and turkeys. We lived in a two room house the first two years of our married life.

We lived through the Great Depression and the Dust Bowl days and I remember selling eggs for 10 cents a dozen and year old calves for \$9.00. But the rains finally came again, followed by good crops of milo, broomcorn, and feed for the cattle and horses.

My husband Arthur loved to farm with horses, so when we bought the first tractor he turned the farming over to our son Arden, who is still farming the same land.

Arthur passed away in 1973 after 57 years of happy married life. We moved into Hooker in 1945, where I still live.

I am a charter member of the Church of Christ and I certainly enjoy my 10 grandchildren and 10 great grandchildren. We are expecting two more this year."

Professors bring creative techniques to Tarleton classes

STEPHENVILLE -- Teachers at Tarleton State University say they are using innovative but effective new techniques to reach students.

Dr. Donald Zelman, assistant professor of social science, has each class research, write and present a play on historical topics with students portraying historical characters--set in actual events.

Sue Eddings, assistant professor of English, routinely has students bring a small object to class and write a descriptive definition of the object.

Summer, fall storms boost rainfall reading

COLLEGE STATION -- Allen couldn't do it. Danielle couldn't do it. Even the rampage that shook Roscoe couldn't do it alone. But together, they succeeded.

On the heels of one of the driest summers ever recorded, heavy showers have boosted July-through-September rainfall averages above normal for half the state and to near-normal levels for most of the rest, according to the State Climatologist's Office at Texas A&M University.

The climatologists credited heavy rains from Hurricane Allen in early August, Tropical Storm Danielle in early September and a wet cold front in late September for the change, but warned against interpreting the rains as a permanent end to the dry spell.

Public Exam

Postmaster T. Ray Robertson has announced that the Clerk-Carrier entrance examination will be opened to the public April 22, 1981, at 8:00 a.m. and will close to the public April 29, 1981, at 4:00 p.m., and urged that all those interested apply to take the job-related test that can lead to Postal employment.

"We have not opened our register in quite some time and an examination of it has lead us to believe that it is out of date, and that many of the names on the register are people who have moved or for some reason are no longer available to take postal jobs," Postmaster Robertson said.

"I do not want to give the impression we will be hiring great numbers of people in the coming months," the Postmaster said. "I anticipate approximately 1 vacancy will occur in the next two years that will be filled by hiring people from our up-dated job register. We need qualified people who will be willing to accept employment, and we want to offer people in the local community the chance to compete for these openings by signing up for and taking the exams."

Postmaster Robertson explained those wishing to take the exam could be contacting Postmaster, in person, Post Office, Spearman, TX during the period April 22, 1981, 8:00 a.m. through April 29, 1981, 5:00 p.m.

Starting salaries for Clerk/Carriers, Part-Time, PS-5 is \$9.05 per hour to start with steps taking rate up to \$10.38 per hour over an eight year period. The great majority of new hires are as part-time who are paid at these hourly rates. The hourly rates are just about equivalent to the annual salaries but do not include pay for 9 holidays that full time employees get.

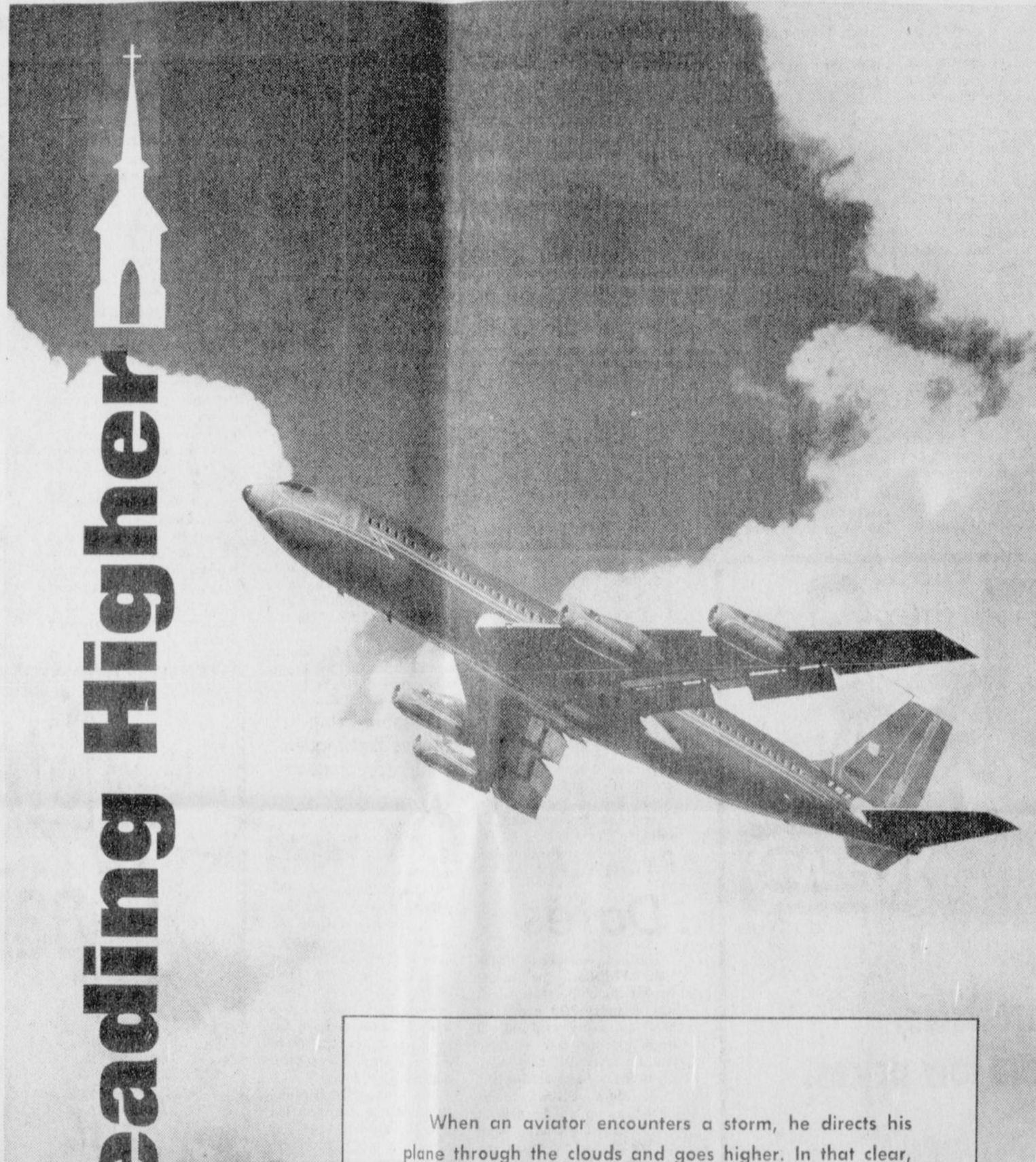
