



Council removes portable signs

The portable yellow-and-black speed limit signs are gone from the Spearman elementary-junior high school zones.

The decision was made by the Spearman city council in regular session Tuesday night, along with action on bids for airport hanger leasing and an executive session to discuss litigation.

For the deeply concerned about safety within the school zones of the city, discard of the portable signs may be a cause for anxiety. For the careless or the unskilled driver, their demise is, probably, a cause for rejoicing.

But use of the signs was cancelled by regulations originating outside the bounds of the city of Spearman. It seems they did not meet state requirements regarding color, size nor placement. School zone speed regulatory signs must be black on white and they must be mounted so that the bottom edge of the sign is at least seven feet above the roadway to be controlled.

Following this action, Spearman Police Chief Ron Robinson was quick to emphasize that this action did NOT change the speed limits within school zones and their enforcement.

The maximum speed in a Spearman school zone is 15 miles-per-hour and is in effect 24 hours per day. The time element was adopted some time ago for two specific reasons: the number of activities other than regular school class sessions at the schools, requiring safety precautions and the need to avoid confused thinking on the part of motorists in the vicinity of the schools.

So, you will still think -- and DRIVE -- only 15 mph at all times within school zones.

The larger part of the agenda and the time spent treating on it surrounded the new municipal airport. Apparently, council action at the last regular session setting a closing date for the old airport and the opening of the new one did not bring the expected end to the controversy that has surrounded the project from its inception.

Members of the council present met with city attorneys in

an executive session lasting one hour and seven minutes to discuss what Vice Chairman Ray Ingle, presiding, termed "--possible litigation concerning the airport" and noted that "--no action was taken by the council during the closed session."

--Which is a good thing because statute forbids any action in an executive session. A governing body so meeting can only discuss a matter and arrive at a consensus. Any action growing out of such a session must be taken after the august body has reconvened in open meeting.

No information was given as to the nature of the possible litigation discussed -- whether the city was considering suing or was about to be sued.

The other airport matter was in open session and was a consideration of bids for a true lease financing method for four six-unit T-hangers at the new Spearman municipal airport.

Notices were sent to 12 possible bidding firms. Only two -- one from Denver and one from Dallas -- responded. There was a response from another firm not on the mailing but which expressed an interest in bidding but did not learn of the bidding in time to officially submit figures.

Bidding involved the interest rate on the true leasing method for specified periods of 10, 12 and 18 years. The Denver firm bid 14.94 percent for either 10 or 12 year periods. No bid was submitted for 18 years.

The Dallas firm submitted an alternate bid for seven years with the interest rate for this period 13.84 percent.

This was the lowest bid but councilmen did not feel they could "live" with a period less than 10 years and make the true leasing hanger project feasible. The matter was tabled for further study with one alternative in the future, the possible rejection of bids and a new advertising.

Remainder of the business transacted by members of the panel was of a routine nature.

Mayor Ralph Blodgett and Councilman Ed Garner were absent.

Absentee Voting Underway

Absentee voting is underway for the second Democratic primary election to be held on June 5. Absentee voting will run through Tuesday, June 1, at the county clerk's office.

There are no local contests in the run-off election. State races are for Attorney General, Land Commissioner and two places on the Court of Criminal Appeals. In the Attorney General runoff are John H. Hannah, Jr., and Jim Maddox; Land Commissioner candidates are W.E. 'Pete' Snelson and Garry Mauro.

Two state contests, for Governor and for State Treasurer, were eliminated from the June 5 ballot when runoff candidates withdrew. Buddy Temple in the Governor's race and State Treas-

urer Warren G. Harding in his effort for re-election.

These two withdrawals left Attorney General Mark White unopposed for the Demo nomination for Governor, and Ann Richards of Austin, a former Travis county commissioner, without opposition for the nomination as treasurer.

Democratic party chairman Carl Archer stated that their will be consolidated voting places in each precinct of the county. These will be announced as soon as a decision is made.

County Clerk Amelia Johnson stated that no one had voted absentee since the voting began on May 26. Remember if you will not be in the county June 5, you need to vote absentee by June 1.

Phone rate hike effective June 4

Claiming losses in excess of \$4-million per month, General Telephone Company of the Southwest has notified Spearman city government and telephone subscribers that a higher rate will be charged effective June 4.

That is the word from George A. Hudson, district manager at Perryton on a company letterhead.

