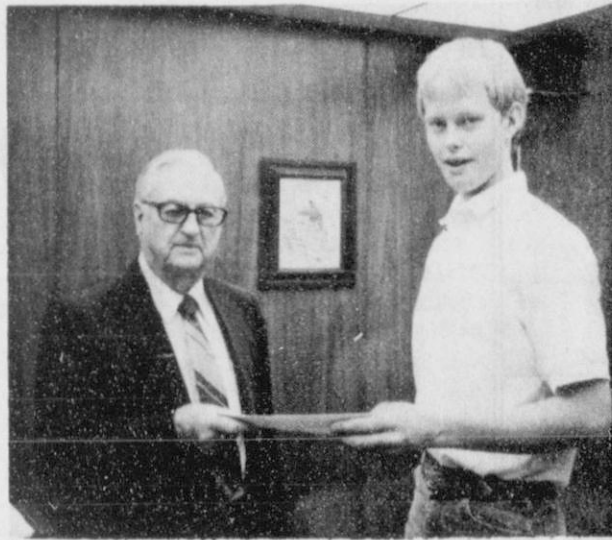

Police

On May 24th, 1984 at approximately 7:03 am, an officer was advised to contact a female subject in reference to a dog attack. Upon arrival the officer talked with the subject. She advised that she was in her front yard when a small black dog had scratched her on her forearm leaving several deep scratches. She then advised that the dog had gone south on James Street. The officer did check the area but was unable to locate the dog. The officer did advise the subject to contact a doctor in reference to the scratches on her arm. At approximately 5:11 pm, the Police Sgt received a call to a Spearman residence in reference to a dog that had attacked a female subject earlier. Upon arrival, the officer observed a black dog lying under a car at the residence. After confirming that this would be the animal, the

dog was transported to the animal shelter pending identification of the owner.

On May 25, 1984 at approximately 11:00 am, an officer responded to a report of a dog attack at a Spearman residence. Upon arrival the officer was met by a female subject who advised that her son had been bitten on the right ankle by a dog, described as a white and tan chihuahua. Observation of the boy's ankle revealed that the skin had been broken, however, there was no blood. The officer was advised by another citizen that the dog possibly belonged to a subject they knew. The subject gave to officer the address of the owner of the dog. Upon arrival at this residence, the officer made contact with the subject who confirmed ownership of the dog. She advised that the dog had not had rabie shots. She was advised that the dog would be kept for 10 days for observation. The dog

was then taken to the Hansford County Vet Clinic.

On May 26, 1984 at approximately 3:22 pm, a female subject telephoned the Police Department and advised that her car, which was parked in the 10 block of east Davis, had been hit by another vehicle. A officer was dispatched to the scene. Upon arrival the officer was met by the complainant who advised the officer that a float from the parade had hit her car. A report was made and a description of the float was given to the officer. Photographs were taken of both vehicles. Case still under investigation.

On May 29, 1984 while on patrol, an officer was dispatched to a Spearman residence in reference to some boys shooting a BB gun at some kids. The officer talked with two subjects one of the subjects advised the officer that the BB gun was his and that the other boy had aimed

the gun at the children but did not fire. The two boys were shooting at some glass bottles and some cans. The officer advised the boys that if the Police had another report like this on that the BB gun would be confiscated. Case closed.

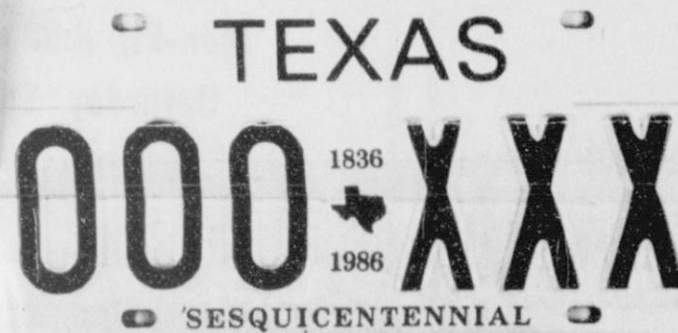

AUSTIN— Around this time next year, you'll be able to buy those special red, white and blue license plates that commemorate the Texas Sesquicentennial.

