NEWS CONFERENCE FOR WESLY WALLACE, M.D., WILL BE HELD AT THE DON AND SYBIL HARRINGTON CANCER CENTER THURSDAY, DECEMBER 4, AT 2:00. WHY YOU SHOULD BE THERE

Where radiation is concerned, there is a fine line between help and harm. In controlled stuations, such as radiation therapy, regulated radioactive exposure can destroy cancer cells and relieve pain It is the loss of control, exemplified by the Chernobyl crisis, which concerns us all.

The impacts of the nuclear mishap will be the key ssue of a benefit presentation by Ir. Wesley Wallace, Thursday, December 4, at 7 p.m. Dr. Wallace and a pinel of other physicians traveled to the Soviet Union following the Chronobyl incident, at the invitation of the Soviet Physicians Committee for the Prevention of Nuclear War.

The delegationleader, Dr. Armand Hammer, described the experience as very moving, wen he spoke of the visit recently at Dana-Farber Cancer Institute. "I thint U. S. involvement in the medical energency played an important role il improving relations between our twocountries," Hammer

Wallace, Hanmer and the other physicians wereable to observe and interact with the Chernobyl victims and the primar physicians providing their treatment The American physicians also lectired on medical and peace issues at national medical institutes thrughout the Soviet

Wallace, a ntive of West Texas, is a board-certifid specialist in emer-gency medicir. He has served as director of emirgency medical services for the civ of Austin, and since 1984 has directed emergency medicine at Round Roci Community Hospital in Round Rock Texas. On state and national leves. Wallace is actively involved wit Physicians for Social Responsibilit. The educational organization boast a membership of more than 30,000 merican physicians.

Wallace' resentation begins at 7 p.m., Thursday, December 4, in the Texas TechUniversity Health Sciences Center aditorium. Admission is \$10 per poson and is a tax-deductible contribution to benefit patients of the Don an Sybil Harrington Cancer Center. Third: If you are thinking there's nothing anyone can do, you are greatly mistaken. Call 435-5008, or come by the office. You don't have to give your name. You can even say you are asking for a friend. After all, you will be acting as your own best friend. The

office manager can tell you of some of the things that we do that have helped other persons, and can recommend books from our collection that will be well worth your while. Many of our clients first began to explore the possibilities in just this way.

For goodness sake, DO something about your situation. It is possible to resolve your problems.

You know something else? Many battering companions, after their first resistance, are glad to learn to live without violence. In fact, they have asked for our book, IEARNING TO LIVE WITHOUT VIOLENCE, for the word is getting around that it is a good guide to happier ways of living. Women, too, have benefited from reading it. It proposes actual guidenlines and things to do to facilitate this change of lifestyle.

You don't need to give up favorite holiday foods to follow today's dietary

The dietary guidelines from the U.S. Departments of Agriculture and Health and Human Services, ans those from major health organizations, recommend reducing consumption of fat, sugar and salt while increasing the amount of fiber in our diets.

Makin an effort to eat nutritiously doesn't have to put a damper on your holiday season, since relatively simple modifications can reduce the fat and total calories in many favorite foods, without significantly affecting their taste.

Sugar can be reduced by a third in many holiday desserts. If a recipe calls for 1 cup sugar, for example, use ½ cup. This works best in fruitbased recipes and in making puddings and custards. The sugar in cookies and

Yogurt or cottage cheese may be substituted for sour cream in some recipes for sauces, dips, dressings and Also recommended in using skim rather than whole milk and in some recipes calling for whipped cream, substituting evaporated milk.


