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Hansford producers do have the option to have their fields certified as a disaster, but certification and disaster application must be made by May 15 to the Hansford ASCS office.

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


Spring campaign set up

Rabies and distemper vaccinations will be \$7 each while combination vaccinations with Parvo are \$14 and \$11.50 respectively.

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
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



Karen's **Cozy** Corner

Perenials are flowering or foilage plants whose roots live from year to year. Their tops may or may not die back in the winter.

Perennials give color to the garden in a shady spot and in front of shrubs They are colorful in spring and throughout the growing season.

Some perennials flower the first year. you can grow them as annuals and eliminate the problem of protecting them in the winter.

Usually perennials will not flower unless they develop to a certain size and are then exposed to low temperature for a number of weeks, then exposed to increasing day lengths and increasing temperatures. Their flowering time is the result of this sequence of day length and tempera-

Although perennials require constant care, they do well in most parts of the United States.

Among the most popular of the garden perennials are delphinium, alyssum, hollyhock, columbine, candytuft, carnation, and primrose

To grow perennials successfully prepare soil in the flower beds thoroughly;

Start with vigorous plants or seeds. The best plan is to buy started plants. Next best is to sow fresh seed where the plants are to grow. Usually, the least satisfactory plan is to start your own plants indoors.

Set out plants or sow seed at the recommended times. Plants set out too early may be killed by frost. Seeds will not gernimate until the soil warms -and, if sown too early, they may rot. However, early spring growth is important for the survival of many perennials.



Provide the recommended distances between plants when thinning seedlings or setting out started plants. Proper spacing is necessary for fullest development of the plants.

Do not grow annuals that crowd and grow wildly in the same bed with perennials; they will crowd the perennials.

Let the perennials stand out. Give them a back ground to show them off. Evergreens or wooden fences make good backgrounds.

Do not consider perennials as permanent plants. Replanting, dividing old plants, and preparing the soil are essential for vigorous, flowering plants