Where the current one-party residential cost per month is \$6.95, June 4, the cost will be advanced to \$7.60 per month. The \$18.30 business phone rate will advance to \$20.05.

This is a lesser increase than GTE is asking from the PUC. They want an increase to \$8.30 for a one-party residential service and \$22.00 for a business phone.

It should be remembered that many aspects of a residential phone service included in the

total bill in times past, will cost the subscriber in addition to the monthly service rate.

According to Hudson's notice to Spearman Mayor Ralph C. Blodgett, the company can do this under rules established by the Texas legislature whereby a utility can place rates in effect 125 days after filing a request if final action has not been taken.

By those legislative rules, the company must cover this rate increase with a bond to guarantee a refund should the Public Utilities Commission (PUC) fail to grant the increase.

There is only one bright spot in this entire arrangement for the private subscribers: if the PUC grants a higher rate -- which is what GTE has requested, the company cannot come back and charge the customer the difference between the rate effective June 4 and a higher rate that might be granted.

County sets date for budget hearing

Hansford County commissioners made short shrift of an equally short agenda at their second regular monthly session of commissioners court.

As the commissioners court, they authorized publication of upcoming budget hearings for the next fiscal year. These will be conducted at the regular session of the court June 14. These hearings must begin well in advance of the start of the new fiscal year in order that all persons concerned with the formulation of the budget might be heard -- and in time to meet all statutory requirements for

preliminary drafts, drafts, revisions and amendments set forth in classic "gobbledgeek."

The panel also agreed to concentrate on a study of conditions pertaining to the actual laying of pipelines along easements sought by due process from the court. Actual action taken on this matter after deliberative study will have to do with the physical construction rules and requirements rather than any tightening of the process of obtaining such easements on county property. The court voted to renew

insurance coverage on the courthouse with Brock Insurance Agency.

Remaining considerations acted upon in this Monday session of the court had to do with the routine response to reports and other items pertaining to the day-to-day operation of county business.

The court convenes every second and fourth Monday in the conference room of the offices of County Judge R.L. McClellan. The public is invited to every session of the commissioners court.

Fire Department Receives Check

The Spearman Volunteer Fire Department received a check for \$150.00 recently from Texas Farm Bureau Insurance Companies as an expression of thanks for the Department's work on the property of Don Hendricks.

The money will be used for their loss prevention program. The Texas Farm Bureau Insurance Companies pay fire

departments this amount when the department works at a fire in rural areas, involving property insured by them.

The Insurance Company believes fire departments have contributed to reduce the amount of loss involved by fire and more importantly, to prevent fires. It is their hope this money will help the Spearman Volunteer Fire Department in their program.

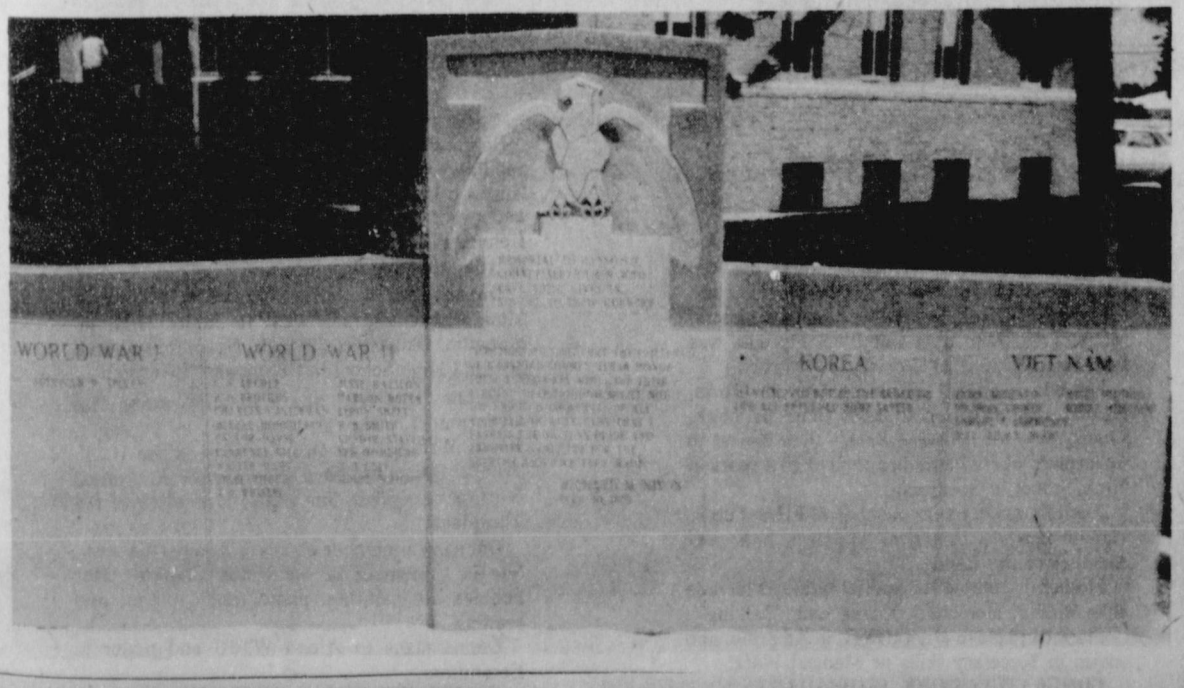
Mr. Patterson was born in Quail. He had lived in Hansford County most of his life. He was a farmer.

