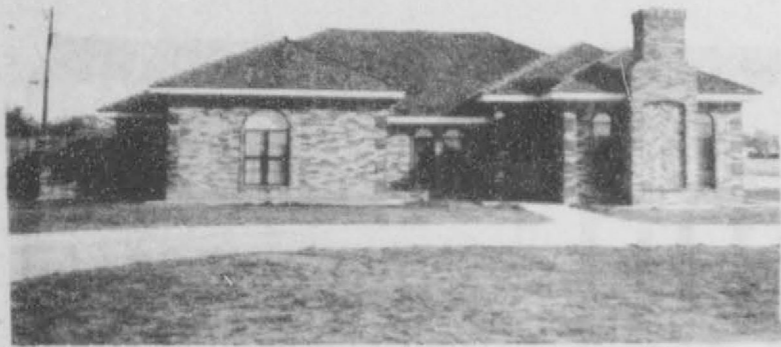

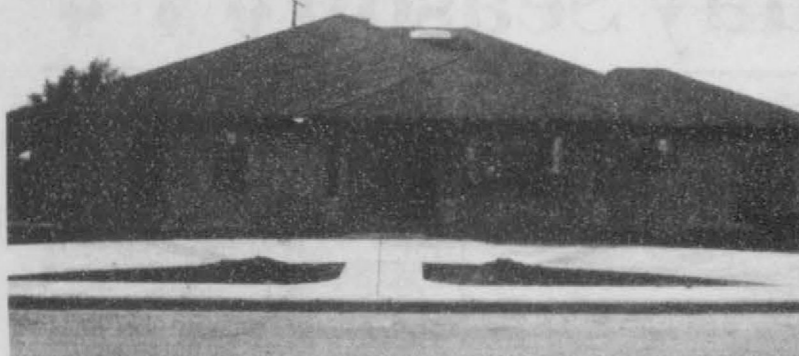

Cancer Center

A NEWS CONFERENCE FOR WESLEY WALLACE, M.D., WILL BE HELD AT THE DON AND SYBIL HARRINGTON CANCER CENTER THURSDAY, DECEMBER 4, AT 2:00. WHY YOU SHOULD BE THERE.....

Where radiation is concerned, there is a fine line between help and harm. In controlled situations, such as radiation therapy, regulated radioactive exposure can destroy cancer cells and relieve pain! It is the loss of control, exemplified by the Chernobyl crisis, which concerns us all.

The impacts of the nuclear mishap will be the key issue of a benefit presentation by Dr. Wesley Wallace, Thursday, December 4, at 7 p.m. Dr. Wallace and a panel of other physicians traveled to the Soviet Union following the Chernobyl incident, at the invitation of the Soviet Physicians Committee for the Prevention of Nuclear War.

The delegation leader, Dr. Armand Hammer, described the experience as very moving, when he spoke of the visit recently at Dana-Farber Cancer Institute. "I think U.S. involvement in the medical emergency played an important role in improving relations between our two countries," Hammer said.

Wallace, Hammer and the other physicians were able to observe and interact with the Chernobyl victims and the primary physicians providing their treatment. The American physicians also lectured on medical and peace issues at national medical institutes throughout the Soviet Union.

Wallace, a native of West Texas, is a board-certified specialist in emergency medicine. He has served as director of emergency medical services for the city of Austin, and since 1984 has directed emergency medicine at Round Rock Community Hospital in Round Rock, Texas. On state and national levels, Wallace is actively involved with Physicians for Social Responsibility. The educational organization boasts a membership of more than 30,000 American physicians.

Wallace' presentation begins at 7 p.m., Thursday, December 4, in the Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center auditorium. Admission is \$10 per person and is a tax-deductible contribution to benefit patients of the Don and Sybil Harrington Cancer Center. Participants may speak with Dr. Wallace following his presentation, at a 8 p.m. reception at the Harrington Cancer Center.

No names are given. Just "I know someone who..."

No one except the director and the volunteer who helps you knows your name and whatever other information may be necessary. These data are kept in a locked file, to which no one else is permitted access. Furthermore, you probably will not learn the full name of the volunteer who helps you, for her identity, too, is confidential.

Third: If you are thinking there's nothing anyone can do, you are greatly mistaken. Call 435-5008, or come by the office. You don't have to give your name. You can even say you are asking for a friend. After all, you will be acting as your own best friend. The

office manager can tell you of some of the things that we do that have helped other persons, and can recommend books from our collection that will be well worth your while. Many of our clients first began to explore the possibilities in just this way.

For goodness sake, DO something about your situation. It is possible to resolve your problems.

You know something else? Many battering companions, after their first resistance, are glad to learn to live without violence. In fact, they have asked for our book, **LEARNING TO LIVE WITHOUT VIOLENCE**, for the word is getting around that it is a good guide to happier ways of living. Women, too, have benefited from reading it. It proposes actual guidelines and things to do to facilitate this change of lifestyle.

That is our major goal: to help persons forsake their old painful ways of relating to more comfortable way of living together.

One of these days we can go out of business because there is no further need of us. And YOU can help us do it!

You don't need to give up favorite holiday foods to follow today's dietary guidelines.

The dietary guidelines from the U.S. Departments of Agriculture and Health and Human Services, and those from major health organizations, recommend reducing consumption of fat, sugar and salt while increasing the amount of fiber in our diets.