Only twice before has the state allowed slogans on vehicle license plates, once in 1936 to commemorate the Texas Centennial and again

in 1968 to recognize the HemisFair.

In honor of Texas' 150th birthday, the State Highway and Public Transportation Commission directed that approximately 7.5 million sets of plates be produced during the next biennium bearing the Sesquicentennial slogan.

When the Sesquicentennial license plates are ready, they will be issued for new vehicles and for out-of-state

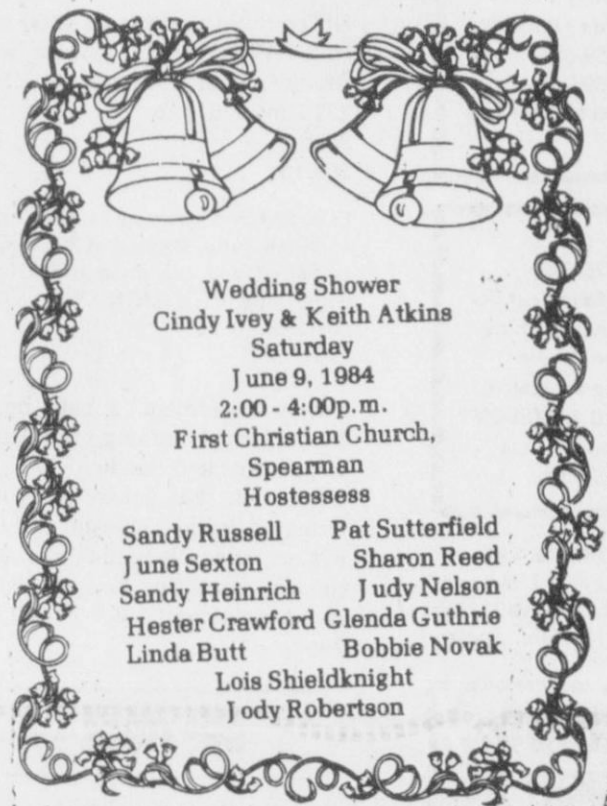

BUG ALERT

A System Approach to Conquering Fleas

A system approach is needed to deal with one of the most annoying household pest problems—fleas. Once thought an occasional problem of house pets, fleas have become a major problem to families throughout the Southeast and Southwest and are believed to be traveling northward at a rapid pace. Mild Southern winters combined with the environment of air-conditioned homes provide ideal breeding conditions for fleas, which can multiply by the thousands in only a short time. To successfully control fleas, their life cycle must be broken by destroying the adult fleas. A serious infestation calls for a series of planned measures. Entomologists at the Johnson Wax Entomology Center advise treating the backyard first. This is the area where

house pets and humans, especially children, can pick up fleas and the interaction begins. A product specifically formulated for flea control, such as Raid Outdoor Flea Killer, can effectively control fleas outside for weeks. Indoors, vacuum the entire house thoroughly. Clean or discard the vacuum bag so fleas won't hatch or reproduce in it. Activate and use an indoor fogger to destroy fleas in the house. Then vacuum again to pick up dead fleas. And don't forget the pet... use an EPA registered flea killer like Raid Flea Killer to treat the pet and its favored sleeping quarters. Since this approach is targeted at adult fleas, it is important to repeat treatment measures in two or three weeks to destroy fleas that hatch after the first application.