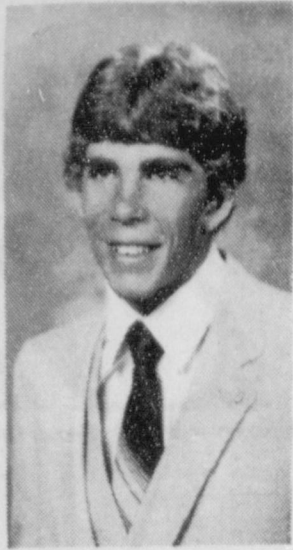
He married Barbara Hawkins in 1941 at Panhandle.

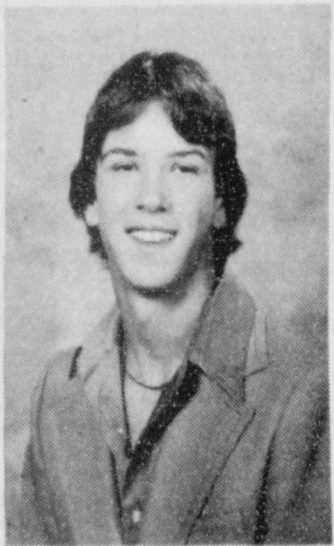

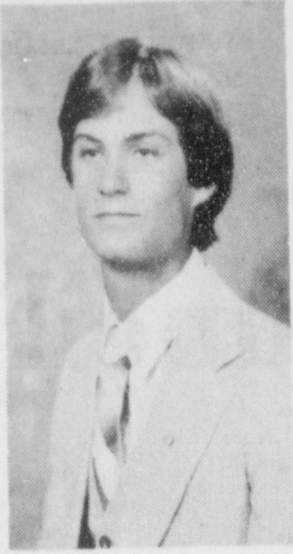
Denise Leni Blackburn

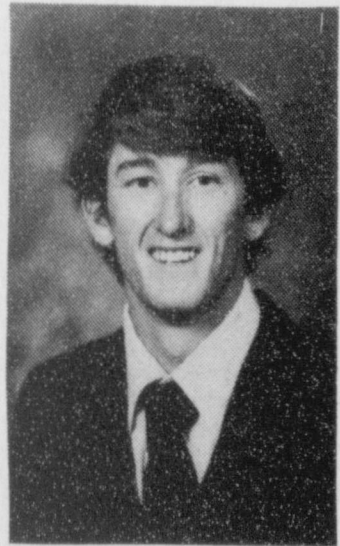
Brenda attended grade school over seas, attended Perryton Jr. High, Perryton High School last year and Spearman High her senior year.

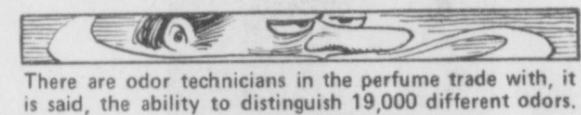
NOTE FROM SPORTS DESK: The two games played at the Jaycee Park will be one story and the games played at the East of the Y Field will be another story!!