Sugar can be reduced by a third in many holiday desserts. If a recipe calls for 1 cup sugar, for example, use 2/3 cup. This works best in fruit-based recipes and in making puddings and custards. The sugar in cookies and

cakes can also be reduced, but requires some experimenting to find an appropriate level.

Likewise, fat can be reduced by a third in gravies, sauces, puddings and quick breads.

These are suggestions of omitting salt or reducing it by half and adding more herbs and spices to increase flavor.

To increase fiber intake, substitute whole grain flour for 1/4 to 1/2 of the refined flour in holiday baking. If a recipe calls for 3 cups all-purpose flour, use 3/4 whole grain flour and 2 1/4 cups all-purpose flour.

Yogurt or cottage cheese may be substituted for sour cream in some recipes for sauces, dips, dressings and main dishes.

Also recommended in using skim rather than whole milk and in some recipes calling for whipped cream, substituting evaporated milk.

Take the time to modify favorite holiday recipes this year and you'll have a healthier alternative to hand down as part of your family tradition.

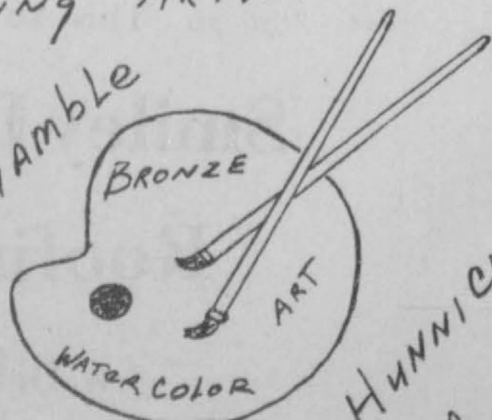

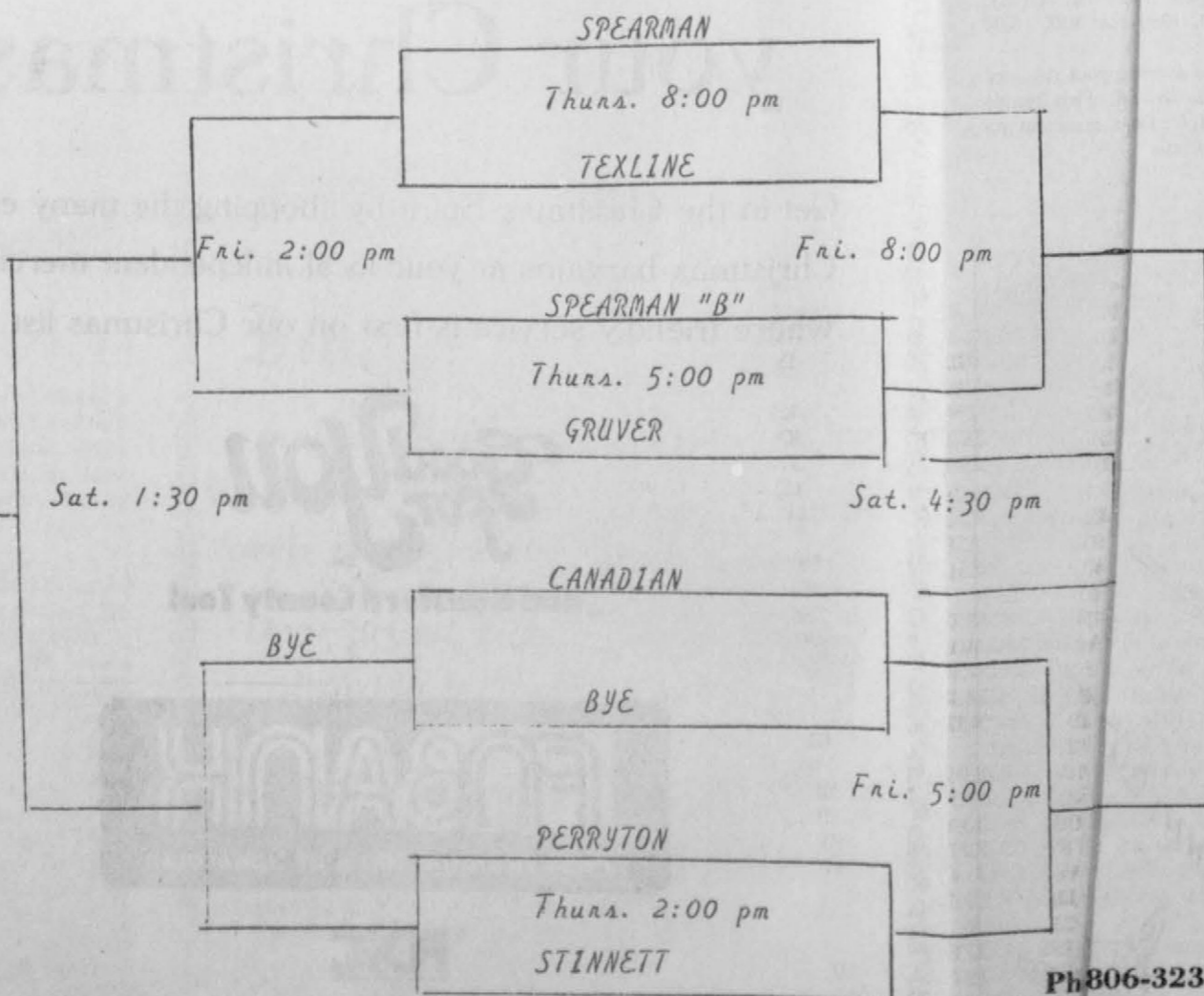