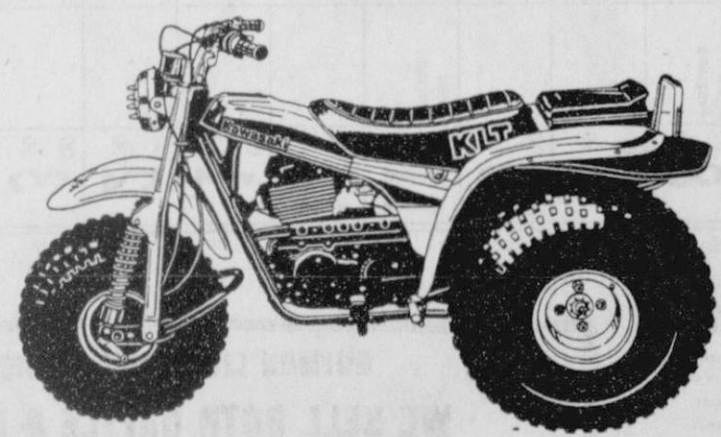

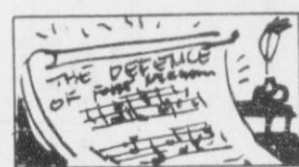

Swimming pool to open Friday

Under the management of the Hansford County YMCA, the Spearman swimming pool will begin operations for the 1984 season on Friday, May 25. Eddie Gage, a fourth grade teacher at Spearman Elementary School will be the pool director for the summer.

For the first time swim lessons will be offered most of the summer. This summer in 1984, the Y will be offering the National YMCA Learn to Swim Program. The program features a progressive style of lessons and the awarding of patches and certificates to children who accomplish determined skill levels.

The swim instruction program will be run in two week sessions starting June 4. Classes will be held on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday afternoons at 5:00, 5:30 or 6:00 p.m. Children will be placed into classes by skill level

which will determine at which time they should come. Parents interested in enrolling their children should contact the Y early, because class sizes are limited. These classes are for children 4 years old and up.

In addition to swim lessons for children, there will be two special times for adults. The pool will be available for adult lap swimming from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. Monday thru Friday. Again this year the Y will be sponsoring ladies water exercise classes on Monday, Wednesday and Friday's from 5:30-6:30. Registration is not necessary to do lap swimming but is required to attend the water exercise class. More information is available by calling the Y.

The swimming pool will be available for open swimming from 1-5 p.m., Monday-Saturday. Since the pool belongs to the city, the city council has set the rates

for the summer's open swim. Daily admission for children 12 and under is \$1.00 and 13 & up is \$1.50. Season passes are Children 12 and under, \$40.00, 13 and over, \$50.00; the family season pass is \$100.00.

During open swim it will be required that all children under 6 be accompanied by an adult. The adult may enter the pool area only if wearing a bathing suit, otherwise they may sit on the bleachers at the North end of the pool. This change in rules is for liability reasons.

The pool may be rented for private parties after 8:30 p.m. These parties must be arranged through the YMCA office.

To schedule a party or ask any questions concerning the pool, call the YMCA at 9-2591.

What else can I do?

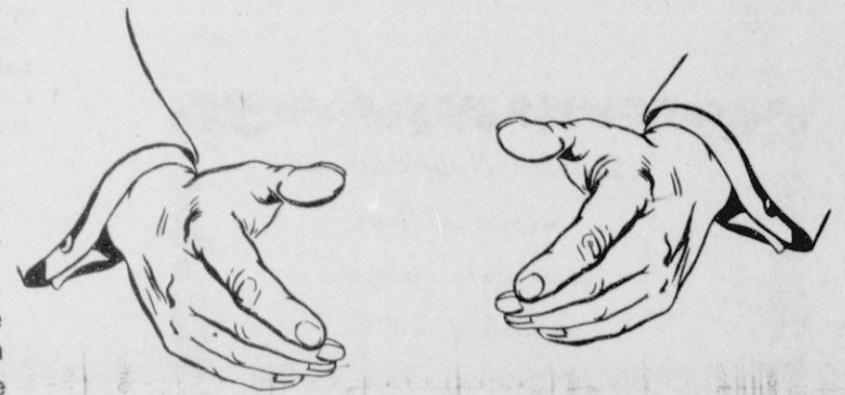

YMCA drive is big success here

The Hansford County YMCA's Partner With Youth Campaign can only be described as a big success. The volunteer worker collected \$32,901 as of Tuesday evening. The Partner With Youth Campaign was aimed at reducing the deficit created at the Y by the small amount of income as compared to expenses. The Y has an income from program and membership fees of approximately \$50,000, as compared to expenses of \$100,000. The Partner With Youth monies will insure that the Y can continue to keep its program and membership fees low enough that most people can afford them. It will also allow the Y to subsidize the fees for anyone who cannot truly afford to pay.

