Judged runner-up was Miss Candy Thoreson, the 18-year old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Donnie Thoreson of Gruver, with Misses Sabre McCoy, Carrie Clark, and Christy Collier, all of Spearman, placing in that order among the five finalists named from the seventeen beauties competing in this year's contest.

Miss Congeniality—the one chosen by her peers for this honor—is Miss Christy Collier, the 17-year old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Bob Collier of Spearman, who was presented with a bouquet of flowers and a trophy by the 1977 Miss Hansford LaVon Kunselman.

Good Queen LaVon just prior to crowning the 1978 Miss Hansford County gave an inspiring talk on what being Miss Hansford County had meant to her—this, a bit unusual and very appreciated by the assembly. Upon the announcement of the 1978 Miss Hansford County, Queen LaVon presented the 1978 choice for the office the symbols of the office including the traditional spray of beautiful red rose buds, her sparkling crown, the red velvet queen's robe and the Miss Hansford 1978 ribbon.

Sheriff's Report

Accident Rash Plagues County

Although in mid-August, Hansford County will have gone one year without a traffic fatality, the county seems to be suffering from a rash of traffic accidents, said R. L. McFarlin, Hansford County Sheriff.

A two-car collision was reported about 3:30 p.m., July 27 four miles south of Gruver at the intersection of Highway 136 and Farm and Market Road 2018 with no injuries, said the sheriff.

A 1974 International truck driven by John Holman of Spearman was involved in the accident with Walker Ukens from Hooker, Okla., who was driving a 1978 Chevrolet pickup.

The sheriff's report shows there was very little damage to the truck with extensive damage to the pickup. Total amount of damage is not known.

A one-car accident was reported to the sheriff's office about 9:30 p.m., July 26. The 1974 Thunderbird involved was driven by Tommy Limbocker of Spearman and rolled over about six miles east of Spearman on Highway 15, said the sheriff. There were no serious injuries, he said.

Another one-vehicle overturn was reported to the sheriff at 12:01 a.m. July 27 two miles south of Spearman on Farm and Market Road 2018.

McFarlin said James Hysell of Perryton apparently fell

asleep at the wheel of his 1975 Chevrolet Suburban. The car was totaled but there were no serious injuries.

A break-in of the R. L. McClellan Grain Co. was reported to the sheriff's office July 27. McFarlin said apparently nothing was taken and the only damage sustained was to the back door. He said the sheriff's department and the Spearman Police Department are still investigating the break-in.

Bank Deposits Rise \$1 Million Over Last Year

Total deposits for banks in the county have risen more than \$1 million in the last year according to reports made by the banks in July.

The First State Bank in Spearman reports total deposits of about \$24,838,000 as opposed to their reports of \$21,971,566.91 in July of 1977. This contrasts greatly with the \$15,326.63 reported by the bank in 1917, their first year.

The Gruver State Bank listed about \$14,947,000 in deposits in their 1978 report as opposed to about \$12,737,000 listed one year ago.

Total deposits in the county are listed at about \$35,785,000 as opposed to about \$34,709,000 listed one year ago.

Perils In The Park

Of more than 200,000,000 visitors to national parks and historic sites last year, 155 were accidentally killed and another 3,400 injured, more than half of them in motor vehicle mishaps. Many of the drownings, fatal falls and other accidents occurred in spite of elaborate warnings issued by the Park Service in some 50,000,000 safety pamphlets. When you visit a national park, there is virtually no excuse for not getting the safety word.

The general rules are these:
Lakes, rivers and streams often have tricky currents, icy water and other unexpected conditions. Don't equate conditions in unfamiliar waters with lakes and swimming pools at home.

Never pet or feed bear cubs, fawns or other animals, no matter how cute and harmless they look. Their mothers are protective, almost certain to be nearby and likely to attack if they sense a menace to their young.

Be aware of the dangers of high cliffs, loose and sliding rock, hot thermal pools and, in parks of volcanic origin, the sharp edges of hardened lava.

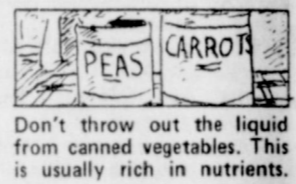
