Lavender Lynx Lasoo 'em

19-6!

It's still the same, you've got to win every game! And, that is the by-word of the 1978 Lynx, who lasoed the Ranchers at Boys Ranch Friday night in a real thriller 19-6.

For the 1500 who braved extreme cold to watch the game, it was worth all of the time and effort. The Lynx jumped into a 6-0 lead in the first quarter on a pass from Dayton Edwards to James Whitaker, good for 9 yards and a touchdown. The PAT (kick) was no good

and the 6-0 score held up for the first half, even after the Boys Ranch team drove to the 2 yard line with 7 seconds left before the half officially ended.

The Lynx came storming back after the half, to take a 12-0 lead on a 4 yard run by Zane Newton. A run for the extra point try failed, and left the score at 12-0.

The Ranchers came back in the third quarter to score on an 8 yard run by their talented quarterback Eddie Taylor. Their try for extra point also failed.

With the Lynx leading 12-6, and the issue still in doubt, the Ranchers hopes of winning the game was cut short by Martin who intercepted a pass on the Ranchers 45, and returned it to the 32 yard line. From the 32, the Lynx slashed and cut their way to the winning touchdown, as Newton went in from the 1 yard line. Newton also added the extra point kick, to up the score to 19-6.

In the meantime, the Rangers from Perryton up-ended Riverroad 27-0, and Canadian upset Dalhart 12-0, to put the pressure on the league leading Lynx. They will prepare for their arch-rival, the Dalhart Wolves, who will come to Spearman next Friday in the game that will decide the 1-AA champion!