Partner With Youth General Chairperson, Marva Hohertz, said that the success of the drive was due to a great work force and the generosity of the community. "We had 49 committed volunteers canvassing the community for two weeks asking for support. They did a great job!" She said. Also Hohertz stated that she was very pleased to see the community's answer of "YES" to meet the needs of the Y. "It really shows that most of the community sees the Y as a true asset," she continued.

YMCA Director, Winn Cren-

shaw, said that he was amazed at the big way in which the community gave to the Y. "It's hard to believe that a small community can do so much," Crenshaw stated. Crenshaw also told the Reporter that the Y is still not completely sure of its financial condition, because much of the money is in pledges. It will be the end of the year before the Y really knows if there will be a surplus resulting from the drive. "If there is a surplus, the Board will probably create a repairs and maintenance account to cover unforeseen major expenses in the future," Crenshaw explained.

Y Board President, John Crawford said, "We really want to Thank the community for its support in this endeavor. It really shows how generous Hansford County people really are." Crawford also added that the Partner With Youth will probably be an annual event in the Y's calendar.

The Y stated that one for the functions of the drive was to allow the ability to give memberships and programs to those who cannot afford to pay the fees. However, Y Director Winn Crenshaw states that very few people ever asks for assistance. He stated that if anyone is interested in participation at the Y, but cannot afford it to contact him at 659-2591.

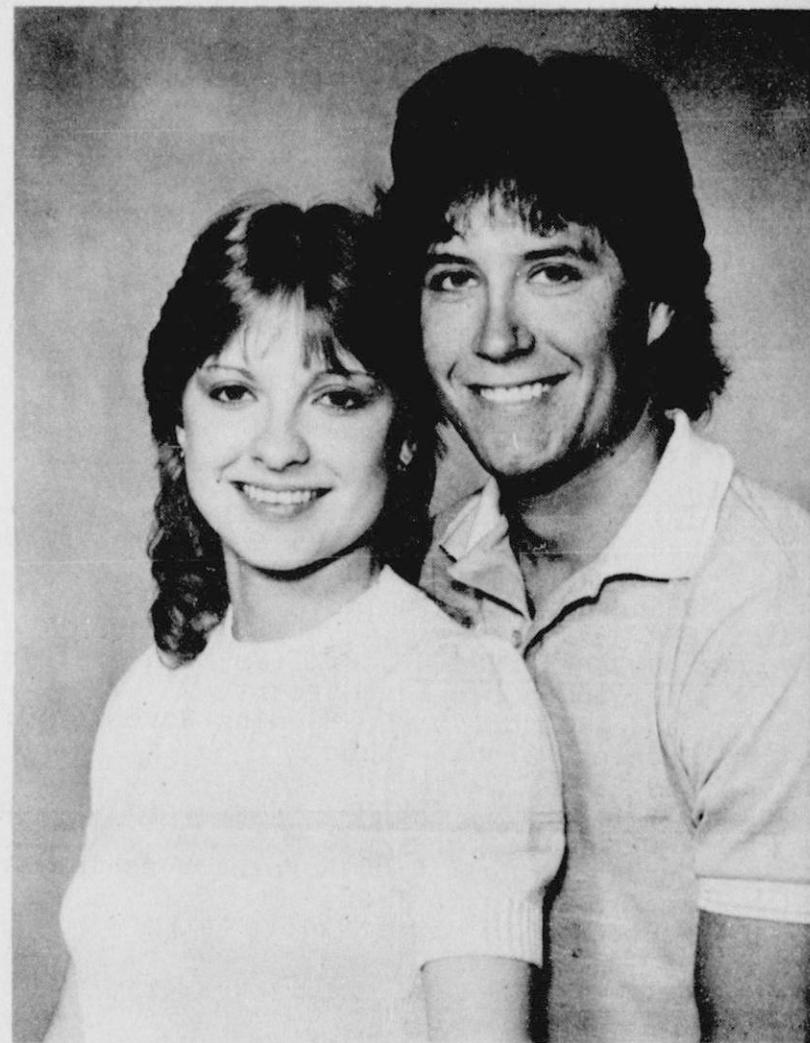
During the training, students received instruction in drill and ceremonies, weapons, map reading, tactics, military courtesy, military justice, first aid, and Army history and traditions.