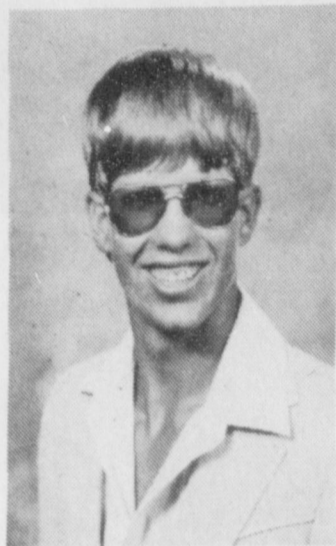
Sherry attended Morse Grade School. She then attended Pringle-Morse School and graduated from the 8th grade. She has been attending Spearman High School all 4 years of high school.

There has been some official re-alignment of voting precincts and voters should note carefully the following balloting places. **Emphasis:** These are VOTING precincts.

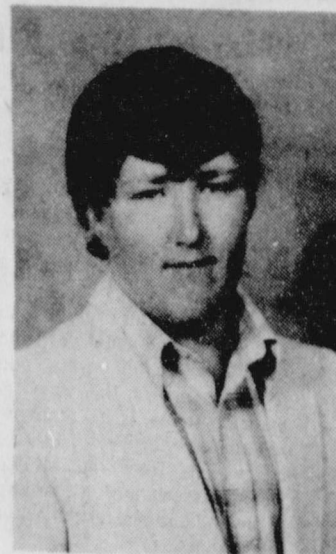
Those in voting precinct ONE (1) will vote at the courthouse.

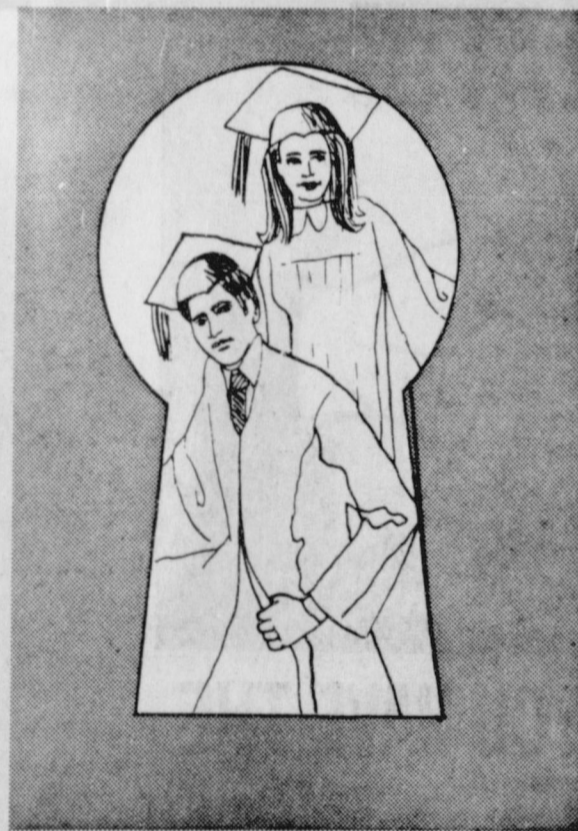
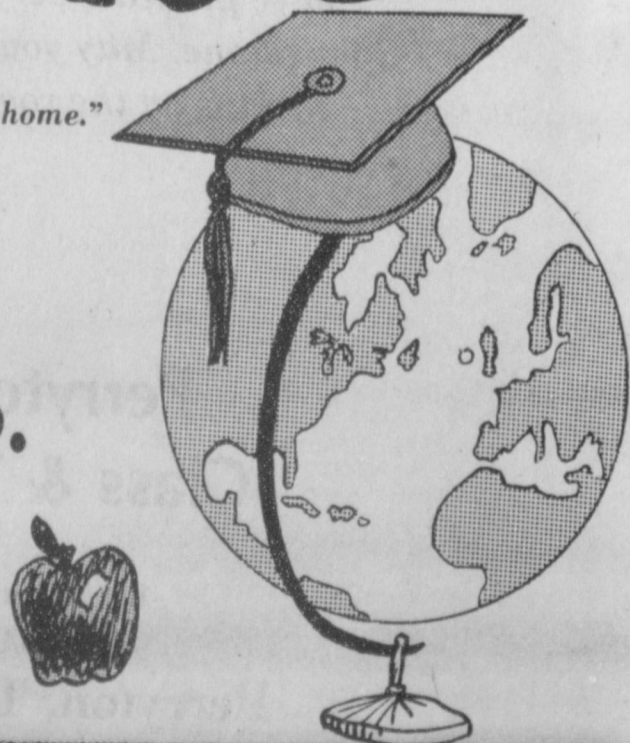
